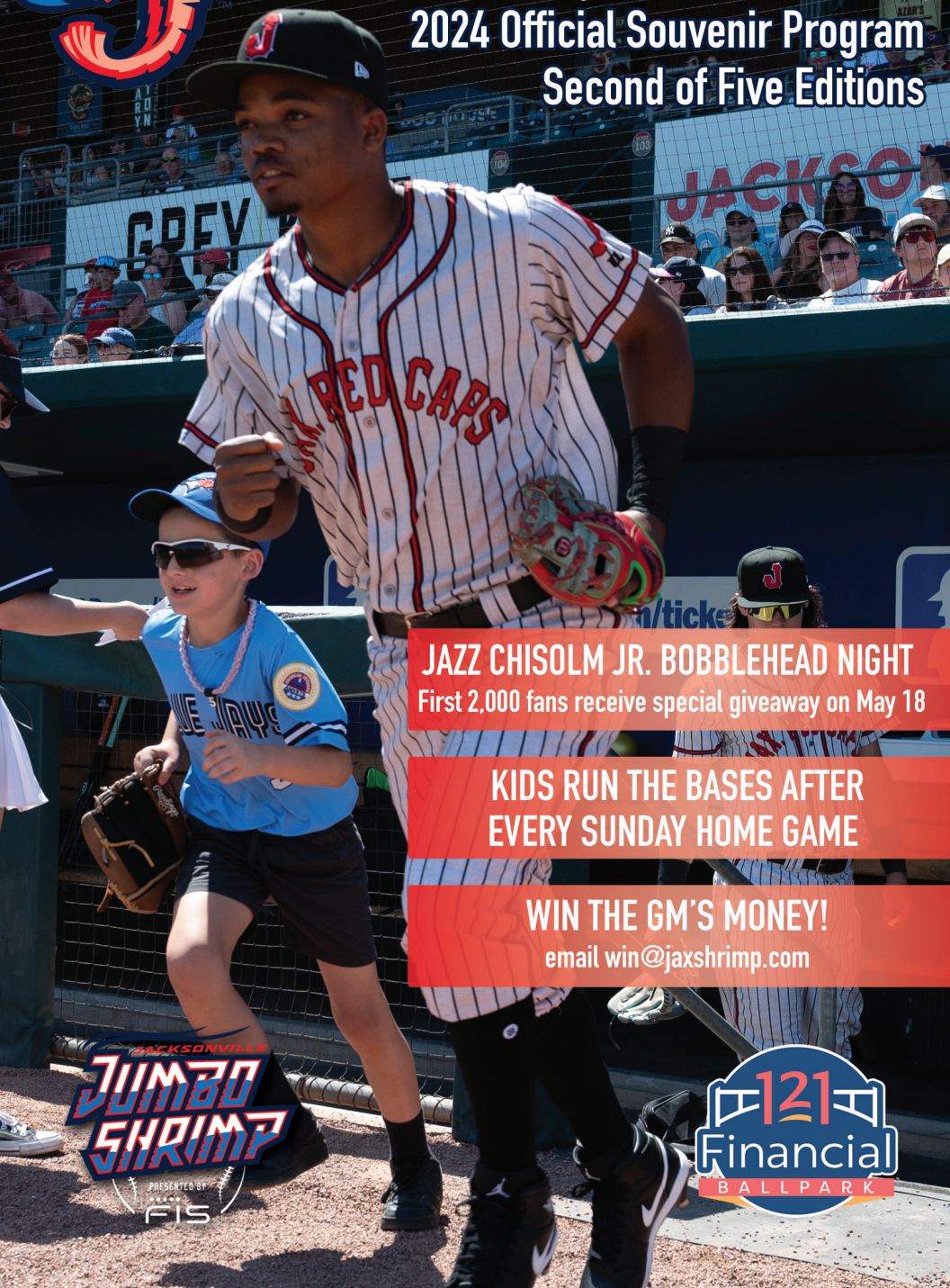

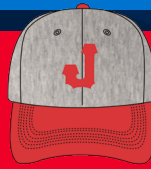

## JOHNSTON THINKS FAST WHEN BALL GETS LODGED IN MITT

Looking at the laces on his glove before Sunday's (March 31) Triple-A Jacksonville game, Troy Johnston noticed they were loose. The Marlins' No. 18 prospect planned to tighten them, but then he made an eye-catching snare and an unconventional throw.

When Gwinnett's J.P. Martínez pounded a hard-hit grounder toward first base with two outs in the ninth inning, Johnston laid out to trap it -- not the first time he made a diving play during the opening weekend of the season. The glove might have been taking the term "trap" too literally, though, as the ball wedged itself in the pocket of his mitt.

As Johnston leaped to his feet, the 2019 17th-round pick attempted to transfer the ball to his throwing hand before quickly realizing the glove also needed to make a trip to first base. He tossed it underhanded with the ball lodged in the webbing to charging right-hander Eli Villalobos, who scampered off the mound to seal the unorthodox out. The Jumbo Shrimp ultimately fell to the Stripers, 10-0, at 121 Financial Ballpark, though.

"I didn't think I was going to get there," Johnston said. "I ended up getting there, reach for the ball, and the ball is really, really deep in the pocket. And I look at it, and I'm like, 'I don't have time to pop this ball out, so I'm just going to throw my glove.'"

The 26-year-old had seen the play done multiple times before in reverse, with a pitcher tossing his glove to the first baseman. The batted ball -- 99.6 mph off the bat of

Martínez -- would have scored a runner from third base if not for Johnston's stop.

On the opposite end of the highlight this time, he impressed the reliever as well as his other teammates.

"I've been playing with [Villalobos] for a while," the Gonzaga product said. "And he always makes fun of me for not diving at baseballs, but I got him for one. So now he can't make fun of me for that. ... The pitchers will thank you, and they're going to treat you better, when you give your best effort on defense.

"We were getting our butts kicked, 10-0, so I was trying to have some fun, make plays and still give it my best effort. I think it raised the emotions, the vibe a little bit in the dugout. I think people were a little bit more excited to have something go our way on a day that not a lot of things were going our way."

Johnston said it might be time to retire that first baseman's glove and move on to a new mitt he broke in this spring. The one that he made the play with was his primary piece of leather the past couple of years at a position that likely sees the second-most action behind catcher.

"I might have to put it in a case or something like that just saying it lived a good, long life and served its purpose," he laughed.

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** The play took the top spot in the ESPN SportsCenter Top Plays later that night. The Jumbo Shrimp last appeared at the No. 1 spot in 2019 with former Jumbo Shrimp outfielder's Stone Garrett over-the-wall catch.

# **GRAY'S ANATOMY**

*Learn about Tristan Gray's new journey  
that starts in a familiar place.*

## FEATURE STORY

The crowd at a baseball game can ignite or extinguish what happens on the field. Some ballparks are more notorious for raucous and passionate crowds. From the Philly Phanatics in Citizens Bank Park to the confines of the Indiana limestone cathedral known as Yankee Stadium in the Bronx, it's no secret that baseball fans can have a big impact on the game. That statement rings true in the minor leagues too.

Players and fans can have a love-hate type of relationship with one another. There's a famous quote that states, "You either die a hero or live long enough to see yourself become a villain." Jumbo Shrimp infielder Tristan Gray knows exactly how it feels to be both for a fanbase.

On April 6, 2024 at Durham Bulls Athletic Park, Gray rounds third base and heads for home plate after mashing his fifth home run of the series. It's a sight all too familiar for him in this ballpark. However, instead of hearing the crowd come to their feet and cheer for him, he experienced the opposite. A small crescendo of boos and jeers were hurled his way from the hometown fans as he quietly stepped on home plate and headed back to the visitor's dugout. Just five days earlier, he had received a standing ovation from the same crowd as he made his return to the Bull City.

"It was a pretty special moment to hear that interaction and know that I had that kind of influence in the city that I loved with all my heart," Gray said.

Now that warm feeling the Durham crowd had for him had turned sour.

Before his five-home run barrage against the Bulls that powered the Jumbo Shrimp to their first series win of the 2024 season, Gray had spent the past three years as an anchor in the daunting Durham batting order. The Houston, Texas, native posted a .230 batting average, cranking 71 home runs over his stint with the team. Gray built a special attachment to the city that is widely known for its blockbuster movie about the team "Bull Durham," starring Kevin Costner and Susan Sarandon in 1988. While being a member of the team, Gray felt like he was living the movie in his own reality.

"The only way I can describe playing for the Bulls is kind of like a movie, and I know it's cliché because there actually is a movie, but playing here and the way the city is... this is what everybody comes for," said Gray. "You can tell from the very first inning when a double play is turned or big moments in the game (that) don't happen at the end, it's all the time and the fans are in it."

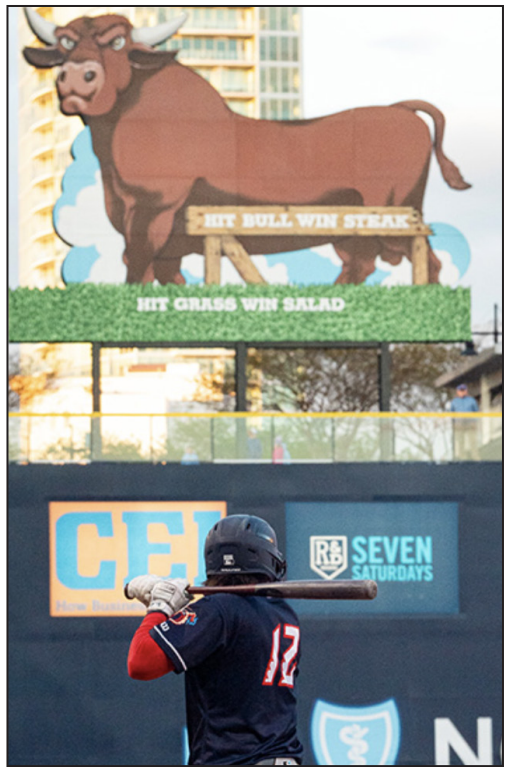
It has been a long journey through the minor league system for Gray, serving stints with three different franchises. The former Rice Owl's Road to The Show started on June 20, 2017, when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 13th round (388th overall) of the 2017 MLB Draft.

Gray spent the 2017 season with the Pirates organization. In February 2018, he was traded to the Tampa Bay Rays organization as part of the package for big league outfielder Corey Dickerson. Gray worked his way up through Single-A and Double-A in 2018 and parts of the 2019 season. He was finally called up to Triple-A Durham on September 10, 2019, and little did he know, it would be the start of a love affair with the famous Bull City.

For several seasons in the hot North Carolina sun, Gray had to grind; nothing was ever handed to him. That hard work proved to pay dividends. As a key member of the team, Gray helped the Bulls win the Triple-A National Championship in both 2021 and 2022.

Grinding. Gray was never handed anything, never had a big-money contract. And in one offseason during his tenure in Durham, he felt he needed some extra cash. He took a side job working as a package delivery driver for UPS. When working his assigned route, he would don an orange UPS vest. That next season, back on the field while hanging around the visitor's clubhouse in Buffalo during a rainout, one of his teammates, Cal Stevenson, noticed something sticking out of his bag and asked Gray what it was. After Gray explained it to him, Stevenson took the vest out and wore it around the clubhouse to mess around with his Bulls counterparts. Suddenly, Stevenson suggested that the vest should be their home run celebration for the season.

"I worked there in one of the offseason's just to make some money and I always keep it (the vest) with me to remind me," said Gray during an interview with Durham Bulls broadcaster Patrick Kinan. "In the season, whenever you're struggling, just know this is an alternative that you were doing."

The Bulls offense underwent a power surge and caught fire in the second half of the season. Gray himself started to draw the attention of the big-league club. On September 15, 2023 he got the call from the Rays to pack his bags and to catch the next flight to Baltimore in order to join the team. The next day (September 16), Gray found himself facing Orioles right-hander Grayson Rodriguez in the top of the eighth inning for his first MLB at-bat. After skying a pop up to second baseman Adam Frazier, the Rays lost 8-0 but Gray could say that he'd been to The Show.

The next day, he found himself in the lineup again and this time he left a big impact. In a 2-for-4 dya, Gray launched his first MLB home run off Baltimore right-handed pitcher Dean Kremer. If you ask Gray, how he made it to the big leagues, he'd say he didn't but that the man upstairs put him in that position.

"I can just see God's work in my entire journey in baseball," said Gray. "Not everybody gets to do this in their career, and I just trusted him that even though things I may have felt I didn't deserve after that. In reality I did, you just continue to work hard and whatever he decides, you just have to be obedient. I just let things happen and he came through."

Even though the 28-year-old has only appeared in two MLB games thus far, he still feels like he can and will contribute to a big-league squad soon enough.

Gray isn't the only one with that belief as well. This past offseason, the Miami Marlins hired former Tampa Bay Rays general manager Peter Bendix to become the President of Baseball Operations for the Marlins. His very first move with the Marlins? Signing Tristan Gray, but it did take a bit of convincing.

"Whenever my agent called me and told me that Peter (Bendix) had called specifically and I told him, I said, 'Hey man, I was just with you for six years and only got a couple of days up there, I'm a little hesitant,'" said Gray. "He said to me that he understood but also that look you're a great player and I think that you are ready, and he's just shown me through all that he did to get me to come here and it's been an amazing decision for sure."

Another major plus for Gray when he signed with the Marlins was the chance to reunite with his college roommate

and now current teammate Dane Myers. The duo was inseparable back in their college days at Rice University.

"I talked to Dane while going through that process and I asked him how it was and he said dude, 'You're gonna fit in great, the coaching staff, everything about it,'" Gray said. "There's nothing to worry about so in your decision-making, just know the Marlins is a great place to play."

After the advice from Myers, Gray was hooked and on November 16, 2023, Bendix had his first catch in free agency.

Fast forward to April 2024. . . Gray had just launched his fifth home run of the series against the Bulls. No triumphant music, no smoke spewing from the bull sign in left field made of wood and sheet metal, no UPS vest celebration in the home team dugout, all of those things that made playing in Durham special now just a distant memory. It is time for new memories, in a new jersey, on a new team.

Gray steps on home plate and smiles as he looks up towards the Durham crowd jeering him. Peter Bendix, the Miami Marlins, the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, and Tristan Gray couldn't have been any happier. He had died a hero and lived long enough to see himself become the villain.

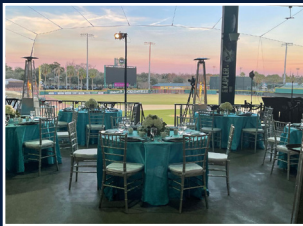

# 121 FINANCIAL

Bragan Field at 121 Financial Ballpark, which opened in 2003, is one of the premier Minor League ballparks in North America.

The ballpark was the first completed project of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Featuring an old-fashioned design, brick facade and a grass seating berm, 121 Financial Ballpark reminds fans of the days of yesteryear and preserves all of the wonderful tradition baseball has to offer. The vivid sight lines capture the action up-close while providing fans with comfortable seating and easy access to concessions and restrooms.

121 Financial Ballpark features 12 luxury skyboxes, four skydecks, and a one-of-a-kind Tiki Terrace at the left field corner. It also has an HD videoboard and LED fence display in left field and two ribbon displays along the baselines of the suite level

The ballpark has hosted three Major League Baseball exhibitions (2006, 2010, 2015), four ACC Baseball Tournaments (2006-09) and two Southern League All-Star games (2003, 2013). The 2013 Southern League All-Star game boasted a league-record 9,373 fans in attendance.

In 2016, owner Ken Babby invested \$1.8 million into the ballpark to add a new groups area directly behind the home bullpen, a Tiki Terrace near the left-field foul pole, renovations to all 12 private suites and expansion of the suite-level, third-floor lounge to give all fans a climate-controlled space to overlook the playing field.

Since 2007, 121 Financial Ballpark has hosted a game in the annual college baseball series between in-state rivals, Florida State and Florida. The annual installment brings capacity crowds to 121 Financial Ballpark for their storied rivalry.

The ballpark features nearly 6,000 stadium-style chairs and can accommodate more than 11,000 fans. Has 12 luxury skyboxes and four sky decks, each of which having private seating. Ballpark is also completely wheelchair accessible, including the dugouts, camera wells and playing field.

The total estimated cost is \$34 million, paid for by Jacksonville residents as part of a tax approved in 2000 to fund the "Better Jacksonville Plan," an initiative to improve the city's infrastructure. The adjacent Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena was also funded through the plan and was completed in November 2003.

## BASEBALL BASICS: HOW TO KEEP SCORE

**DIFFERENT FANS** have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method:

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score. (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes.)

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score

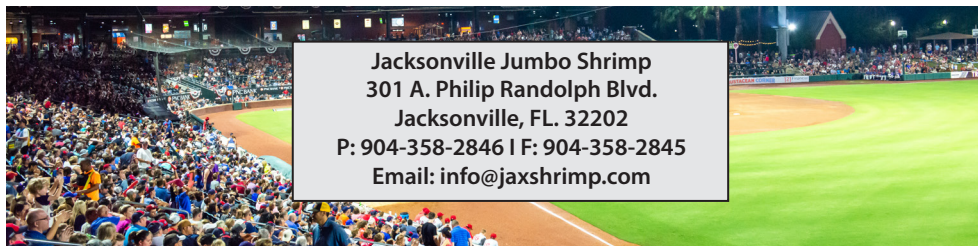

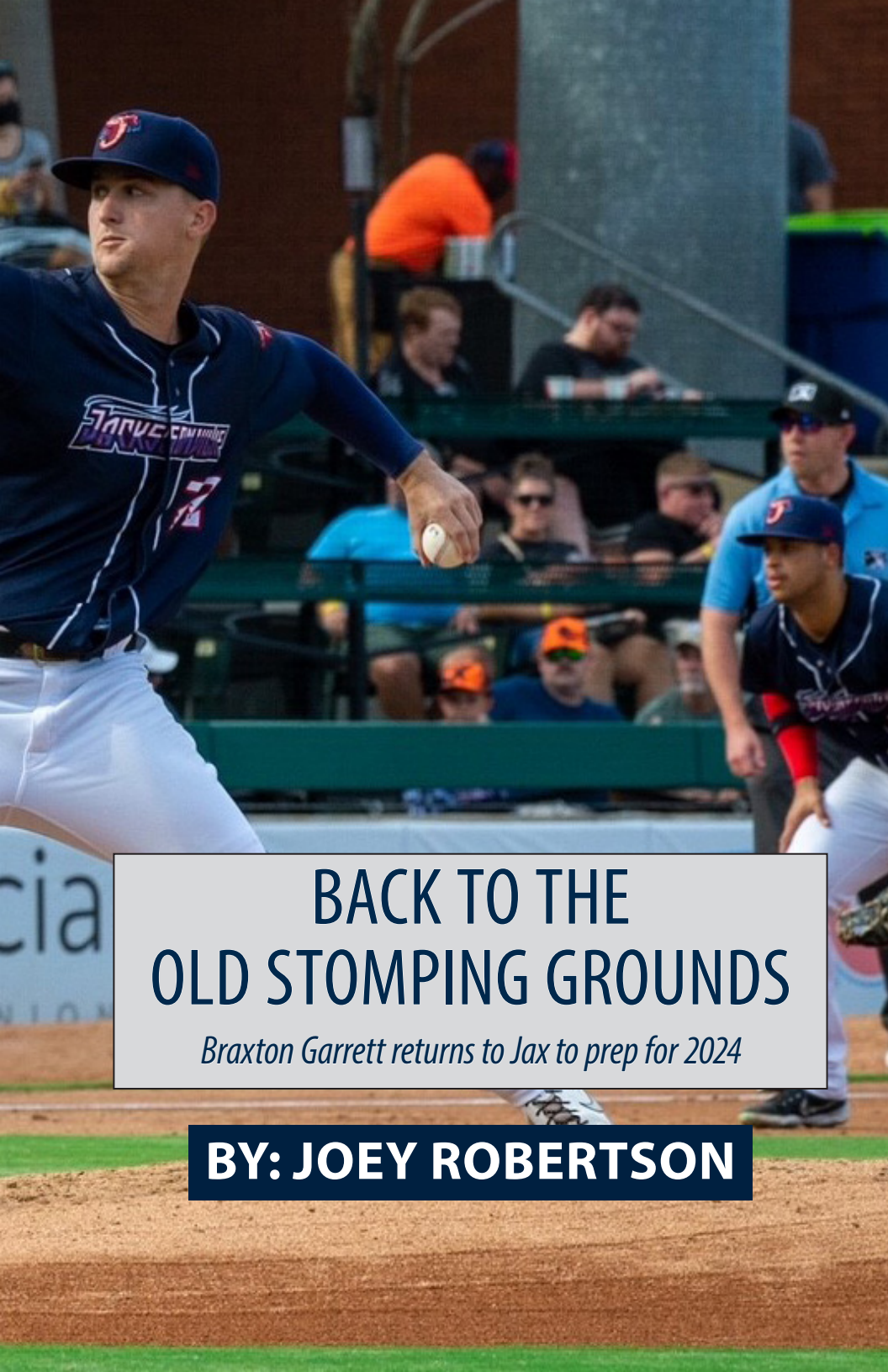

# BACK TO THE OLD STOMPING GROUNDS

*Braxton Garrett returns to Jax to prep for 2024*

It's been a long, strange Spring Training and start to the season for Marlins left-handed pitcher Braxton Garrett. Instead of starting his 2024 campaign in Miami when the Marlins opened the season against the Pittsburgh Pirates, the southpaw spent Opening Day resting and rehabbing.

In modern day baseball, pitchers, regardless of the level they play at, are looking to throw as hard as possible with the most amount of spin rate on the ball to create the maximum amount of movement. This strategy has completely overhauled how pitchers are evaluated. It's also caused an alarming number of arm injuries, arguably the most to ever start the season at the MLB level.

Thankfully for Garrett, it was a nagging shoulder impingement that kept him sidelined through Spring Training and the start of the season. Some may look at his ailment as just a shoulder impingement, nothing too

serious, but in a pitcher's arm, everything is connected. Muscles and ligaments work together like cogs in a machine. If one part of the machine isn't working correctly then problems could arise.

The same thing applies for a pitcher's arm, if one element is weakened, then that could lead to a drop in velocity, control issues, or overcompensation which causes an additional injury. When a pitcher sustains any of those problems, that could lead to a dip in performance on the field and in modern-day baseball culture, any slight discrepancy could be the difference between throwing six strikeouts or giving up six runs. In the grand scheme of things, it's why the Marlins have been very cautious with Garrett's moneymaker to start the year.

"Brax had some general soreness in his shoulder and didn't feel like we needed to push it on the mound today, so obviously monitor it as he goes, don't push him back until he feels better," said Marlins Manager Skip Schumaker in an interview with reporters back on February 16, 2024. "He's kinda been dealing with it for a little bit, it's nothing serious but we don't wanna rush him back just yet."

After resting and working through the ailment for a couple weeks, Garrett was back to throwing and in an interview with reporters on March 5, 2024, gave a positive update on his progress.

"I'm starting to feel normal again," stated Garrett. "Shoulders bouncing back really well, I'm in a much better spot than when I showed up.

Even after his progress, the Marlins were still cautious with him and rightly so in order to protect a key part of their starting rotation. They assigned the lefty to Jacksonville on a rehab assignment to start his season in order to build up his workload. A place he knows all too well.

Garrett has pitched at least parts of every minor league season for the Jumbo Shrimp since 2019. The Foley, Ala., native spent the entirety of his 2021 season in Jacksonville, making 18 starts while fanning 86 hitters.

Most recently in 2024, Garrett began his rehab assignment with starts with the Jumbo Shrimp. His first start went about as expected as he hurled four and a thirds innings while striking out five against the Durham Bulls on April 7.

"Had a good rehab start on Sunday in Durham, I felt great that day," said Garrett. "Just trying to stay on routine and get ready to get back to Miami."

While spending time with the Jumbo Shrimp this season, the Marlins starter has made an effort to share some knowledge of the big leagues to the rest of the Jumbo Shrimp rotation.

"I know a lot of these guys, I go through Spring Training with them, I had a great conversation with Monteverde the other day," said Garrett. "I think we pitch very similar, we're both soft-throwing guys and he was picking my brain on how to attack hitters, count management, stuff like that. It feels good that he respects my opinion and wants to know my thought process."

Garrett's second rehab start with the Jumbo Shrimp back on April 12 versus the Charlotte Knights and it was very similar to his outing against the Bulls as he went six innings while striking out four batters.

Now that his shoulder is starting to get better, Garrett's eyes are set on his return to the majors in the near future, but Jacksonville will always hold a special place in his heart.

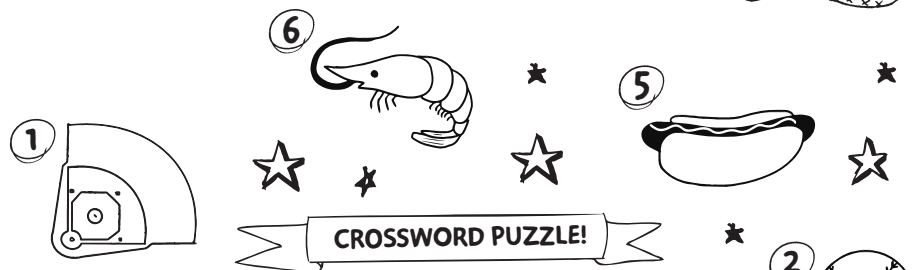

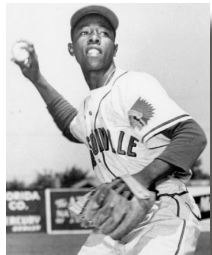

# JUMBO SHRIMP COACHING STAFF

## DAREN BROWN | MANAGER | THIRD SEASON

Daren Brown returns for his third consecutive season as Jacksonville manager in 2024.

A native of Holdenville, Okla., Brown holds a 1,281-1,269 (.502) record as a minor league manager. In 2022, Brown's first season with Jacksonville, he piloted the Jumbo to with an 80-69 (.537) record, placing third in the International League East Division. After stellar performances throughout the season, the Jumbo Shrimp saw 12 players from their 2022 roster make their major league debuts. Brown also juggled a franchise-record 79 players, including a Jacksonville high for starting pitchers (25). The Jumbo Shrimp followed that up with a 70-79 (.470) record in 2023, with Brown juggling a franchise-record 44 different pitchers on his staff throughout the campaign.

The 56-year-old is currently in his third stint as a Triple-A skipper. He piloted Triple-A Tacoma in the Seattle Mariners' organization from 2007-13 and again in 2019, tallying 494 victories, which marks the most wins for any manager in Rainiers franchise history. Brown led Tacoma to consecutive division titles in 2009 and 2010, and during that latter season, helped the Rainiers win the franchise's first outright Pacific Coast League Championship since 1969. Over this time period, Brown also earned a pair of call ups to the Mariners' coaching staff, including a stint as the club's interim manager for the final 50 games of the 2010 season.

After working as Seattle's baserunning coordinator in 2014 and bunting and baserunning coordinator in 2015, Brown steered Double-A Jackson to a 84-55 (.604) record and Southern League Championship in 2016. He skippered Double-A Arkansas during the 2017-18 seasons before returning to Tacoma for the 2019 campaign. In 2021, Brown managed the Kingsport Axmen, a summer collegiate baseball team in the Appalachian League.

The son of former major leaguer Paul Brown, who pitched for parts of four seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies from 1961-63 and 1968, Daren was selected in the 29th round of the 1989 draft out of Southeastern Oklahoma State University. He pitched for five seasons in Toronto's organization from 1989-93, reaching as high as Double-A Knoxville. From 1994-99, Daren served as a player-coach (1994-97) and player-manager (1998-99) for Amarillo of the independent Texas-Louisiana League. He retired as a player following the 1999 season, which saw Brown win the circuit's Manager of the Year and Amarillo take the league championship, and managed the Dillas for one more season.

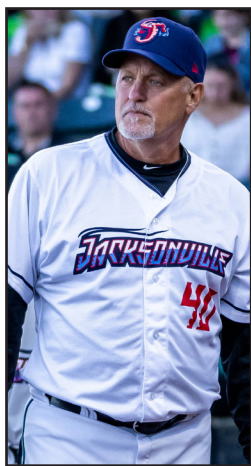

Pereda is the 996th player to don both a Jacksonville uniform and play in the major leagues, including the 159th former Jumbo Shrimp. The history of Minor League Baseball in Jacksonville dates back to 1904.

Pereda started the game at catcher and hit ninth for the Marlins, going 0-for-2 with a strikeout. He was lifted for Emmanuel Rivera as a pinch hitter in the bottom of the eighth.

The Marlins signed Pereda on January 17, 2024 and he was a non-roster invitee to Spring Training. In eight games with the Jumbo Shrimp as of April 16, Pereda hit .346/.469/.423/.892 with three runs scored prior to his promotion.

Originally signed by the Cubs as a non-drafted free agent on April 1, 2013 out of San Juan, Venezuela, Pereda spent time with Venezuelan Summer League Cubs in 2013. He was assigned to the Arizona League Cubs in 2015 and made his full season debut with the Low-A South Bend Cubs in 2017. In 2018, Pereda played in 122 games with the High-A

Myrtle Beach Pelicans, slashing .272/.347/.363/.710 with eight home runs and 57 RBIs, while throwing out 33.3% of would-be base stealers. After spending the 2019 season with Double-A Tennessee, he was traded to the Red Sox organization in March 2020. Following the 2021 season, he elected free agency and signed with the San Francisco Giants organization on December 15, 2021.

Pereda played the 2021 season with the Giants Triple-A affiliate, Sacramento. In 65 games with the River Cats, he slashed .272/.371/.379/.750 with four home runs and 25 RBIs. He elected free agency at the conclusion of the season and then signed a deal with the Cincinnati Reds. After being assigned to Triple-A Louisville, he batted .325/.405/.468/.873 in 67 games with six home runs and 36 RBIs.

Pereda is the first Jumbo Shrimp alumnus this season to make his major league debut. During the 2023 season, there were seven former Jumbo Shrimp players to debut in The Show.

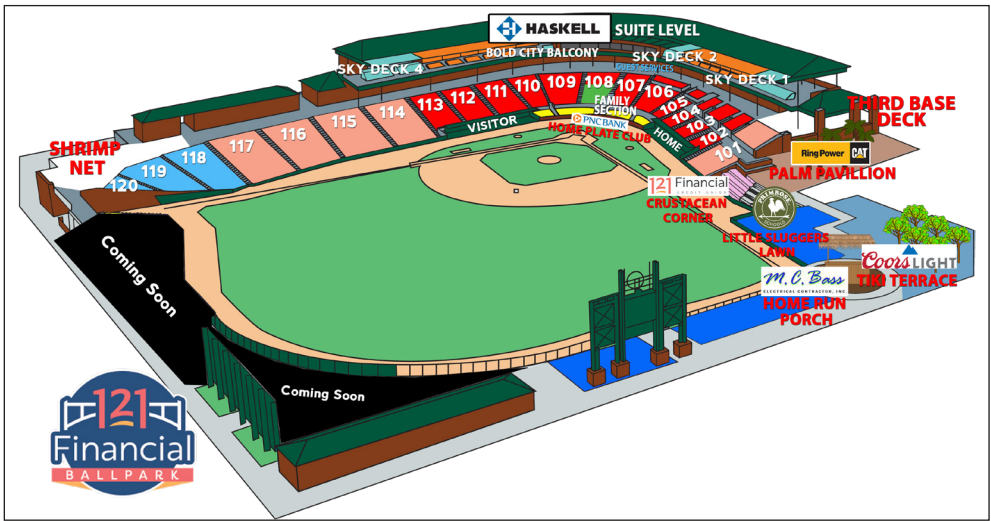

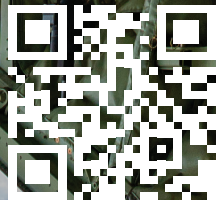
