Last Time Out: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies were shutout by the Somerset Patriots 8-0 in the series finale at TD Bank Ballpark on Sunday. The Ponies and Patriots split the series. Drew Gilbert had his second-straight multi-hit game.

Sharp Blade: Right-hander **Blade Tidwell** was dominant in his last start at Somerset on Wednesday morning. He tossed a career-high 7.2 innings with seven strikeouts and no walks. The 22-year-old allowed just two runs on two solo homers in his second Double-A start and earned his first Double-A win. He threw 16 pitches or fewer in every inning that he worked. Since earning his first High-A win on May 17, Tidwell holds the lowest ERA (1.92) in Minor League Baseball.

Action Jackson: Newly acquired infielder **Jeremiah Jackson** hit a three-run homer on Saturday night, which was his second long ball of the series at Somerset. He crushed his first home run as a member of the Mets' organization on Wednesday, with a go-ahead two-run homer. Jackson reached base safely in each of his first nine games with Binghamton and has totaled nine runs batted in. The former second-round pick in 2018 hit 15 home runs with Double-A Rocket City this year and now has 17 total homers.

What's at Stake?: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies (19-19) currently sit a 0.5 game up on the Portland Sea Dogs (19-20) coming into this six-game series. Binghamton is 2.0 games back of Somerset and Portland is 2.5 games back of Somerset for the top spot in the Northeast Division. Somerset already clinched the postseason with a first half championship, and the next team with the best winning percentage in the second half will join them in the playoffs. Binghamton and Portland split a six-game set at Mirabito Stadium from June 13-18.

The Pipeline: MLB.com and MLB Pipeline released updated prospect rankings on Thursday night. The Mets had four players rank in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects: **Luisangel Acuña (40), Drew Gilbert (53), Jett Williams (84), Ronny Mauricio (93),** and Kevin Parada (96). Last Start: Tidwell twirled a career-high 7.2 innings and earned his first Double-A win at Somerset on Wednesday morning, while striking out seven batters with no walks. He allowed two runs on six hits, on two solo homers. The 22-year-old threw 16 pitches or fewer in every inning.

2022: Tidwell was drafted by the New York Mets in the second round (52nd overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Tennessee. He threw one inning for the FCL Mets before being promoted to Low-A St. Lucie. He made four starts for Low-A St. Lucie, and allowed two runs on four hits over 8.1 innings with nine strikeouts and six walks.

BACKGROUND: Tidwell ranks as the New York Mets' top pitching prospect and No. 8 overall prospect. The 22-year-old is in his first full season of professional baseball. In his 17 starts with High-A Brooklyn in 2023, Tidwell held hitters to the lowest opponent batting average in the South Atlantic League (.190), earned the second most wins (8), and carried the third lowest ERA (3.09). The second-round pick out of Tennessee had a decorated collegiate career. As a freshman in 2021, he posted a 3.74 ERA with 90 strikeouts in 98.2 innings. During his final year with the Volunteers in 2022, Tidwell was named to the NCAA Knoxville Regional All-Tournament Team. He was also named to the 2021 SEC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-American Honors from Perfect Game and D1Baseball. Helped lead Loretto High School to 2017 Class A State Title. He hit .557 with 30 XBHs and 6 HR while posting an 8-0 record with 107 Ks in 53 innings as a junior in 2019.

Reid Brignac - Manager - 2nd season with Binghamton - 4th year in the Mets organization.

In 2022, Brignac led a team that saw five players make their major league debut with the Mets after starting the season with the Rumble Ponies (Francisco Álvarez, Brett Baty, Jose Butto, Nate Fisher, and Bryce Montes de Oca), tied for the second-most in franchise history. This past fall, Brignac was one of two Mets staff members selected to be a part of the Arizona Fall League coaching staff, serving as the manager of the Peoria Javelinas. Following his retirement as an active player in 2018, Brignac was the manager of the St. Lucie Mets (Low-A) in 2021 before coming to Binghamton last year.
