No. Wetherholt Lands in Springfield

You've probably heard the name JJ Wetherholt. The St. Louis Cardinals' number one prospect was the seventh overall selection in 2024 and has been with Springfield all of 2025, his first full season in Minor League Baseball. With the accolades he brings to the Cardinals this season comes the added pressure of being the highest-ranked prospect.

"You don't want to be the guy who was always just known as a top-ranked prospect," Wetherholt explained when talking about the hype surrounding him leading up to the draft. "At some point you want to make that jump to where you're actually at the level that people thought I was going to be at."

Wetherholt was not a highly-touted prospect out of Mars Area High School in Pennsylvania, about 35 minutes away from Pittsburgh's PNC Field. While clearly a great high school player, an early commitment during his sophomore year to West Virginia would soon pay off for his development. Wetherholt would go on to hit .449 during a massive breakout season in 2023 for the Mountaineers.

"It was crazy. Honestly, I was just showing up and getting two or three hits, going about my business," he recounted. Wetherholt even admitted that self-doubt crept in as the season progressed. His stock rose quickly, springing to the top of multiple mock drafts throughout the baseball world. In the days leading up to draft day, there were rumors that the Cleveland Guardians would go as far as to drafting him first overall. Instead, they selected Oregon State's Travis Bazzana. But to Wetherholt, there's no ill-will towards the six teams that passed on him for another player (Cleveland, Cincinnati, Colorado, Oakland, Chicago-AL, Kansas City).

"I just wanted to go to a team who really, really wanted me as their pick. Not that they took me because the guy they really wanted ended up getting taken." He said that St. Louis was a team that had wanted him from the jump.

"They obviously have my best interest in mind, so I was just showing up, doing whatever they wanted me to do and trusting in that process. It ended up going pretty smoothly after the draft."

The top prospect found quick success in 29 games for the Palm Beach Cardinals in 2024 to end the draft year. Wetherholt skipped the High-A ranks right here to Springfield to start this season. Through the end of May, he was hitting .277 overall in 36 games with the Cardinals, doing especially well in late-game situations. As he continues his first full year in the pros, Wetherholt is focused on the controllables and ultimately positioning himself for an eventual Big League debut.

Nathan Church & Tekoah Roby Shine in Red-Hot May

Two Springfield Cardinals were recognized for massive months in May: OF Nathan Church was named the Texas League Player of the Month while RHP Tekoah Roby was honored as the St. Louis Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Month. The twos' play contributed to a successful month for the team that propelled them into first place and ahead of the pack for the fight for a First-Half Championship.

ABOUT NATHAN CHURCH

Church is the first Springfield Cardinal to win the Texas League Player of the Month award this season, the first since OF Bryan Torres in August of 2024 and just the 19th player all-time in team history. In 24 games in May, Church slashed .357/.407/.602 and led the Texas League in average (.357), hits (35) and total bases (59).

In the hottest month at the plate in his Minor League career, the Southern California-native hit six home runs and struck out just seven times in 108 trips to the plate. He began the month with a walk-off single on May 1 to go with a homer earlier in the game. On May 21 in Tulsa, the lefty-swinger swatted his first career grand slam agains the Drillers. Church earned his first promotion to Triple-A Memphis on June 3, making his Triple-A debut later that night. The 24-year-old is in the midst of his fourth season in the St. Louis system and broke into the MLB Pipeline Top-30 Caridnals Prospect List entering 2025 as the 21st ranked player. He played in the Arizona Fall League this past offseason with the Glendale Desert Dogs.

This is Church's third honor from Minor League Baseball, joining Midwest League Player of the Week (June 5-11, 2023) and Texas League Player of the Week (April 15-21, 2024) awards. St. Louis tabbed him as their organizational Player of the Month in April of 2024. He was selected by St. Louis in the 11th round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of the UC Irvine.

ABOUT TEKOAH ROBY

Roby earned the first STL Pitcher of the Month award of his career as he becomes the 22nd Springfield Cardinal all-time honored by the organization in this capacity. LHP Ixan Henderson most recently held the honor in April of this year. Of the previous 21 Springfield honorees, 11 have gone on to play in the Major Leagues (four still with the organization), a list that includes Gordon Graceffo, Shelby Miller, Lance Lynn and others.

Roby made five starts in May, ranking first in strikeouts, strikeouts per nine and strikeouts to walks ratio among qualified St. Louis Minor Leaguers. The right-hander notched a career-high 11 strikeouts against the Amarillo Sod Poodles on May 16 at Hammons Field. Aside from his first start in May, he never surrendered more than two runs in his last four outings in the month. On June 9, he earned a promotion to Triple-A Memphis for the first time in his career.

"Eric Peterson and the rest of our pitching team have done a great job partnering with Tekoah to train towards an athletic delivery that ultimately leads him to working in advantageous counts from the get-go. This can be seen in the increase in his K% and decrease in BB% over the last month," stated Cardinals Director of Player Development Larry Day in a St. Louis press release.

Roby missed a large portion of the 2024 season due to injury, but has been healthy in 2025. The Florida-native joined Springfield in 2023 after a trade between the Texas Rangers and St. Louis which included INF Thomas Saggese, LHP John King, LHP Jordan Montgomery and RHP Chris Stratton. He is currently ranked by MLB Pipeline as the 11th-best prospect in the organization (fourth-ranked pitcher). He throws a Four-Seam Fastball, Sinker, Slider, Curveball and Changeup.





Patrick Anderson - Manager

After three seasons as manager of the Peoria Chiefs (A+), Anderson will now become the eighth-ever manager in Springfield Cardinals history. Anderson, who calls nearby Columbia, MO home, previously spent seven years in the Nationals organization (2013-19) as manager with the Single-A Hagerstown Suns (2014-19) and Gulf Coast League Nationals (2013). Across ten Minor League managerial seasons, he holds a 661-619 record and a 2013 Gulf Coast League Championship.

Anderson played collegiately at Mars Hill (NC) University and played three years of Independent League Baseball. He brings a wealth of experience to Springfield, as he began coaching in 1996 as an assistant with Gannon (PA) University. He also spent time at Hofstra University as an assistant coach (1999-2001) and head coach (2009-11). Inbetween his college coaching were coaching positions in the Royals organization in the GCL (2001), Midwest League (2002-06), Pioneer League (2007) and Appalachian League (2008).



Eric Peterson-Pitching Coach

Eric Peterson returns for his third season as Springfield's Pitching Coach after guiding a staff last year that featured the Minor League Pitcher of the Year Quinn Mathews and Texas League Pitcher of the Year Tink Hence in 2024. Under his leadership, the 2024 Springfield pitching staff set a franchise record 1,279 strikeouts. The Bear, DE native played college baseball at Temple University for two seasons before transferring to North Carolina State University. He was drafted in the 37th round of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros and suited up for the Corpus Christi Hooks in the Texas League during the 2016 and 2017 campaigns.



Casey Chenoweth-Hitting Coach

Casey Chenoweth enters his third season in the Cardinals organization after spending the 2024 season in Springfield and the 2023 campaign with High-A Peoria, both as hitting coach. The 2025 season will mark his second with Springfield. The Tollhouse, CA native previously spent three years from 2020-22 as the assistant hitting coordinator for the Arizona Diamondbacks and two seasons from 2018-19 as a minor league hitting coach in the San Francisco Giants system. An infielder at East Central University in Ada, OK, Chenoweth played one season of professional baseball in 2017 for the East Side Diamond Hoppers of the United Shore League.



Danny Black-Coach

Danny Black is a newcomer to the Springfield Cardinals. A former utility player with six seasons of experience in the Florida/Miami system. He spent the 2023 and 2024 seasons as a Defensive coach with Double-A Pensacola. He began his coaching career in 2018 and has served in various coaching roles since in the Marlins system.




Alex Wolfinger-Athletic Trainer

Alex Wolfinger joined the St. Louis Cardinals organization in 2018, spanning five different levels including Double-A. The 2025 season marks his fourth consecutive with Springfield. He was named the Texas League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2023 while with Springfield. Wolfinger earned his Bachelor's degree at Neumann University and his Masters at the University of Memphis.



Ryan Duffy-Strength and Conditioning Coach

Ryan Duffy joined Springfield in 2024 after spending two seasons with the Peoria Chiefs (High-A) of the Midwest League (2022, 2023). This is his fourth year in professional sports and his second with the Springfield Cardinals.



Hunter Broadbent-Appiliate Fellow

The 2025 season marks Hunter Broadbent's first in the St. Louis Cardinals organization and his second in affiliated baseball. He spent the 2024 season working for the New York Mets in a similar role with the Double-A Binghamton Rumble Ponies. Broadbent is a 2023 graduate of the University of Connecticut where he worked with the university's baseball program as a Director of Baseball Development and Analytics.
