NEW YORK YANKEES DOUBLE-A AFFILIATE



NOT MESSING AROUND: In seven starts since the All- Star break (7/19), Zach Messinger ranks third in the Eastern League with a 1.74 ERA over 41.1 IP where batters are hitting .200 off him with a 1.11 WHIP. During five starts over the month of August, Messinger went 3-0 and ranked 2nd in the Eastern League with a 1.52 ERA and 3rd with 29.2 IP.

WELL HELLO, KIKO! In his Double-A debut on Friday night, Kiko Romero reached base four times, including hits in his final two at-bats during the 9th and 10th innings. Romero's first Double-A hit was a game-tying single in the 9th that forced extra innings. His second Double-A hit was his first Double-A home run to cap the scoring in the 10th inning of a 9-3 Somerset win.

BRINGING THE BEET: Prior to tonight's game, RHP Clayton Beeter was reinstated off Triple-A SWB's 60-day IL and had his option transferred to Double-A Somerset. Beeter made the Yankees' Opening Day roster this season and threw three pitches in a scoreless MLB debut @HOU on 3/29. After being optioned to Triple-A, Beeter made seven starts for SWB, going 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA. After last pitching on 5/15, Beeter was placed on the IL with a shoulder injury. Beeter previously starred with Somerset over the 2022-23 Eastern League seasons, making 19 total starts and posting a 6-2 record and 2.09 ERA (20 ER / 86.0 IP). Beeter last pitched for the Patriots on 6/17/23.

RE-HASHING THE REHABS: With Clarke Schmidt being reinstated off the Yankees' 60-day IL today, the Somerset Patriots' roster no longer includes any Major League rehabbers for the first time since August 10th. From August 11th to September 6th, Somerset hosted seven MLB rehabbers, out of a franchise record 14 overall in 2024.

COMING OUT OF MY CAGE: Since going four straight games and a season-high 44 straight innings without a home run, the Patriots have now homered in six straight games for a total of 10 home runs. **RAF RAKES:** Over Rafael Flores' last 10 games, he's gone hitless in four, while in the other six games, he has combined to go 12-for-24 with 10 RBI, 8 R and 6 XBH (4 HR). Since joining the Patriots on the first day of the second half (6/25), Flores leads the Eastern League with 15 HR and a .540 SLG, while ranking 2nd with 115 TB and 3rd with 26 XBH and a .898 OPS. Flores' 21 total HR this season lead all Yankees minor leaguers. He enters today having homered in three straight games for the first time in his career.

EXTRA, EXTRA, READ ALL ABOUT IT: Each of Spencer Jones' last six hits have gone for extra bases, spanning to August 31st over his last seven games. Over his last 13 games, Jones has had six multi-hit games with 11/17 hits having gone for extra bases.

GAME OF INCHES: Since the All-Star break, the Somerset Patriots are 24-16. Of their 16 losses, 14 have been decided by three runs or less. Of 22 wins, 13 have been decided by three runs or less. In Somserset's 40 games post-All-Star break, 29/40 have been decided by three runs or less (rercord: 15-14). The Patriots enter today a half-game back of the first place Portland Sea Dogs.

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir begin his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2023: Messinger's second pro season was his first full season working as a starter. He spent all but one game in 2023 pitching for High-A Hudson Valley, posting a 1-10 record and 4.36 ERA over 21 appearances (20 starts). During the first half of the season (11 starts), Messinger posted a 2.44 ERA with 68 K over 55.1 IP. In the second half of the season, he pitched to a 6.91 ERA. Following the conclusion of the 2023 South Atlantic League regular season, Messinger was promoted to Double-A Somerset on 9/12, during the final week of the Eastern League regular season. He made his Double-A debut on 9/14 @NH, pitching to a no-decision while allowing 2 ER over 4.1 IP with 7 K. Among Yankees farmhands, Messinger ended the season ranked tied for ninth in games started (21) and 10th in both strikeouts (120) and innings pitched (101.1).

2022: After being drafted as a reliever, Messinger made his first 15 professional appearances out of the bullpen for Single-A Tampa and posted a 3.57 ERA, before being approached by the Yankees about transitioning to a starting role. After fully converting to a starting pitcher, Messinger then started his final 16 appearances down the stretch to end his first professional season, pitching to a 4.57 ERA. Overall, he spent the full season with Single-A Tampa, pitching in 31 games (16 starts) and compiling a 4.30 ERA with 112 K in 83.2 IP.

College: Pitched three seasons at the University of Virginia (2019-21), working primarily as a reliever in 51 appearances (11 starts). During his junior season in 2021, he appeared in a team-high 28 games (four starts). Messinger led Virginia to the 2021 College World Series, where he pitched .2 IP across two appearances against Mississippi State and Texas where he allowed 4 R. Across his three seasons at Virginia, Messinger went 5-3 with a 4.42 ERA and 112 K over 99.2 IP.

Personal Notes: Attended Castle High School (IN), where he served as team captain for both the baseball and basketball teams. As a senior in 2018, he posted a 7-1 record and 1.66 ERA working as a starter, while being named an Indiana South All-Star. He was also awarded First Team All-State honors and was named Castle's 2018 Lonnie Fisher Male Athlete of the Year. Father, Dennis, played basketball at Olney Central College, and his mother, Lisa, played volleyball at the University of Evansville. Messinger got married this off-season to his now-wife Kinsey.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2021 MLB Draft for \$225,000.
