FRISCO ALLOWS MOST RUNS ON SEASON IN WEDNESDAY LOSS:

The Frisco RoughRiders showed off their offense on Wednesday, but the Wichita Wind Surge did even more winning 16-8 from Riders Field. Frisco (13-16) kept the game close with a pair of home runs in the fifth inning by **Thomas Saggese** and **Liam Hicks**, the first homer of the season for each. Hicks was making his Double-A debut on Wednesday as the starting catcher. The Toronto native reached base three times and recorded three runs batted in. Saggese had four hits, tying a career-high, and scored twice. Wichita (12-17) was paced by David Banuelos, who had a trio of two-RBI hits including a home run in the second inning. His six RBIs tied a career-high. Wichita struck early and often, totaling eight earned runs off Frisco starter **Ryan Garcia** (0-3). Osiris German (2-0) pitched 2.1 innings with three earned runs for Wichita before former RoughRiders pitcher Seth Nordlin took care of the final 2.1 innings without a run. Frisco got another strong day from **Kellen Strahm**, who has posted two hits in both games this series. The San Jose State product has 12 hits in his last seven games. Wichita scored eight runs off the Frisco bullpen, but **Hever Bueno** and **Theo McDowell** were bright spots, each throwing 1.1 innings in relief without a run scored.

EAGER FOR SEAGER:

The RoughRiders are expected to host their second rehabbing Texas Rangers player this season in the form of Rangers shortstop **Corey Seager** beginning on Thursday. Seager, who was signed by the Rangers as a free agent prior to the 2022 season, was placed on the 10-day injured list with a hamstring strain on April 12th. To begin the season, Seager was hitting .359/.469/.538/1.008 with a home run and 4 RBIs over 11 games prior to the injury. The three-time All-Star, two-time Silver Slugger and 2016 National League Rookie of the Year began his career with the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2015. In 2020, Seager helped the Dodgers to their first World Series championship since 1988 with MVP performances in both the NLCS and the World Series, clubbing a combined seven home runs between the two series. In his first season with the Rangers, Seager set an MLB record for the most home runs by a left-handed hitting shortstop with 33. He was named to the American League All-Star Team. When coming up through the Dodgers organization, Seager played 38 games with Double-A Chattanooga in 2014 and 20 games with Double-A Tulsa in 2015, batting .355/.390/.583/.973 with seven home runs and 42 RBIs over his 58 combined contests.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING HARDWARE:

The RoughRiders had three players honored by their parent club in their April awards. **Evan Carter** won Player of the Month in the org, hitting .343/.500/.543/1.043 with a league-best 21 walks while **Grant Wolfram** earned Reliever of the Month honors by not allowing a run over 9.2 innings with 11 strikeouts. **Luisangel Acuña** anchored the best defensive team in the minors to take home Defender of the Month, playing both shortstop and second base.

PITCHING STRUGGLING:

Over the last 14 games, Frisco has a 7.38 ERA, which is the worst in the Texas League over that stretch. The Riders allowed 18 home runs over that stretch, which is tied for last in the league. The Frisco bullpen had a 6.98 ERA over the last two weeks, ballooning their reliever ERA to 4.81 this season, which is still fifth in the league. After the tough two weeks, Frisco is still sixth in the league with a 5.26 ERA.

IT'S ABOUT STRAHM TIME:

RoughRiders outfielder **Kellen Strahm** has been on fire on this road trip after getting off to a tough start this season. Through his first 13 games, he was hitting just .125/.250/.146/.396, but since April 25th to begin the series in Amarillo, he is batting .354/.426/.583/1.009 with three doubles, a triple, two home runs and six RBIs while walking six times and just striking out seven times. Over the last 12 games, he has raised his average 115 points and his OPS 305 points. It was very similar to last season as Strahm was hitting just .136/.337/.226/.563 on May 14th last season through his first 22 games before slashing .305/.406/.445/.851 over his last 82 games of the season.

ACUÑA MATATA:

RoughRiders infielder **Luisangel Acuña** has been on fire to start his 2023 season. The Rangers No. 3 prospect is hitting .313 (40-for-128)/.373/.453/.826 through the first 29 games while ranking second in the Texas League in hits (40), tied for fifth in doubles (10), fifth in total bases (58) and second in stolen bases (15). Over his last 25 games, he is batting .336/.403/.500/.903. When the 21-year-old arrived in Frisco in 2022, he had a wRC+ of 68 while it has nearly doubled this season (119).

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The RoughRiders have just committed 12 errors through 29 games. On Thursday in Midland, they had their first multi-error game of the year. The team's .988 fielding percentage is tied for the best in Minor League Baseball. Their 12 errors are the fewest in the minors.

WALK THIS WAY:

On the season, Frisco's 156 walks are first among Double-A teams while their .359 team OBP is third in Double-A. **Evan Carter** has the Double-A lead with 26 walks and **Dustin Harris** is fourth with 23 (second in the Texas League) while Carter is third in OBP (.444) in the league.

ABOUT JACK

-Leiter was drafted in the first round (No. 2 overall) in 2021 by the Rangers out of Vanderbilt University. With the Commodores, Leiter was a unanimous First Team All-American and a finalist for both the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Trophy.

-Threw first regular-season, complete-game no-hitter to start SEC play since 1971 against No.16 South Carolina on March 20th, 2021. He walked the first batter of the game before retiring the last 27 he saw with 16 strikeouts on 124 pitches. Followed up that no-hitter with 7.0 no-hit innings in his next start (20.2 consecutive no-hit innings over three starts from March 20th - April 2nd).

-Drafted in 20th round in 2019 by NYY out of Delbarton School (NJ). Named 2019 New Jersey Gatorade POY, striking out 95 in 57 innings as a senior.

-The family lineage is strong with Jack. His father, Al, pitched in 19 MLB seasons (1987-2006), making two All-Star teams and winning both the 1993 and 1997 World Series. His uncle, Mark, played 11 seasons in the majors (1990-99; 2001) and his cousin, Mark Jr., pitched two seasons (2017-2018) with Philadelphia and Toronto. Al now works as an analyst for MLB Network.

2023 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2023 season as the No. 78 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No. 5 prospect in the Rangers system.

2022 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2022 season as the No. 17 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No. 1 prospect in the Rangers system.

-Leiter dazzled in his professional debut, striking out seven over his three innings against the Arkansas Travelers on April 9th. The righty helped draw the largest crowd since 2019 at Riders Field for the debut (9,322).

-Threw the Riders first quality start of the season on May 7th against Arkansas. Leiter retired the last 15 batters he saw, allowing just two hits (one in the first and one in the second inning).

-Leiter came out of the bullpen as a "start" to finish a suspended game on May 31st (game was finished on June 1st) and recorded a career-best eight strikeouts against Wichita over 5.2 innings. The game resulted in a 3-0 win for Frisco, the Riders second shutout win of the season to that point.

-The righty allowed just one home run over his first nine outings before allowing two against Amarillo on June 7th. The two home runs were a grand slam and a two-run shot in a 7-4 loss to the Sod Poodles.

-Leiter was placed on the Development List on June 28th and was activated on July 10th before his start against San Antonio.

-Pitched a 1-2-3 inning on nine pitches in The SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game from Dodger Stadium on July 16th.

2021 SEASON

-After being drafted second overall in the 2021 draft, Leiter did not pitch in the minor leagues. Instead, he returned to Vanderbilt to workout, continue college and prepare for 2022. Did not finish degree, but got closer.

-Leiter was high school teammates with Yankees No. 1 prospect (No. 8 in baseball) Anthony Volpe at Delbarton School (NJ).
