WEDNESDAY: The Flying Squirrels fell to the Senators, 3-1. **Joe Whitman** started in his Double-A debut and threw five innings, allowing one run in the first inning, and struck out four with no walks. The Senators opened the scoring with an RBI single by Yohandy Morales in the bottom of the first, bringing home Donta' Williams after he was hit by a pitch and later advanced from first to third on a wild pitch. **Jairo Pomares** tied the score, 1-1, with a solo homer in the fourth, his second in two games in Harrisburg this week. Nick Schnell gave the Senators a 3-1 lead with a two-run triple in the bottom of the sixth inning. **Will Bednar** struck out five batters to work around two walks over 1.2 innings. Richmond outhit Harrisburg, 8-6.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the third of six games in their first road series of 2025, facing the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals.

EVEN STEVEN: In their 238 all-time, head-to-head games, the Flying Squirrels are 119-120 against the Senators. In the Flying Squirrels' first five seasons, they went 46-35 against the Senators from 2010-2014. From 2015-2019, the Richmond went 35-52 against Harrisburg. Over the last four seasons from 2021-2024, the Flying Squirrels have posted a winning record against the Senators three times, going 37-32, but went 7-11 in head-to-head meetings last year. Richmond is also 3-0 against Harrisburg in the postseason, sweeping the 2011 Division Series.

ONE IN THE WIN COLUMN: The Flying Squirrels avoided their first four-game losing streak to open a season with their win on Tuesday night in Harrisburg. They started 0-3 for the first time since 2016 when they dropped the first three games of a four-game set against the Hartford Yard Goats in their inaugural season with Richmond playing as the road team at The Diamond. They also started 0-3 in 2012 at New Britain before salvaging the final game of that series. Along with those two years, the Flying Squirrels' only other 0-2 start prior to this year was in 2014, when they dropped their first two games of the year before going on to reach the Eastern League Championship Series at the end of the season. Last weekend, the Flying Squirrels were swept in a season-opening series for the first time in franchise history. The Senators were 0-4 to being the season for the first time since 2014 before Wednesday's win. Their last 0-4 start was in 2007.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 64-74 last season, missing the postseason for the first time since 2021. For the year, Richmond hitters ranked fifth in the Eastern League in batting average (.238), fourth in hits (592), third in doubles (230), fourth in triples (26), 11th in homers (88) and 11th in stolen bases (123). Flying Squirrels pitchers ranked eighth in the league in ERA (4.22) and fourth in strikeouts (1,281). The 2024 Flying Squirrels used 64 different players, setting a new franchise record.

THE SENATORS The Senators dropped all three games of their season-opening series at Erie over the weekend. They were outscored, 20-4, in the three games. Last year, the Senators went 68-70 and finished in third place in the Eastern League's Southwest Division. They were 38-31 in the first half and finished a game behind Erie from clinching the division's first postseason spot. This year, the Senators offense is ranked last in the Eastern League in batting average (124). The Harrisburg pitching staff has the league's highest ERA (6.75). Harrisburg's roster includes four of Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including RHP Jarlin Susana (No. 3), 3B Cayden Wallace (No. 9), OF Daylen Lile (No. 10) and INF Yohandy Morales (No. 22). Five Senators players are ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects, including Susana (No. 2), Lile (No. 9), Wallace (No. 10), Morales (No. 12) and RHP Marquis Grissom Jr. (No. 23).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his second start of the season and the sixth of his career against the Senators. In his previous five starts against Harrisburg, Bertrand is 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA (6 ER/26.2 IP). In his last two starts against the Senators. In his last two starts against the Senators on July 11, 2024 at The Diamond and August 16, 2024 at FNB Field, he has combined for 12.2 scoreless innings. Bertrand started on Opening Day for the Flying Squirrels on Friday against Akron and allowed three runs over 3.1 innings of work. He became the first pitcher to start back-to-back season openers for the Flying Squirrels. Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the year. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. *For more on Bertrand, see page two*.

FOR HARRISBURG: Left-hander Dustin Saenz makes his second start of the season. He pitched on Saturday at Erie and was charged with a loss after allowing four runs (two earned) in the first inning, recording two outs before being removed. He has made 24 starts in his Harrisburg career dating back to 2023, going 6-11 with a 5.68 ERA. Saenz was selected by the Nationals in the fourth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Texas A&M.

HOWELL AT THE MOON: Carter Howell was named the 2024 Flying Squirrels Player of the Year in his first Double-A season. He spent all of last year in Richmond. For the season, he led the Eastern League in doubles (30) and triples (7). He also led the Flying Squirrels in batting average (.272), on-base percentage (.347), slugging percentage (.391), OPS (.738), hits (121), walks (47), extra-base hits (40), total bases (174), runs (64) and stolen bases (15). He reached base four times in Friday's season opener and has totaled four hits and four walks through the team's first five games.

FAMILIAR FACES: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster includes 22 players who have previously played for the Flying Squirrels. There are six players who have made their team debuts, including Aeverson Arteaga, Sabin Ceballos, Manuel Mercedes, Rodolfo Nolasco, Braxton Roxby and Joe Whitman. Roxby, acquired from the Reds in a trade earlier this year, is the only newcomer with previous Double-A experience.

WHERE DID THESE GUYS COME FROM?: There are players from six different counties on the Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster, including the United States (20 players), Venezuela (3), the Dominican Republic (2), Cuba (1), Panama (1) and Puerto Rico (1), Among the 20 American-born players, 11 different states are represented, including North Carolina (3), Florida (3), Ohio (3), California (2), Michigan (2), Pennsylvania (2), Kentucky (1), Minnesota (1), North Dakota (1), Rhode Island (1) and Texas (1). There are 11 players who joined the Giants organization out of the MLB Draft, six were signed as non-drafted free agents, six as international free agents, four who were picked up in trades and one who was claimed in the minor-league phase of the Rule 5 Draft. For 23 players, the Giants were their original affiliated organization and five have played with other major-league organizations.

BOULEVARD TO THE BAY: Last season, 14 former Flying Squirrels players reached the majors for the first time. That was the most in a season in franchise history. In 2014, 11 alumni made their MLB debuts, including Joe Panik, Adam Duvall, Andrew Susac, Matt Duffy, Jackson Williams, Edwin Escobar, Hunter Strickland, Chris Dominguez, Gary Brown, Brett Bochy and Chris Heston. The Flying Squirrels alumni to debut in the majors last season were Erik Miller (2023 Flying Squirrels), Landen Roupp (2022-23), Kai-Wei Teng (2022-23), Nick Avila (2022), Randy Rodriguez (2022-23), Mason Black (2023), Gerson Garabito (2021), Spencer Bivens (2023), Raymond Burgos (2023), Hayden Birdsong (2023-24), Parker Dunshee (2023), Grant McCray (2024), Sandro Fabian (2021) and Trevor McDonald (2024). Christian Koss (2024) made his debut for the Giants earlier this week as the first new former Flying Squirrel in the majors this year. Dating back to 2022, 23-of-the-last-26 Flying Squirrels alumni who have reached the majors have debuted with the San Francisco Giants, with Garabito (Rangers), Fabian (Rangers) and Dunshee (Braves) being the only exceptions. The 2023 season saw 10 former Flying Squirrels players debut in the big leagues, including a team-record five from that season's Richmond roster.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Jairo Pomares is ranked tied for second in homers (2), tied for third in hits (6), fourth in total bases (13) and eighth in SLG (.619). Victor Bericoto is tied for first in walks (6). Jack Choate is ninth in strikeouts. Will Bednar is third in strikeouts (8). Nick Garcia is tied for first in games pitched (3). Seth Lonsway is tied for sixth in WHIP (0.40).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Joe Whitman** (No. 10), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 13), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 16), **Trent Harris** (No. 26), **Aeverson Arteaga** (No. 27) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). There are also six players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1957: The Richmond Virginians beat the New York Yankees, 6-5, at Parker Field in front of 10,469. Pinch-hitter Neal Waltington hit a walk-off single in the ninth for Richmond. Mickey Mantle hit a two-run homer to left-center in the first. Harry Chiti and Gordon Windhorn homered in the bottom of the first to give the Vees a 4-2 lead. Andy Carey singled in a run in the fifth to pull New York within one. In the seventh, Hank Bauer tied the game, 4-4, with a solo homer. The Yankees took a 5-4 lead in the eighth after an error, a Yogi Berra single and a Bill Skowron sacrifice fly. Jim Coates pitched six innings and struck out five for Richmond. **1958**: The New York Yankees beat the Richmond Virginians, 14-2, in an exhibition game at Parker Field. Bill Skowron had three hits, including a three-run homer in the first inning. Mickey Mantle went 2-for-3 with an RBI double in the fourth. **1988**: In his season debut, 20-year-old John Smoltz threw six no-hit innings in a 1-0 Richmond Braves win against the Maine Philles on the road. In front of a crowd of 127 with temperatures in the 30s, Smoltz was removed after throwing 110 pitching in his six innings. Jose Alvarez allowed two hits to finish the shutout. Jeff Wetherby drove in the game's only run in the first inning. **2014**: In 2014, the Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 5-4. Entering the ninth inning, the Curve led, 4-1. With two outs, Tyler Graham hit a two-run double to pull the Flying Squirrels within a run. The next batter, Matt Duffy, singled to bring in the tying run and an error by Altoona shortstop Alen Hansen allowed the walk-off winning run to score. Duffy finished the day with two RBIs. Reliever Austin Fleet worked 4.1 score less innings.
