BAYSOX IN THE 2025 HU-Star Futures Game

Baysox **OF Enrique Bradfield Jr.** and former Baysox **RHP Keagan Gillies** were both selected to play in the 2025 MLB All-Star Futures Game at Truist Park in Atlanta on Saturday, July 12. They represented the Orioles organization in the annual matchup showcasing baseball's best prospects.

In a fitting moment, both players combined for the final out of the game—Gillies induced a fly ball to Bradfield in right-center to seal the win.

They are the 15th and 16th Baysox players, and the first duo in franchise history to appear in the same Futures Game.

Past Baysox participants of the All-Star Futures Game have included Matt Riley (1999), Erik Bedard (2002), Val Majewski (2004), Jim Johnson (2005), Brian Matusz (2009), Zack Britton (2010), Manny Machado (2012), Henry Urrutia (2013), Dariel Álvarez (2014), Chance Sisco (2016), Tanner Scott (2017), Ryan Mountcastle (2018), Adley Rutschman (2021) and Samuel Basallo (2024).

New Hampshire PLAYERS TO WATCH

JULY 29 - AUGUST 3



Trey Yesavage - RHP

As the No. 56 prospect in baseball, Yesavage burst onto the MiLB scene this year. After a stellar collegiate career at East Carolina, he was selected with the 20th overall pick in 2024 by the Blue Jays. He did not appear in games following the draft but came back this year to post a 2.15 ERA in 11 starts between Single-A Dunedin and High-A Vancouver. At the time of print, the Blue Jays' No. 2 prospect is tied for third in Minor League Baseball with 111 strikeouts. While his fastball sits in the low-to-mid 90s, he utilizes his near-seven-foot wingspan to his advantage for great movement on his mix of fastballs, sliders, splitters, and curveballs.

Charles McAdoo-3B

After being drafted by the Pirates in the 14th round in 2023 out of San Jose State, McAdoo spent his first two professional seasons smashing the baseball. In 2024, between High-A and Double-A, he cracked 17 homers while driving in 78 RBI. McAdoo was sent to the Toronto Blue Jays mid-season as part of the Isiah Kiner-Falefa trade. While he hasn't posted the same numbers in New Hampshire, he still possesses substantial power potential. Defensively, he is primarily a third baseman but has been testing the waters at first base this season.

Kevin McGonigle -SS

The 37th overall pick in 2023, McGonigle had no problem making the jump from high school to pro ball. He saw action in Single-A Lakeland weeks after his selection and hit .350 in 12 games. In 60 games in 2024, McGonigle hit .326 with 20 steals, propelling himself to the No. 6 prospect in MiLB. Despite a hamate injury that cut his first full season short, he dominated pitching in High-A West Michigan earlier this year, slugging .648 while driving in 39 runs in just 36 games. This earned him a promotion to Double-A Erie in early July at just 20 years old.

Max Clark - OF

Also a high school selection, Clark ranks just five spots behind McGonigle as the No. 11 prospect in baseball. Selected third overall in 2023, he's posted solid numbers since entering the system. While not known for elite power, Clark hit .279 last year between Single-A Lakeland and High-A West Michigan. His speed and defense remain his standout tools. The 20-year-old has played exclusively in center field as a pro and stole 29 bases in 2024. He received the call to Double-A Erie in the second week of July.

· Roberto Mercado - MANAGER

Roberto Mercado returns for his second season as Chesapeake Baysox Manager in 2025 after completing his first year at the Double-A level last season. Named the 17th manager in franchise history in 2024, he led the Baysox to a 62-75 overall record, oversaw 18 player promotions to Triple-A and coached two former Baysox who would go on to make their Major League debuts in the same season. The New Britain, Connecticut native also managed the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League this past offseason, where he led them to a league-best 18-10 record and a Fall League Championship Game appearance.

Before joining the Baysox, Mercado spent two seasons as manager of the Orioles' High-A affiliate - the Aberdeen IronBirds. He led Aberdeen to a 147-120 record, including an appearance in the South Atlantic League Championship Series in 2022. Mercado received the Cal Ripken, Sr. Player Development Award in 2022 by the Orioles.

Prior to joining the Orioles, Mercado spent 17 years on the coaching staff at New Britain High School in Connecticut and served as Dean of Students for over 18 years.



• Jordie Henry - PITCHING COACH

Jordie Henry enters his first season as Baysox Pitching Coach in 2025 and his third season as a member of the Orioles' system. Previously, Henry served as the pitching coach at High-A Aberdeen where his staff recorded 1,357 strikeouts last season – 2nd-most in the South Atlantic League and 2nd-most in IronBirds franchise history. Before joining the Orioles, Henry was the Director of Pitching at Prime Sports Performance in Baltimore – a private athletic development training facility. He also worked as a pitching coach and instructor at the high school and summer collegiate levels. Henry pitched collegiality for four seasons at Wayland Baptist University.



Josh Bunselmeyer – HITTING COACH

Josh Bunselmeyer returns for his second season as Baysox Hitting Coach in 2025 and his sixth as a member of the Orioles' system. He joined the Baysox as hitting coach in 2024, after filling the same role for the Orioles' Single-A affiliate, the Delmarva Shorebirds, in 2023. He spent the previous three campaigns as a hitting coach in both the Florida Complex League and Dominican Summer League. Bunselmeyer played three seasons in the Independent Frontier League following a collegiate playing career at St. Louis University.

· Chase Sebby - FUNDAMENTALS COACH

Chase Sebby returns for his second season as Baysox Fundamentals Coach in 2025 and his fourth as a member of the Orioles' organization. Before joining the Baysox, Sebby was the fundamentals coach for High-A Aberdeen in 2023. Prior to that, he was a development coach within the Orioles' system in 2022. Sebby played collegiality as a catcher at Cypress College and Ball State.



Calvin Christiansen – DEVELOPMENT COACH

Calvin Christiansen joins the Baysox staff for his first season as Baysox Development Coach in 2025. Previously, Christiansen spent three seasons with Single-A Delmarva as a Minor League technology coordinator and most recently as the team's development coach. He is a 2019 graduate of the University of California, Davis.



Julio Ibarra – ATHLETIC TRAINER

Julio Ibarra returns for his second season as Baysox Athletic Trainer in 2025 and his sixth in the Orioles' organization. Before joining the Baysox, Ibarra spent two seasons as head athletic trainer in Single-A Delmarva and as an athletic trainer in the Dominican Summer League, Born and raised in Venezuela, Ibarra moved to the United States in high school, played college baseball at Pratt Community College in Kansas before finishing his career and earning his degree in athletic training at Texas Weslevan University.



Chris Frasch - STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH

Frosch spent each of the past two seasons as the Strength and Conditioning Coach with the IronBirds and joined his manager, Mercado, in the 2024 Arizona Fall League. 2025 will be the fourth season Frosch has spent in the Orioles' organization following a two-year stint with the Chicago Cubs in the same role. Frosch also spent a year on the strength and conditioning staff at the collegiate level at both Texas Christian and Florida State University. Frosch played baseball at the University of Tampa, where he studied Human Performance.

Fans bringing a dog (service or non-service) into the ballpark must prove their dog is up to date on their rabies shots: either with tags on the dog's collar or via written proof. Service dogs are welcome at any stadium event. Non-service dogs can attend games during Woof Wednesdays and Bark in the Park events.

FIEVATOR

The main elevator to the Luxury Suite Level of the stadium is in the area behind home plate on the 3rd base side of the stadium concourse.

The IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center is located just past the elevators on the 3rd base side of the main stadium concourse. FAN CONDUCT

Anyone trespassing on the field, throwing any object onto the field, using abusive or obscene language or those deemed intoxicated will be subject to ejection from the ballpark and/or prosecution. If you witness a violation of any of these policies, please contact any Baysox Staff Member, Security Officers or the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center.

FIRST AID

Medical care is available at the Patient First – First Aid Office located just past The Tackle Box Gift Shop on the main 1st base concourse.

FOOD & DRINK

Eastern League rules prohibit any outside food or drink to be brought into Prince George's Stadium. Fans with special dietary needs can contact the Baysox offices prior to the game they are attending for special accommodations.

FOUL BALL/BAT ALERT

Please be aware that balls and bats may leave the playing field and can come into the seating area. Always stay alert, both in the seating areas and on the stadium concourse level. If you catch a foul ball, please feel free to keep it.

RATES OPEN

Stadium gates open one hour prior to game time. Times may be adjusted for special events.

LOST & FOUND

You may inquire about lost items or turn in found items at the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center on the 3rd base stadium concourse.

PAGING

The Baysox will utilize the public address system to page a person only in cases of extreme urgency or for a lost child/parent. For emergency assistance, report to the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center on the 3rd base concourse.

Parking for all Baysox home games is FREE

PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

Requests for Birthday, Anniversary and other special occasion announcements must be made online at the Baysox website at least 48 hours prior to the game in which you would like the announcement to be made. Log on to baysox.com and go to the Baysox/Stadium Info drop down menu and fill out the Announcement Request form. There is a \$10.00 charge for each announcement and all proceeds are donated to area charities.

RE-ENTRY POLICY

If you need to leave the stadium and wish to return, please see one of the gate attendants at the main stadium gates to receive a stamp to re-enter the stadium.

KIDS PARK

Bring your little ones for some fun at the Kids Park! Rides on the carousel cost two tickets and other inflatable games cost one ticket. Kids Park Ride & Game Tickets are available for purchase at the Kids Park for \$1.00 each, 6 tickets for \$5.00 or 13 tickets for \$10.00.

SMOKING

Prince George's Stadium is a SMOKE FREE facility. Smoking and Vaping is not permitted within the main confines of the Stadium gates. Smoking is permitted outside of the main stadium gates in the designated area. Please be sure to have your hand stamped and have your ticket stub available to gain re-entry into the stadium.

USHERS

Seating bowl ushers are located throughout the ballpark and are identifiable by their orange staff shirts. They will assist you with seating and can help with questions or concerns.




Nestor German was ready to head back to Aberdeen.

The Orioles' High-A affiliate had just wrapped up a week-long series on May 11 in Lakewood, New Jersey, against the Jersey Shore BlueClaws. But before German could hop on the team bus for the two-and-a-half-hour ride, Aberdeen pitching coach Jeremy Hileman needed him for a brief conversation.

> "Nestor, can you come back to the office?" Hileman said.

German walked in to find both Hileman and Aberdeen manager Ryan Goll there to meet him. The two shared the news to German that he had been hoping for: he was being promoted to Double-A Chesapeake.



to play in Double-A...I was ready. I was waiting [to be promoted] for a long time and it finally happened. I'm excited to be here."

Five days later, German took the field as Chesapeake's starting pitcher in front of 7,241 at Prince George's Stadium for his Double-A debut against the Akron RubberDucks. The 23-year-old did not disappoint. The Orioles No 10 prospect threw 5.2 shutout innings, struck out six, and earned his first Double-A win.

"It was awesome," German said. "I felt the energy from all the people there. Every time I get to go out there and pitch in front of people, it brings me a lot of happiness."



An 11th round pick in the 2023 Draft out of Seattle University, German has quickly ascended to become a top 10 Orioles prospect. In 2024, German split the season between Single-A Delmarva and High-A Aberdeen, recording a 1.59 ERA with 90 strikeouts across 73.2 innings.

"I just took it one day at a time and stayed focused on my process," German said.
"I try to get better every single day and keep working hard."

Since joining the Baysox, German has emerged as one of the best pitchers in the Eastern League in the month of June. His 2.49 ERA ranked eighth in the league, and his 0.74 WHIP was second-best. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for June 10 –15 after throwing six shutout, one-hit innings with six strikeouts on June 13 vs. Harrisburg. He became the first Baysox pitcher this season to receive the honor.


"Being able to compete in the zone has been the most important thing," German said.

Born and raised in Seattle, German stayed close for college, pitching at Seattle University—the same school attended by reigning AL Cy Young winner Tarik Skubal of the Detroit Tigers.

"We've had a couple of conversations," German said. "I'm not very close to [Tarik], but he told me he's available for me. It's awesome to have that support from that kind of guy."

It may only be German's second season in professional baseball, but he has made sure to cherish the journey with his teammates as he looks to climb up the Orioles' farm ladder.

"Getting to meet all these people from different places, connecting with them, and sharing the locker room and life with them because we're together every single day," German said. "Those are probably my most enjoyable experiences so far in minor league baseball."



Aron Estrada

BORN: January 13, 2005 HOMETOWN: Caja Seca, VZ HEIGHT: 5'8" WEIGHT: 150 BATS: Switch THROWS: Right

Aron Estrada is proving that size doesn't matter. At just 5'8", 150 pounds, he flew under the radar when he signed with the Orioles' organization out of Venezuela in 2022 as a teenager.

His first professional season was with the Dominican Summer League in 2022, and Estrada quickly made a name for himself. *In 45 games, he hit .368 and reached base at a .483 clip.* At his size, it is hard to hit for power, but he made up for it with situational hitting, driving in 31 runs.

At the Florida Complex League in 2023, he saw his numbers drop. However, it was just 23 games, a relatively small sample, and he still walked more than he struck out.

A year later, he played in full-season MiLB for the first time at just 19 years old. At Single-A Delmarva, *Estrada hit* .296 and stole 31 bases, which earned him a promotion to High-A Aberdeen at the end of the season. While he went through initial growing pains, 2025 was a different story.

The South Atlantic League is known to be pitcher-friendly. Estrada did not get that memo. This year, he is hitting .278 with 27 stolen bases while driving in 36 runs.

While Estrada doesn't have an elite part of his game, he does many different things well. As a switch hitter, he possesses great bat-to-ball skills from both sides of the plate and has stellar plate discipline. This has culminated in a .381 on-base percentage through his professional career.

Defensively, he has played six different positions. Many believe he is best suited as a second baseman, but Estrada can play anywhere at a serviceable level, meaning he could fill a utility role easily.

Players of his size don't come around often, but Estrada is making the case for himself to continue making his way up the Orioles system.





PLAYER SPOTLIGHT: Daniel Lloyd

Daniel Lloyd's ability to adapt has made him one of the top relievers in the Eastern League.

Following an offseason of adjustments to his pitch arsenal, Lloyd has posted stellar numbers in 2025. He is just one of seven relievers in the league with six or more wins and has posted a 2.31 ERA over 23 appearances.

"It's been great," Lloyd said. "I feel like my mechanics are finally there. I feel like a really good pitcher right now." His adaptability first showed itself in high school, where he played shortstop and third base until his junior year.

"I didn't really start pitching until my senior year of high school," Lloyd said.



Drafted in the 14th round in 2021 out of South Carolina, he spent three seasons in the lower levels of the minors.

In 2024 with High-A Aberdeen, Llyod posted a 5.90 ERA across 11 appearances, including three starts. After being called up to Chesapeake and transitioning into a full-time bullpen role, he's flourished—thanks in part to a revamped pitch mix.

"I added a two-seam slash sinker to my arsenal," Lloyd said. "It's been working really well [paired] with the cutter and sweeper."

This hybrid moves in the opposite direction of his other offerings and allows him to maintain a consistent arm slot.

"I added it during Spring Training," Lloyd said. "[I] usually get anywhere from 15 to 18 [inches of] run—but if we can get more, that would be awesome."

He has also been working on a kick change, a pitch that's grown in popularity across baseball for its late, vertical movement. Unlike a traditional changeup that moves east to west, the kick change drops hard, often inducing swings and misses.

"I started bringing that back towards the beginning of the season," Lloyd said. "I kind of surprised people with it. I like throwing it; it's a hard pitch to throw."

Fellow Baysox pitcher Braxton Bragg has also seen results from adding a kick change to his repertoire this year.

The grip deviates from a normal changeup where all fingers lay flat on the ball. Instead, pitchers spike the middle finger, creating sometimes unpredictable movement.

"It is a hard pitch to keep up because sometimes it'll cut on you, sometimes it will jump, sometimes it will run," Lloyd said. "But honestly, you need to throw it over the middle of the zone and let it do its thing.

Jordie Henry, Chesapeake's first-year pitching coach, has been a valuable resource to the Baysox pitching staff—and Lloyd is no exception.

"We worked with each other last year, and it was awesome," Lloyd said. "He really knows how to talk you through what he's trying to explain. He helps you understand what you need, and we've gotten along very well."

Henry was the pitching coach in High-A Aberdeen last year when many Baysox pitchers, including Lloyd, were there.

With Henry's guidance and retooled arsenal, Lloyd continues to adapt his game, which has paid dividends this year.

"Continuing to do what I can, and control what I can control is all you can ask for," Lloyd said.



ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: Manny Machado



There have been few hitters in this generation as consistent—or as impactful—as Manny Machado. The 2012 Baysox alum etched himself in the record books on July 7, when he smashed his 2,000th career hit against the Diamondbacks. The line drive, which bounced off the shortstop's glove, made him just the 298th player in Major League history to accomplish the feat.

He is also just the 12th player in MLB history to reach 2,000 hits and 350 home runs by age 32. Many believe it's not a question of if he reaches the Hall of Fame, but when. Some expect him to earn induction on the first ballot.

Drafted third overall by the Orioles in 2010, Machado sped through the lower levels of MiLB. He played 109 games for the Baysox in 2012, hitting .266 with 12 home runs. Primarily a shortstop at the time, he was known for elite defense, but was eventually moved to third base.

In August of that year, Machado was called up directly from Double-A to Baltimore at just 19 years old, joining the Orioles in the thick of a playoff race. The team finished 93–69, earning an AL Wild Card spot. They beat Texas in the Wild Card game and pushed the Yankees to five games in the ALDS. Machado hit a home run in the top of the fifth inning of Game 3, his first of many postseason blasts.

Over his seasons in Baltimore, he hit 162 home runs and ranked tenth in Orioles franchise history with a .487 slugging percentage. He helped lead the O's to the playoffs three times, while earning four All-Star selections and two Gold Glove awards during his tenure.

In July 2018, during his contract year, Machado was traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers. He helped the team reach the World Series, where they ultimately fell to the 108-win Boston Red Sox.

That offseason, he hit free agency and signed a 10-year, \$300 million deal with the San Diego Padres. He has continued his Hall of Fame trajectory in Southern California. Machado is the Padres' all-time leader in home runs and ranks in the top five in franchise history in at-bats, hits, runs, and RBI. He led the Friars to postseason success in 2022 when they beat the Dodgers in the NLDS. In that series, he went 5-for-14 with a home run.

Now 33, Machado remains one of the defining stars of this era, and he doesn't appear to be slowing down. With a Hall of Fame trajectory, the sky is the limit for what other milestones he will reach.
