We are so grateful you chose to attend today's game, and I wish to express my gratitude and thanks to you, as well as the city of Jacksonville, Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia, because without you, all these extraordinary moments, attendance records, awards and recognition across the country never would have happened. Like always, it is our pledge to offer our fans the same great Affordable Family Fun that has marked Jumbo Shrimp baseball over the years. Over the span of 75 fun-filled home dates this season, the Jumbo Shrimp have planned 25 fireworks dates, 21 giveaways, five free Military Appreciation Nights, five Forever Vets Animal Hospital Canines and Crustaceans Dog Days (plus one Cat Day) and a number of other fun and memorable theme nights that provide entertainment to fans of all ages and backgrounds. INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES TICKET PACKAGE ON SALE NOW VyStar Ballpark to host best-of-3 ILCS Sept. 23-25; package includes playoff T-shirt

With Jacksonville gearing up for its first home playoff baseball games in 11 years, the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp are rolling out an International League Championship Series playoff ticket package that includes tickets to each game at VyStar Ballpark, as well as a commemorative Jumbo Shrimp postseason T-shirt.

For just \$65 (including fees, dugout reserved sections at VyStar Ballpark, 102-113) or \$55 (including fees, field reserved sections at VyStar Ballpark, 101, 114-117), fans receive a ticket to the first two games of the potential best-of-three ILCS to watch Jacksonville try to win its first league title since 2014 and the city's first International League championship since 1968, as well as a Jumbo Shrimp playoff T-shirt. Should the ILCS reach a decisive third game, fans who purchase an International League Championship Series package would receive a ticket to that game for free in the same seat as the first two contests.

As first half champions, the Jumbo Shrimp have earned home field advantage for the International League Championship Series and will host the winner of the IL's second half. Game 1 is slated for Tuesday, September 23, with Game 2 following on Wednesday, September 24. If necessary, Game 3 will be played on Thursday, September 25.

This will mark the 24th postseason appearance in Jacksonville's Triple-A (1962-68, 2021-present)/Double-A era

(1970-2020). Should the Jumbo Shrimp win the ILCS, they would advance to play the winner of the Pacific Coast Championship Series in a winner-take-all single-game Triple-A National Championship, played at Las Vegas Ballpark on Saturday, September 27. The Las Vegas Aviators (Triple-A, Athletics) clinched the Pacific Coast League First Half Championship.

Jacksonville's last trip to the postseason came in 2017, when the Jumbo Shrimp were members of the Double-A Southern League. The Jumbo Shrimp were swept 3-0 by the Pensacola Blue Wahoos, then an affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds, but now the Miami Marlins' Double-A affiliate. Jacksonville went from the Marlins' Double-A affiliate to their Triple-A affiliate upon rejoining Triple-A in 2021.

Jacksonville has won seven league championships in the city's Triple-A/Double-A era (1962-present). The 1968 Jacksonville Suns won the International League, the city's final year in Triple-A until 2021. The Double-A Suns won Southern League titles in 1996, 2001, 2005, 2009, 2010 and 2014.

There is a strong argument for the 27th out in baseball being the most difficult to record. It is subjective, as any out in a ballgame could turn out to be the most difficult to earn by the end of the contest. Several factors could be in play to make one out more difficult than another, but when a pitcher is searching for No. 27, the stakes are higher as the batter at the plate could be the final out of the game.

Jacksonville pitcher Seth Martinez has been a frequent face out of the bullpen this season. Martinez has been pitching late in games almost the entirety of the 2025 campaign for the Jumbo Shrimp. He has also found himself coming out of the pen in the later innings at the major league level as well over his career.

Over 60 percent of his big-league work has occurred in the seventh inning or later and in his career. The Arizona native has faced more hitters in the eighth inning than any other inning.

It is safe to say that Martinez has faced some pressure in his outings, especially when he pitched in the majors for the Houston Astros. Every outing for the right hander at the big-league level occurred with the Astros between 2021 and 2024. The Astros made two World Series appearances during this time and Martinez helped them win the Fall Classic in 2022.

One of his teammates during his tenure with the Astros was Ryan Pressly, a veteran right-handed pitcher with over 100 saves between three different

teams. Pressly, who secured the 27th out in Game 6 of the 2022 World Series, acted as a mentor to Martinez and others, giving advice on how to navigate stressful appearances in the pursuit of winning a championship. Martinez, because of Pressly's wisdom, now views high pressure situations as a privilege and that it is still okay to be nervous.

"When you're set in certain situations that have a lot riding on it, Ryan Pressly would always say, 'It's a privilege to have this pressure," said Martinez.

"You're not supposed to be super comfortable in those situations. Yes, you can be scared of failure. But, I think the way he (Ryan Pressly) would combat that is he would just face the fear head-on. So, I think that's

one big thing that I learned was it's normal to be a little nervous or thinking about the worst possible situations."

The man responsible for putting Martinez in those situations for the majority of his big-league career was Dusty Baker, a three-time Manager of the Year and one of just 13 skippers to surpass 2,000 career MLB wins.

Baker is known for being a character and he was also a successful player before transitioning to manager. He valued the importance of getting to know his players individually. Baker also understood that his players should have a relationship with each other both on and off the field. He would often invite his

players on trips and out for dinner. Martinez was one of the many players invited to join.

"I think the coolest thing about him was just the things he would do off the field, like, Spring Training, he'd take a bunch of the guys fishing out in Florida," said Martinez. "We'd have little hangouts during Spring Training at one of the players houses and Dusty would come out and just talk and hang out with the guys and crack jokes and tell stories."

These activities helped the Houston coaches and players build trust with Martinez, another reason as to why he finds himself in pressure situations. His change in approach and strong relationships were major reasons as to why Martinez won a World Series ring in 2022.

While he is no longer with Houston and Dusty Baker is no longer his manager, Martinez still values the advice and relationships from his Astro years. His success has transferred over as Jacksonville manager David Carpenter continues to pitch Martinez in high-leverage situations. Jacksonville secured a First Half Championship in the International League, and if Martinez is called upon during the postseason, he will always remember that the pressure he feels is not a burden, but a privilege.

Bragan Field at VyStar Ballpark, which opened in 2003, is one of the premier Minor League ballparks in North America.

The ballpark was the first completed project of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Featuring an old-fashioned design, brick facade and a grass seating berm, VyStar Ballpark reminds fans of the days of yesteryear and preserves all of the wonderful tradition baseball has to offer. The vivid sight lines capture the action up-close while providing fans with comfortable seating and easy access to concessions and restrooms.

VyStar Ballpark features 12 luxury skyboxes, four skydecks, and a one-of-a-kind Tiki Terrace at the left field corner. It also has an HD videoboard and LED fence display in left field and two ribbbon displays along the baselines of the suite level

In 2016, owner Ken Babby invested \$1.8 million into the ballpark to add a new groups area directly behind the home bullpen, a Tiki Terrace near the left-field foul pole, renovations to all 12 private suites and expansion of the suite-level, third-floor lounge to give all fans a climate-controlled space to overlook the playing field.

In conjunction with the City of Jacksonville and ASM Global, the Jumbo Shrimp announced in 2024 a \$31.8 million publicly-funded renovation plan to VyStar Ballpark as part of Project NEXT. The project added a new office structure and seating experience in right field, a new fan-friendly main gate in center field and a new premium space area behind Homeplate. Project NEXT is the first major renovation to the ballpark since its opening in 2003.

The ballpark features nearly 6,000 stadium-style chairs and had accommodated more than 11,000 fans. Ballpark is also completely wheelchair accessible, including the dugouts, camera wells and playing field.

The ballpark has hosted three Major League Baseball exhibitions (2006, 2010, 2015), four ACC Baseball Tournaments (2006-09) and two Southern League All-Star games (2003, 2013). The 2013 Southern League All-Star game boasted a league-record 9,373 fans in attendance.

Since 2007, VyStar Ballpark has hosted a game in the annual college baseball series between in-state rivals, Florida State and Florida. The annual installment brings capacity crowds to VyStar Ballpark for their storied rivalry.





HOW TO KEEP SCORE



BASEBALL BASICS: HOW TO KEEP SCORE

DIFFERENT FANS have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method:


If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a =" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score. (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes.)

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.



Right place, right time is a saying that's been around for a long time and some people live it first-hand. For Jacksonville southpaw John Rooney, being at the right place at the right time put him on the map.

A lot of high school and college prospects attempt to play summer ball and catch on with some notable leagues to garner attention of college and professional scouts. Some will play for USA baseball, others will play at Perfect Game showcases among other leagues and showcases. Some families will travel coast to coast to get their kids notoriety.

"Me and my family knew I had talent, but we didn't really know how to go through the process." said Rooney. "We always went by the idea of, if you're good, they'll find you."

Rooney grew up in Melrose, New York, playing on the fields at Chapko Stadium. Although he did receive an offer to play at Siena College, he wanted to branch out and try to get out of his home

town for college. Although he didn't find a notable league to play in to get the attention of scouts and land a potential offer, he found a path on his own that is vastly different from the norm.

"An opportunity came up that wasn't for college at all, it was just to have fun playing in the summer," Rooney said. "The Albany Twilight League was a men's league, and I got picked up to play for a state title for a men's league and I was 16 or 17. They were guys that just got off work and wanted to play ball because they love the game. One guy that was on a team we played against was a retired Yankees pitcher."

It was in the Albany Twilight League where Rooney shined and made his mark, against players that were more mature and more seasoned.

In a league and a stadium that were off the beaten path, Rooney was discovered almost like a needle in a haystack.

"Hofstra University was at the game doing some fundraising and they saw me pitch against these men that just got off work," said Rooney. "I was doing well, striking them out and getting the job done. They said this kid doesn't look anywhere close to their age, who is this kid?"

Within two weeks, Rooney went on a visit and signed a commitment to play for Hofstra.

"I threw seven innings, and I just wanted to have fun," he said. "Instead, it ended up getting my life on the path to this point through Hofstra."

Being one of the youngest players in that men's league, Rooney learned a lot from his teammates and matured just being around them. He then went on to pitch for three seasons for the Pride. In 2018, he posted an 8-2 record with a program-record 108 strikeouts and a 1.23 ERA in 95.0 innings to earn Colonial Athletic Association Pitcher of the Year (Hofstra's first-ever recipient) honors and be named a second Team All-America selection by *Baseball America*. For he efforts, Rooney was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the third round of the 2018 draft.

He spent six seasons with the Dodgers organization, and the closest he's ever pitched professionally

to his family in New York came in 2018 when he was a part of the Great Lakes Loons.

Finally, Rooney returned to the state of New York for the first time as a professional baseball player this season with the Miami Marlins' organization. He struck out three batters in 1.1 innings of relief work against the Syracuse Mets.

That was the first time he pitched professionally in front of his family and just a few hours away from where he grew up and where this whole journey began, on a field, in the middle of the woods as a 17-year-old teenager pitching against grown men in the Albany Twilight League. He was in the right place at the right time.





JOE MACK SELECTED TO MLB ALL-STAR FUTURES GAME

Mack (left) started at catcher in a game won by the National League Futures, 4-2

Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp catcher Joe Mack was selected to a part of the 2025 MLB All-Star Futures Game on July 12.

Mack started the game at catcher for the National League who pick up a 4-2 win over the American League squad. He caught the first three innings and struck out in his only plate appearance.

Mack is the first Jumbo Shrimp to be selected for the MLB All-Star Futures Game since right-handed pitcher Sixto Sánchez in 2019. Current Jacksonville infielder Devvison De Los Santos was selected last season when he was a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

A native of East Amherst, N.Y., Mack began his 2025 season with Double-A Pensacola, batting .318/.464/.614/1.078 with four doubles, three home runs, five RBIs and 12 runs scored. He was transferred on April 22 to Triple-A Jacksonville. Mack was a key cog in the Jacksonville's International League First Half Championship. The 22-year-old is hitting .240/.308/.350/.657 with six doubles, one triple, four home runs, 24 RBIs and 22 runs scored in 49 games as of June 30.

Mack was selected in the first round of the 2021 draft by the Miami Marlins out of Williamsville East High School. He made his Marlins organizational debut that season, playing 19 games, adding 44 additional games to his total in 2022. Mack's first full season of games was in 2023, when he played in 120 for High-A Beloit. He drove in 36 RBIs and recorded 19 extra-base hits.

In 2024, Mackspent his campaign between High-A Beloit and Double-A Pensacola. He hit .252/.338/.468/.807, crushing 24 home runs and recording 78 RBIs. His defense excelled as well, as Mack earned the 2024 Minor League Rawlings Gold Glove Award. He was the third player in Pensacola Blue Wahoos' history to receive the award.
