**WEATHER WOES:** This year the TinCaps have had 8 games postponed by rain, 2 delayed, 2 called early, 1 suspended, and 1 canceled.

**MAKE-A-WISH:** Last Friday, in partnership with the Make-A-Wish Foundation, the TinCaps hosted **Marshall**, a 6-year-old from Fort Wayne who's been fighting Leukemia, a blood cancer. Wearing a customized team jersey, Marshall joined the team for batting practice, played catch with pitcher **Efraín Contreras**, brought out the team's lineup card to the umpires with manager **Brian Esposito**, joined the team's TV broadcast, and enjoyed that night's fireworks show with his parents and brother.

**ROSTER TURNOVER:** The TinCaps are up to 27 position players and 31 pitchers this season, for 58 total. (Franchise record: 63 in 2016.)

**JARRYD DALE:** Ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in the Midwest League in games played (109), 5<sup>th</sup> in walks (64), and 9<sup>th</sup> in stolen bases (25).

**LUCAS DUNN:** Made his TinCaps debut here on May 31 after a promotion from Single-A Lake Elsinore. Dunn hit 2 homers in his first 5 games here. He's hit 2 in 60 games since, with his last coming July 23 at Dayton.

**CARLOS LUIS:** Had reached base safely in each of his first 13 games as a TinCap until Tuesday.

**AGUSTÍN RUIZ:** Since Aug. 14 (over 7 games), leads the team in slugging (.654) and RBIs (5) with 2 homers, 1 triple, and 3 doubles.

**JUSTIN FARMER:** Ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in Minor League Baseball in walks (95), trailing only the Loons' **Austin Gauthier** (97). In the big leagues, the Padres' **Juan Soto** has 39 more walks than anyone else (108).

**ANTHONY VILAR:** Has batted safely in six straight games (excluding an appearance in which he did not register a PA). Over his last seven games Vilar is batting .421/.522/.526 (1.048 OPS) with two doubles.

**LITTLE LEAGUE DREAMS:** Manager **Brian Esposito** played in the 1991 Little League World Series, representing Staten Island, New York. He was little league teammates with **Jason Marquis**, who went on to become an MLB All-Star pitcher. They reached the U.S. title game.

**PATIENT:** The TinCaps lead the MWL in walks drawn (4.5 per game).

**CAUGHT 'EM:** The TinCaps are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the MWL in throwing runners out trying to steal (42 CS). **Brandon Valenzuela** leads the league with 27, while **Anthony Vilar** has nabbed 12, and **Adam Kerner** has caught 3.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** The TinCaps are 34-19 when scoring first (64% win rate) and 11-49 when they don't (18%)... Fort Wayne is 13-15 in 1-run games, 7-16 in 2-run games, and 1-3 in extra-innings.

**260 TO THE SHOW:** Since Fort Wayne's franchise was established in 1993, there've been 208 alumni who've gone on to appear in the majors, including 54 this season... The alumni list features 5 players who were selected to this year's MLB All-Star Game: Dodgers shortstop **Trea Turner** (2014), Mariners first baseman **Ty France** (2016), Braves starting pitcher **Max Fried** (2013-14), Cardinals starting pitcher **Miles Mikolas** (2010), and Pirates reliever **David Bednar** (2016-17).

# More News, Notes & Season Storylines

**TRADE DEADLINE:** 4 TinCaps were traded by the Padres. In Monday's trade for Brewers closer **Josh Hader**, starter **Robert Gasser** was dealt. Tuesday, outfielder **Robert Hassell III** was sent to Washington in a deal to acquire **Juan Soto** and **Josh Bell**. Outfielder **Corey Rosier** and infielder **Max Ferguson** were traded to Boston, too.

**TRADE DEADLINES LOSSES:** Among qualifying players in the Midwest League, **Robert Hassell** ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in average (.299) and RBIs (55), 9<sup>th</sup> in OBP (.379), and 10<sup>th</sup> in OPS (.846). His 134 wRC+ ranked 9<sup>th</sup>... **Robert Gasser** ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in strikeouts (115) and 9<sup>th</sup> in ERA (4.18) and WHIP (1.26)... **Corey Rosier** led the league in runs (69) and triples (8), while ranking 4<sup>th</sup> in steals (33), 6<sup>th</sup> in walks (54), and 8<sup>th</sup> in OBP (.381)... **Max Ferguson** was 5<sup>th</sup> in MiLB in steals (55).

**AN EARLY SIGNIFICANT TRADE:** When the Padres announced Fort Wayne's initial roster on April 2, it included infielder **Euribiel Angeles**, who was San Diego's No. 12 prospect. However, the following day, he was traded to the A's as part of the return for big league starter **Sean Manaea**. Angeles is now with Oakland's Midwest League affiliate, the Lansing Lugnuts.

**HOT START:** The TinCaps began the season 10-5, marking the first time the team had been 5 games overall above .500 since June 2016.

**A HOME RUN TO REMEMBER:** On April 23 at Lansing, outfielder **Joshua Mears** hit a home run that traveled 504 feet, according to TrackMan. For perspective, since MLB began tracking home run data in 2015, there has been only 1 HR hit further in a big-league game (**Nomar Mazara**, who's now with the Padres, hit a 505-foot homer with the Rangers in 2019).

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Outfielder **Joshua Mears** was named the Midwest League's Player of the Week by MiLB.com on April 25. In 6 games the week before at Lansing, he led the league with 5 homers and 10 RBIs, while posting a .368 average and 1.718 OPS... He was also named to MLB.com's Prospect Team of the Week.

**SNELL REHAB:** On April 28, Padres starting pitcher **Blake Snell** rehabbed with the TinCaps at Parkview Field against the Dayton Dragons. The left-hander, who was an American League All-Star with the Tampa Bay Rays in 2018, when he also won the AL Cy Young Award, threw 4 scoreless innings with 4 strikeouts, yielding just 2 singles and a hit batter. Snell, recovering from a groin injury that occurred on April 10, joined the 'Caps while San Diego was in the midst of a midwest road trip at Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, and Cleveland. Fort Wayne and San Diego have been affiliated since 1999, but this marked the 1<sup>st</sup> time a Padres pitcher rehabbed with the TinCaps. In fact, he's the first ever Padre to appear in Fort Wayne, as previous Padres rehabbers (**David Eckstein** in 2010 and **Everth Cabrera** in 2013) played on the road.

**WHAT'S BREWING:** In partnership with Fort Wayne's *Hop River Brewing*, the TinCaps announced in May their first ever branded beer, "1301 Brewing," which is a play on Parkview Field's address of 1301 Ewing Street. The canned summer lager is only available at the ballpark.

**COLTS AT BAT:** On May 19, the TinCaps hosted their annual Colts At Bat Night, featuring an appearance by running back **Nyheim Hines**, along with Blue the mascot, and Colts Cheer. They signed autographs for fans and threw out ceremonial first pitches. After his pitch, Hines even did his patented flip in the air touchdown celebration.

**DAISIES THROWBACK NIGHT:** On May 21, the TinCaps celebrated the Fort Wayne Daisies of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League (AAGPBL). The team wore special jerseys, modeled after what the Daisies once wore, that were auctioned off, with proceeds benefitting a project to improve a monument honoring all former players at Memorial Park. The team has partnered with Fort Wayne's Parks and Recreation Department to fund raise. The most special part of the night was recognizing 5 AAGPBL alumni, including 3 women who played for the Daisies, as well as the relatives of other former players.

**STRIKE OUT THE STIGMA:** The TinCaps hosted their first Mental Health Awareness Night on May 28. The team wore special jerseys this night which were auctioned off to support Fort Wayne's local chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illnesses (NAMI).

**TRIPLE PLAY:** On June 3, the TinCaps won at Great Lakes, despite running into a triple play in the top of the 9<sup>th</sup> when 3 runners were tagged out on a **Matthew Acosta** single with runners at first and second... Coincidentally, the last time the 'Caps had hit into a triple play was also against the Loons. That happened at Parkview Field on May 29, 2011. Great Lakes center fielder **Joc Pederson** (a fantasy football player who's since become an MLB All-Star and 2-time World Series winner) caught a line drive and threw to second base to double-off another future major leaguer, **Rymer Liriano**. Yet another budding big leaguer, **Rico Noel**, tried to tag from third, but was thrown out at the plate... Also of note, the Loons' left fielder that game was **Preston Mattingly** (son of Don), who last fall was hired by the Phillies to be their Director of Player Development, after previously working for the Padres... Meanwhile, the only triple play Fort Wayne has turned, incredibly, occurred in the franchise's first ever game on April 10, 1993, at Waterloo.

**PITCHERS OF THE WEEK:** On June 13, **Brandon Komar** was named the MWL Pitcher of the Week. The righty pitched 9 scoreless innings with 1 hit, 1 walk, and 8 strikeouts, including a spot start against Lake County. He extended a Midwest League-best 21.2 innings scoreless streak... On June 20, **Robert Gasser** followed as MWL Pitcher of the Week. He book-ended a series in Lansing with winning performances, combining for 12 scoreless innings. That included 7 no-hit innings on June 19, as he walked one and struck out eight.

**RECORD DAY:** Fort Wayne matched a franchise record on June 19 at Lansing with 22 hits. This is the 30<sup>th</sup> year of the franchise. The only other time Fort Wayne accrued 22 hits in a game was April 29, 1998, also at Lansing... Meanwhile, Sunday marked a season-high for runs scored, too, and the team's largest margin of victory since 2018.

**CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR:** On June 18 at Lansing, the TinCaps trailed 4-0 with 2 outs in the top of the ninth inning. Fort Wayne, improbably, rallied to take a 5-4 lead in that game, only to see the Lugnuts walk off in the home ninth, 6-5... On June 24, the TinCaps trailed Great Lakes, 5-0, in the eighth inning. The 'Caps tied that game in the ninth, but lost, 10-6, in 10 innings... On July 7, Fort Wayne erased an 8-0 deficit at home against Lake County, only to lose, 11-10 in 13 innings.

**LONG NIGHT:** The July 7 game against Lake County took 4 hours and 15 minutes. That was the longest game for the TinCaps since a 4 hour and 19-minute game at Great Lakes last Sept. 1 (11 innings). The last time a game went 4 hours and 15 minutes at Parkview Field was April 17, 2017 vs. West Michigan... July 7 was also the first time the TinCaps played a game that took more than 12 innings since MiLB instituted a rule change in 2018 with extra-inning frames beginning with a runner at second base. The team's last 13-inning game was June 6, 2017, also against LC.

**GLOBAL GAME:** This season the TinCaps have had players from the following countries outside of the U.S.: Australia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Taiwan, and Venezuela... Broadcaster Ben Shulman is from Canada.

**LEAGUE NAME:** In March, Minor League Baseball announced the return of the historical names for the 11 leagues that comprise the player development system for MLB's 30 clubs, including the Midwest League, which in 2021 was known as High-A Central... The Midwest League was originally founded in 1947. Notable alumni from what is now a 12-team circuit include **Trevor Hoffman**, **Greg Maddux**, **David Ortiz**, **Paul Molitor**, **Albert Pujols**, **Alex Rodriguez**, **Mike Trout**, **Joey Votto**, **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.**, **Carlos Correa**, and **Fernando Tatis Jr.**

**SEASON FORMAT:** The format for the 2022 Postseason will consist of four teams in a best-of-3 division series, followed by a best-of-3 championship series... The 4 participants will be the winners of each division from both halves based on the best winning percentage of each half... In the event the same club wins both halves, the club with the next best full-season winning percentage in that division will advance... The first half concludes on **Thursday, June 23**, with the second half beginning on **Friday, June 24**... There is no league All-Star Game.

**PACE OF PLAY:** The average time for a 9-inning game at Parkview Field in 2021 was 3 hours and 14 minutes. So far this season the average time for a 9-inning game in Fort Wayne has been about 2 hours and 31 minutes.

- **PRESIDENT:** Mike Nutter
- **FOUNDED:** 1993 as the Fort Wayne Wizards
- **AFFILIATION:** Minnesota Twins (1993-98), San Diego Padres (1999-present)
- **NAME:** Became the TinCaps in 2009 while moving into Parkview Field from the old Memorial Stadium... TinCaps is a reference to Johnny Appleseed aka John Chapman, who's laid to rest in Fort Wayne and was known for wearing a tin cap on his head
- **MWL TITLE:** 2009
- **MLB ALUMNI:** 207 TinCaps players have gone on to become major leaguers including 2021 NL All-Stars Fernando Tatis Jr. (2017) and Trea Turner (2014), along with two-time Cy Young winner Corey Kluber (2008) ... Other past greats include LaTroy Hawkins (1993), Torii Hunter (1994), and Jake Peavy (2000).
- **BALLPARK:** Parkview Field (2009-present), Memorial Stadium (1993-2008)
- **MASCOT:** Johnny TinCap

#### About Parkview Field

- **BACKGROUND:** In 2007, the Fort Wayne City Council approved the Harrison Square Project to build a new ballpark downtown as well as other amenities.
- **DEBUT:** Opening day for Parkview field took place on April 16, 2009. The TinCaps played in front of a sold-out crowd and beat the Dayton Dragons 7-0. Fort Wayne 3B James Darnell hit the first ever home run, a two-run blast.
- **CAPACITY:** 8,100
- **RECORD CROWD:** 9,266 (July 4, 2019)
- **DIMENSIONS:** 336 feet to the leftfield foul pole, 377 feet to left-center field, 400 feet to straight-away centerfield, 383 feet to right-center field, and 318 feet to the rightfield foul pole.
- **WALLS:** Range from 10 feet tall, from center to right-center field, up to 15 feet tall in the outfield corners as well as a small section of left-center field.
- **MORE THAN BASEBALL:** Parkview Field has hosted hundreds of special events, including concerts such as Florida Georgia Line, Zac Brown Band, and Nelly.
