THINKIN' BOUT THURSDAY: The River Bandits finished the first half on a three-game winning streak, as they shut out Great Lakes 7-0 ... Hunter Owen twirled a gem, leading the way in the shutout effort with a career-high 7.0-scoreless inning with four strikeouts ... AJ Block (1.0 IP) and Natanael Garabitos (1.0 IP) followed suit and completed the final two innings ... Quad Cities plated the game's first runs in the sixth, opening the scoring on Jared Dickey's RBI-single, before Carson Roccaforte blasted a two-run homer for his sixth of the season ... the Bandits finished the night 5-for-14 with runners in scoring position.

FINISHED ON A HIGH NOTE: After picking up a win last night, Quad Cities finished the first half 30-35, avoiding the first sub-30 win first half in club history since at least 2005.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY: With his scoreless effort last night, Hunter Owen became the first River Bandit to complete a 7.0-inning start this season ... Quad Cities had five starts of 7.0 innings in 2023, the last of which was thrown by Mason Barnett on August 1 against Peoria at Dozer Park.

ROCIN' THE MITTEN: After entering this week in an 0-for-13 slump, Carson Roccaforte is 4-for-11 (.364) with a home run and four RBIs in Quad Cities first three games against the Loons.

HOTTER THAN JUNE: Brett Squires leads the Midwest League in hitting during the month of June, posting a .377 average with 11 RBIs and a .921 OPS ... the former Sooner has 10 of his season's 24 multi-hit games during June and has failed to reach base in only one of his month's 15 games.

HE GETS ON BASE: Walking twice last night, Justin Johnson enters the ballgame in the midst of a career-best eight-game on-base streak ... while he's is only batting .200 (4-for-20) during the stretch, Johnson has worked a team-high 10 walks and owns a .469 OBP since June 5.

A BANDIT IN THE HALL: During the offseason, former River Bandit Joe Mauer became just the third catcher in baseball history to be a first-ballot Hall of Famer and was inducted alongside Adrian Beltre and Todd Helton as part of the Class of 2024 ... prior to a 15-year Major League career with Minnesota (which included

6 All-Star selections, 5 gold gloves, 5 Silver Slugger Awards, and 3 batting titles) the 2009 American League MVP spent four seasons in the minor leagues after being selected by the Twins first overall in the 2001 Draft ... with the River Bandits in 2002--his age 19 season--Mauer batted .302 with 23 doubles, 62 RBIs, and a team-high 61 walks, while also throwing out 42% of baserunners who attempted to steal with him behind the plate.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits roster features nine of the Royals top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): **Ben Kudrna** (3), **Frank Mozzicato** (4), **Carter Jensen** (10), **Carson Roccaforte** (16), **Trevor Werner** (19), **Hunter Owen** (21), **Steven Zobac** (23), **Henry Williams** (27) and **Spencer Nivens** (30). The group is the largest number of organizational top 30 prospects on the River Bandits' roster at the same time in the team's four-year history as a Royals affiliate.

A CENTURY AND COUNTING: The 2024 season marks the 101st year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2024 marks the River Bandits fourth season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, 10 River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: Angel Zerpa ('21), Michael Massey ('21), Vinnie Pasquantino ('21), Nate Eaton ('21), Maikel Garcia ('21), John McMillon ('23), Nick Loftin ('21), Logan Porter ('21), Anthony Veneziano ('21), and Will Klein ('21).

MANAGER BROOKS CONRAD

Brooks Conrad manages the River Bandits for the third-consecutive season, his eighth (seventh managerial) in the Royals organization, after managing the Columbia Firefiles in their first year as a Royals affiliate in 2021. The 44-year-old led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization. Conrad was slated to lead Lexington again in 2020 before the MiLB season was canceled. He joined the Royals organization as First Base Coach at Burlington in 2017, before serving as Manager there in 2018.

LAST TIME OUT: Completed his first High-A quality start, shutting out the Beloit Sky Carp through 6.0 innings on June 14 at Modern Woodmen Park ... allowed three hits, and three walks, while striking out two ... threw 48 of 80 total pitches for a strike (60%).

2024: Opened the season ranked No. 5 on MLB Pipeline's list of top 30 Kansas City Royals prospects.

2023: Posted a 3.04 ERA (19 ER in 56.1 IP) across 12 starts with Columbia (A) in his sophomore season, earning a promotion to Quad Cities (A+) on July 2 ... was part of a Columbia pitching staff that posted a 3.19 first-half ERA, the top mark in Minor League Baseball ... made 9 starts with the River Bandits and struck out 45 batters in 36.2 innings (11.1 K/9) ... his 130 strikeouts ranked fourth among Royals farmhands.

2022: Spent his first professional season with Columbia (A), where he recorded 89 strikeouts over 69.0 innings (19 starts).

2021: Graduated from East Catholic High School (Connecticut) where as a senior, he led the Eagles to the 2021 Class M State Championship with a 17-strikeout performance in the title game ... recorded 30.1 consecutive innings without allowing a hit during his senior season, including 4 consecutive no-hitters ... became the fifth Connecticut high school player selected in the first round of the Draft, and was committed to the University of Connecticut before signing with Kansas City and also became the second-highest Connecticut-based prep player selected in the history of the draft, following Bobby Valentine (5th overall to Dodgers in 1968) ... he was the second-youngest player selected in the first round, 6 days older than infielder Carson Williams (28th overall by Tampa Bay).
