RHP OWEN WHITE (0-2, 6.62) vs. RHP Tyler Danish (0-1, 21.60)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque dropped the series opener last night, 6-3, its seventh-straight series opening loss dating back to the final set of 2023 ... The loss also ended the Isotopes twogame win streak, tied for the season high (also: April 17-18) ... Tyler Danish is expected to make his second Isotopes start while Owen White is slated to toe the rubber for Round Rock.

FRANCHISE RECORD: Sam Hilliard belted his 66th homer as an Isotope Saturday—tying the franchise record set by Jordan Patterson from 2016-18.

SWIPES: Albuquerque swiped two bags last night, its 11thstraight game with a steal, setting a new team record, breaking the previous mark of 10 set Sept. 8-19, 2023. They have stolen multiple bases in seven games during the stretch and 13 contests on the year.

BULLPEN: The Isotopes bullpen did not surrender a run for the fourth time this season last night, and first since April 26 vs. Oklahoma City. They have compiled a 1.96 ERA (18.1 IP/4 ER) in the last four contests.

FIRST PITCH DINGER: Derek Hill launched Thomas Ponticelli's initial offering over the wall in left-center last night. It was the first game-opening home run surrendered by the Isotopes since El Paso's Daniel Johnson on Sept. 15, 2023, a 1-0 count. The Chihuahuas Matthew Batten (June 28, 2023) was the last opposing batter to homer on the first pitch before yesterday.

TWO CLOUT GAME: Derek Hill was the fourth player to record a multi-homer contest against Albuquerque in 2024, and third in the last five games. Ryan Ward connected on a pair last Thursday and Sunday for Oklahoma City.

SERIES OPENING LOSSES: The seven-straight series opening losses is their worst streak since June 4-30, 2016 (also seven: at Sacramento, vs. Las Vegas, at El Paso, vs. Reno, at Fresno, vs. Salt Lake. at Sacramento).

TOPES STARTER: Thomas Ponticelli walked four batters, sixth time an Isotopes starter has issued four-plus in a game ... He also allowed three dingers, tying a team season-high (fourth time an Albuquerque starter relented three in a contest.

THREE-BAGGERS: The Isotopes have a Triple-A leading 13 triples on the year (second: 11, Oklahoma City). They've tallied a triple in nine of 28 games.

BY WAY OF THE K: The Isotopes' 278 punchouts on the year are third in Triple-A (most: Norfolk, 287).

HITTING STREAKS: Drew Romo extended his team-leading hitting streak to 16 last night, which is also the longest active streak in Triple-A. The 16 gamer is one shy of the Triple-A season-high set by Oklahoma City's Jonathan Arauz. Meanwhile, Aaron Schunk has a 15-gamer, the second-longest streak in the circuit.

TONY: Drew Romo is five games away from tying a careerhigh hitting streak (21) set in 2021 with Low-A Fresno. During this stretch, he has compiled a .409/.412/.576 slash line with 14 RBI. Yesterday was Romo's third contest driving in multiple runs during the homestand ... He also belted his first Triple-A clout last night, a two-run shot.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk extended his career-long hit streak to 15 contests with a double yesterday. He is slashing .355./406./532 with eight two-baggers, a homer and 12 RBI during the string that began April 10.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia played his first game at Triple-A since Sept. 10, 2023 vs. Reno last night. He went 2-for-3 with a double and walk, extending his on-base streak with the Isotopes to 31 games,

ON-BASE STREAK: Toglia is tied with Mike Tauchman (Aug. 6, 2016-April 9, 2017) for sixth longest on-base streak in club history. Joe Dillon holds the team record at 38, reached from June 26-Aug. 8, 2005.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron has a hit in 15 of 16 games played in 2024 with two mult-hit contests ... Has reached base in all 16 games. Dating back to June 25, 2023, Herron has reached base in 61 of his last 67 ballgames.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes has drawn a walk in five-straight contests, second-longest streak of year (seven, April 12-20) ... Has a walk in 13 of last 16 games.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Coco Montes is 2nd in OBP (.446) and T-2nd in walks (22) ... Sam Hilliard is T-2nd in hits (32), 6th in stolen bases (8), 7th in OBP (.427), T-8th in runs (22) and 8th in average (.330) ... Julio Carreras is T-4th in triples (3).

ROUND ROCK TIES: Jesus Tinoco pitched in 65 games for the Isotopes between 2019-21. Express bench coach Chase Lambin spent the entire 2008 season with Albuquerque, was teammates with Isotopes coaches Chris Michalak and Michael Ryan.

EXIT VELOCITY: Michael Toglia tallied the highest (112.3 MPH, single) and fifth-highest (106.8 MPH double) EV last night.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
