**LAST TIME OUT:** Brooklyn was shut out for the fourth time in 2024 in a 1-0 loss to Rome on Thursday night...The game's only run came on a RF **Stephen Paolini** RBI double in the bottom of the sixth...RHP **Brandon Sproat** took his first loss but was outstanding for the Cyclones...The 23-year-old tossed a career-high 5.2 innings, tying a career-best with eight strikeouts...LF **Omar De Los Santos** swiped a pair of stolen bases...RHPs **Tyree Thompson** and **Elison Joseph** entered out of Rome's bullpen and combined for 4.1 innings of hitless relief, striking out seven...Newcomers RF **Nick Morabito** and C **Chris Suero** collected both of Brooklyn's hits.

**GATOR-ADE:** RHP **Brandon Sproat** has thrived in his first professional season for the Cyclones...After setting a career-high in innings pitched (5.2) and matching a career-best in strikeouts (8) on Thursday, the former Florida Gator enters play on Friday with a 2-1 record and 1.07 ERA (3 ER in 25.1 IP)...Sproat ranks fourth in the South Atlantic League in ERA (1.07), fifth in batting average against (.141), and sixth in strikeout rate (32.4%)...Sproat's 11.72 strikeouts-per-9-innings ratio is also good for third-highest in the SAL among pitchers with 25.0+ innings pitched.

**YOU SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY:** INF **D'Andre Smith** celebrates his 23rd birthday on Friday...The infielder has been on Brooklyn's 7-day injured list since April 13...On the year, Smith is 1-for-11 at the plate with a stolen base and a run scored...In 69 games with the Cyclones over the last two years, the Diamond Bar, Calif. native is hitting .230/.314/.340 with a .655 OPS.

**YIPPEE KI-YAY:** TWP **Nolan McLean** continued his incredible start to his Cyclones career on Wednesday...At the plate, the 22-year-old tied a career-high with three hits and collected a pair of extra-base hits with a double and a two-run home run...On the mound, McLean extended his scoreless inning streak to 13.0 straight by tossing five spotless frames last Saturday vs. Aberdeen, en route to his second victory...Over his previous three starts, McLean is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 13.0 IP), allowing just six hits and three walks (6.82 BB%), adding 16 strikeouts (36.36 K%). On the year, he is eighth in the South Atlantic League in WHIP (0.95) among pitchers with 19.0+ innings...In addition to his success on the mound, McLean enters play on Friday with 11 extra-base hits, tied for seventh in the SAL...The Willow Springs, N.C. native has registered 26 fewer plate appearances (57) than any other player with 11+ extra-base knocks in the circuit and 10 fewer plate appearances with that total across the minor leagues...Among players with 55+ plate appearances, McLean is second in the league in slugging (.611) and ranks eighth in OPS (.909).

**SWIPING THE TOP SPOT:** With a pair of stolen bases off the bench last Thursday afternoon, OF **Omar De Los Santos** (57) became the Cyclones' all-time stolen base king, breaking a tie with UT **Jaylen Palmer** (50)...In 2023, the 24-year-old eclipsed INF **Walter Rasquin's** (32) single-season stolen base record with 37 swipes...Omar is 17 swipes away from tying his previous record and on pace for 88 in 2024...De Los Santos enters Friday's contest 20-for-21 stealing bases to start the season...The 20 swipes are second in the South Atlantic League and third-most throughout the minors...Since the start of 2022, De Los Santos is tied for second across the Minors in steals (127).

**WALK THIS WAY:** 1B/OF **Ryan Clifford** and INF **William Lugo** have accumulated walks in droves in 2024...Clifford's 30 walks are not only the most in the South Atlantic League but are tied for the most in Minor League Baseball...Additionally, Lugo's 24 free passes are tied for third-most in the league...Clifford's 24.8% walk rate is third-best in MiLB, while Lugo's 22.6% mark is good for ninth.

**NICK THE STICK:** INF **Nick Lorusso** has quietly been one of the top hitters in the South Atlantic League in 2024...The Connecticut native picked up two more hits on Tuesday night, adding a double and an RBI...Coming into Friday's matchup, the 23-year-old is tied for second in the South Atlantic League in triples (2), tied for third in doubles (8), tied for fifth in extra-base hits (12), sixth in slugging (.519), and seventh in OPS (.891)...Lorusso is also riding a team season-long eight-game hitting streak...Since April 27, the former Maryland Terrapin is 10-for-30 at the plate, hitting .333/.382/.533 with a .916 OPS...Lorusso has five runs scored, four doubles, a triple, and six RBI in that time.

**WELCOME TO BROOKLYN:** OF **Nick Morabito** has reached safely all three games since making his High-A and Cyclones debut on Tuesday night...Entering play on Friday, the now 21-year-old is fourth in Minor League Baseball in on-base percentage (.504) and batting average (.378), and eighth in wRC+ (194)...At the time of his promotion from Single-A St. Lucie, Morabito led the Florida State League in hitting (.397), on-base percentage (.530), and OPS (1.043)...He was also third in slugging (.513), hits (31), and stolen bases (11), tied for sixth in walks (18), and seventh in total bases (40)...C **Chris Suero**, who also joined the team from St. Lucie, has also reached in all three games played...The 20-year-old was tied for the FSL lead in runs scored (18) by the time of his departure and seventh in OPS (.824), tied for seventh in RBI (15), eighth in on-base percentage (.390), and 10th in slugging (.434).

**COUNTDOWN TO 1K:** After Tuesday's 6-2 win over Rome, the Brooklyn Cyclones are now two wins shy of their 1,000th in franchise history...Brooklyn holds a record of 998-842 (.542) in 1,840 games since 2001...The victory also marked the franchise's 200th since joining the South Atlantic League in 2021...The Cyclones are 200-211 (.487) in 411 games...Brooklyn captured its 900th franchise victory with a 6-5 triumph over Wilmington on August 14, 2022...Brooklyn's very first win came in a 3-2 victory on June 19, 2001, at Jamestown.

**JONAH'S WHALE OF A START:** RHP **Jonah Tong's** stretch of innings to start the year without allowing an earned run came to a close on Wednesday night at 26.0 frames...In seven appearances (five starts) between St. Lucie and Brooklyn, the 20-year-old is 1-0 with a 0.33 ERA (1 ER in 27.2 IP)...Tong is tied with High-A Beloit's LHP **Emmett Olson** (0.33) for the lowest ERA among qualifiers in Minor League Baseball...Entering play on Friday, the Markham, Ont. native is third among qualifiers

**vs. ROME:** Brooklyn opens its only two-week road trip of the season against the Braves' High-A affiliate...The Emperors possess seven of Atlanta's top 30 prospects per MLB Pipeline: RHP **Spencer Schwellenbach** (3), RHP **Owen Murphy** (5), RHP **Drue Hackenberg** (10), RHP **Jhancarlos Lara** (13), INF **Sabin Ceballos** (18), INF **Ambioris Tavarez** (21), and RHP **Lucas Braun** (24)...This marks the first ever meeting between the Rome and Brooklyn franchises since the Cyclones entered the South Atlantic League in 2021...Rome will visit Coney Island from July 23-28.

in MiLB in strikeout rate (43.5%) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk rate (32.4%)...Tong's 47 strikeouts are seventh-most in the minors.

**ATOP THE HEJ-ES:** RHP **Josh Hejka** earned his first save of the season on Sunday afternoon vs. Aberdeen, making his Cyclones' franchise record-setting 48th pitching appearance in the process...The 27-year-old broke a tie with **Hunter Parsons** (47) for the most pitching appearances in Cyclones franchise history...In his 49 career outings for Brooklyn since 2019, Hejka has accumulated a 5-1 record with a 2.64 ERA (23 ER in 78.1 IP) and 4 saves, walking just 18 and striking out 70.

**FEAR THE HAWK:** RHP **Dakota Hawkins** had his 9.1-inning scoreless streak snapped in the fifth inning on Thursday at Rome...The stretch was the longest spotless run by a Brooklyn reliever this year...Among South Atlantic League relief arms, Hawkins is tied for second in the circuit in strikeouts (26)...He is also tied for seventh in innings pitched (17.0) and ninth in strikeout-to-walk rate (6.50).

**LONG ARM OF THE LAW:** RHP **Justin Lawson** has started his 2024 with a bang...The former member of the N.C. State Wolfpack is third in the circuit in saves (4)...Among South Atlantic League relievers with at least 15.0 innings pitched, the 23-year-old leads the circuit in ERA (0.59), WHIP (0.72), and fewest hits allowed (5).

**GOING BACK TO BACK:** The Cyclones shut out the IronBirds for the second-straight day with a 4-0 win last Saturday...RHP **Nolan McLean** (5.0 IP), RHP **Victor Castañeda** (2.0), and RHP **Ben Simon** (2.0) combined on a five-hitter...On Friday, RHP **Brandon Sproat** (5.0), RHP **Jeffrey Colón** (2.2), and RHP **Joey Lancellotti** (1.1) united to one-hit Aberdeen, 2-0...The back-to-back shutouts are the first for the Cyclones at the full-season level and the first since Brooklyn blanked the Connecticut Tigers on the road in both ends of a doubleheader on August 23, 2019...RHP **Michel Otañez** (4.1), RHP **Mitch Ragan** (1.2), and RHP **Josh Hejka** (1.0) united on a 4-0 win in Game 1, while RHP **Dan Goggin** (2.0), RHP **Hunter Parsons** (2.0), and RHP **Jared Biddy** (3.0) led the charge to a 5-0 victory in Game 2...It is also the first for Brooklyn in consecutive nine-inning games since August 21-22, 2014, vs. Staten Island and Tri-City...RHP **Daisuke Matsuzaka** (5.0), LHP **Brad Wieck** (2.0), LHP **Kelly Secrest** (1.0), and LHP **Shane Bay** (1.0) twirled the 'Clones to a 2-0 win over Staten Island in the first leg...RHP **Martires Arias** (5.0), RHP **Gaither Bumgardner** (2.0), and RHP **Cameron Griffin** (2.0) provided the zeroes in a 7-0 rout of Tri-City on the back end...Last Saturday's blanking marked the fifth of the season for Brooklyn's pitching staff...The five shutouts are the most in the South Atlantic League and tied for the second-most in all of Minor League Baseball...The Cyclones set a franchise record with 11 shutouts in 2023.

**KING STANLEY:** With his RBI double in the bottom of the first inning last Friday, OF **Stanley Consuegra** became the first player in Cyclones history to reach the century mark in RBI...The 23-year-old is Brooklyn's all-time leader in several categories, including 67 extra-base hits, 29 home runs, and 101 RBI...On the final day of the 2023 regular season, he broke a tie with C **Francisco Alvarez** for Brooklyn's single-season home run record (23)...Consuegra also surpassed Alvarez (22) for the franchise record in career home runs on August 23 at Asheville...The Dominican native also broke the franchise's single-season record for extra-base hits (42) and tied the mark for RBI (63) set by **Ronny Mauricio** in 2021.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** The Cyclones' offense exploded for seven runs in the bottom of the first in last Tuesday's 9-2 win vs. Aberdeen...They also accomplished the feat in the bottom of the third in a 13-3 win vs. Wilmington on April 24...Brooklyn had 10 consecutive batters reach base with one out in the inning...The seven-run frames are the largest for the Cyclones since they erupted for nine in the bottom of the second inning on July 27, 2023, vs. Wilmington, in an 11-7 triumph...The 13 runs for Brooklyn set a new season high...The Cyclones had not tallied that many in a single contest since a 13-12 win at Asheville in 10 innings on August 24, 2023...It was the first time Brooklyn scored 13+ in a nine-inning game dating back to an 18-1 thrashing at Jersey Shore on August 28, 2022...Since 2005, the Cyclones' highwater mark for runs in a single inning is 10 in the top of the sixth of a 20-6 romp at Bowling Green on May 27, 2022...The 20 runs were also a franchise record.

**AMAZIN' STARTS HERE:** The Brooklyn Cyclones have several Top 30 prospects according to *Baseball America* and MLB Pipeline...The 'Clones have five of the Top 30 per BA: **Ryan Clifford** (No. 6), **Brandon Sproat** (10), **Nolan McLean** (11), **Jonah Tong** (22), and **Calvin Ziegler** (29)...Plus six of the Top 30 per MLB: Clifford (4), Sproat (13), McLean (19), Ziegler (22), **Wilfredo Lara** (23), and OF **Nick Morabito** (26)...MLB Pipeline also considers Clifford the 87th-best farmhand in all of baseball.

Relieved by RHP **Victor Castañeda** to start the top of the sixth inning with the Cyclones leading 4-0...McLean, Castañeda (2.0 IP), and RHP **Ben Simon** (2.0) cominbed on a five-hit shutout, as Brooklyn blanked Aberdeen, 4-0.

**YIPPEE KI-YAY:** On the mound, McLean enters play on Friday riding a 13.0-inning scoreless inning streak...Over his previous three starts, McLean is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 13.0 IP), allowing just six hits and three walks (6.82 BB%), adding 16 strikeouts (36.36 K%)...On the year, he is eighth in the South Atlantic League in WHIP (0.95) among pitchers with 19.0+ innings...In addition to his success on the mound, McLean enters play on Friday with 11 extra-base hits, which is tied for sixth in the SAL...The Willow Springs, N.C. native has registered 30 fewer plate appearances (53) than any other player with 11+ extra-base knocks in the circuit and 14 fewer plate appearances with that total across the minor leagues...Among players with 50+ plate appearances, McLean leads the league in slugging (.660) and ranks fourth in OPS (.981).

**PROSPECT RADAR:** McLean enters the 2024 campaign as one of the top prospects in the New York Mets farm system... The 22-year-old is considered New York's No. 11 prospect per *Baseball America* and No. 19 by MLB Pipeline.

**SPRING BREAKOUT:** The Willow Springs, N.C. native earned the win pitching in relief for the New York Mets prospects in their contest against the Washington Nationals' farmhands on Friday, March 15...McLean came on in support of former Cyclone RHP **Blade Tidwell** in the top of the fifth...The right-hander did not allow a run on one hit, did not walk a batter, and struck out a batter...Tossed only 10 pitches (7 strikes)...Relieved by RHP **Brandon Sproat** to start the sixth in the Mets' 4-2 win.

**COWBOY UP:** The second-year pro had a tremendous career at Oklahoma State before departing...In 2023, McLean served predominantly as a relief pitcher, posting a 1-2 record with a 3.30 ERA (11 ER in 30.0 IP) and six saves, tallying 34 strikeouts...As a hitter, he collected a .250/.379/.532 line with a .911 OPS, nine home runs and 29 RBI...McLean was a Perfect Game/Rawlings Second Team All-American in 2022 and was a member of the Oklahoma State football team as a quarterback in 2020.

**TWO TIMES:** McLean was drafted for the second time last summer, as the New York Mets chose him with the 91st-over-all pick...The right-hander was also selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma State University, but did not sign...Joined teammate RHP **Brandon Sproat** as two of three players selected in the top 10 rounds that did not sign.

**FAMILIAR FACES:** While at the Oklahoma State University, McLean spent the summer of 2021 pitching for the Chatham Anglers of the Cape Cod Baseball League...During that time, the right-hander was teammates with current Cyclones RHP **Brandon Sproat** and former Brooklyn RHP **Kolby Kubichek** and C **Kevin Parada**.
