GAME INFORMATION

LAST TIME OUT - BINGHAMTON 4, ALTOONA 0: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies clinched a series victory over the Altoona Curve on Saturday night and notched their fourth shutout win of the season. **RHP R.J. Gordon** spun 6.0 scoreless frames with five strikeouts. It was the fourth time this season Gordon went at least 6.0 innings and the fourth time he has had a scoreless start. **INF Jacob Reimer** tallied his second three hit game of the season with a two-run single in the second inning to make it 2-0. **OF/C Vincent Perozo** hammered a solo home run in the fourth inning to make it 4-0. **LHP Felipe De La Cruz**, **RHP Brendan Girton** and **RHP Carlos Guzman** all threw a perfect frame in relief.

MITCH'S STICH: **INF Mitch Voit** (Mets No. 4 prospect) has missed the last four games after being hit by a pitch on Tuesday. Over his first 17 games at Double-A: .433 AVG | .531 OBP | .657 SLG | 1.188 OPS | 27 R | 12 XBH | 10 RBI | 6 SB and has eight multi-hit games with two three-hit games. He is riding a four-game hit streak. In the series against Portland, Voit had three doubles and three RBI. Mitch Voit was named Eastern League Player of the Week for August 4-9, earning the honor for the second-consecutive week, after also receiving the award for July 28-August 2. He ranked among Double-A: AVG (1st), OBP (1st), R (1st), H (T-1st), OPS (3rd), SLG (T-8th) and among Minor League Baseball: AVG (2nd) and OBP (T-2nd) that week. The 2025 1st round pick out of the University of Michigan played in 76 games with High-A Brooklyn this year and slashed .242/.349/.396/.745 with 11 HR, 41 RBI and 36 SB. Voit ranked T-5th in all of High-A in stolen bases and 3rd in the South Atlantic League.

RED HOT ROJAS: **INF Jefferson Rojas** (Mets No. 1 prospect) is 7-for-22 (.318) 3 R, 2 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI in five games against Altoona. He has 17 RBI over his first 15 games with Binghamton after he recorded three RBI on Friday night with a two-run home run against Altoona. He tallied his third three-hit game with Binghamton on Tuesday night (3-for-5, R, 2B, HR, 3 RBI) with a two-run home run in the first inning and the game-tying RBI double in the ninth inning. Rojas has six multi-hit games over his last 10 contests and 34 multi-hit games at Double-A this season. Over his first 15 games with Binghamton, Rojas is 17-for-60 (.283), 3 HR, 17 RBI, 8 XBH. Rojas was acquired by the Mets from the Chicago Cubs in a trade for right-handed pitcher Clay Holmes and outfielder Tyrone Taylor on August 3. Rojas now ranks as MLB Pipeline's No. 76 overall prospect and the No. 2-ranked third baseman prospect in baseball. With Double-A Knoxville slashed 270 AVG, .339 OBP, .461 SLG, .800 OPS, 15 HR, 57 RBI, 58 R, 19 2B, 35 XBH, and 17 SB in 91 games.

REIMER REASON: **INF Jacob Reimer** Mets No. 7 prospect has 16 RBI over his first 13 games back off the injured list with Binghamton since being activated on August 4. On Saturday against Altoona, Reimer tallied his second three-hit game and his 15th multi hit game (3-for-4, 2 RBI, SB). Reimer has recorded at least one hit in 10 of his last 13 games and he has six multi-hit games over his last nine contests. Reimer began a rehab assignment on July 14 and played eight games between the FCL Mets, Single-A St. Lucie, and High-A Brooklyn, batting .360 with 2 HR, 6 RBI, 9 R, 3 2B, and 5 XBH.

POWER SURGE: This year, the Rumble Ponies have been live or die by the home run, going 44-31 when they hit a homer and 9-35 when they do not. Binghamton has homered 30 times in August (20 games) and are 17-3 in that stretch. The Ponies have hit multiple home runs in five of their last 12 games and have homered in seven straight games.

MARCO POLO: Over his first 10 games back with Binghamton since retuning from the injured list on August 3, **INF Marco Vargas** is 15-for-44 (.340), 2 HR, 11 RBI, 8 R, 6 SB. Over his last five games, Vargas has 10 hits, with 2 HR, 7 RBI, 6 R and 4 SB. On Wednesday against Altoona, Vargas went 3-for-5, and hit his third Double-A home run with three RBI. On Sunday @ Portland, Vargas chalked up a career-high four RBI and matched a career-high with four hits with a HR. Vargas was placed on the IL on June 1 and began his rehab assignment with the FCL Mets on July 15 before being transferred to the St. Lucie Mets on July 19. He returned to Binghamton on August 4.

SCOREBOARD WATCHING: The Reading Fightin Phis (28-21) sit in first place by 2.5 game in the Northeast Division, and play the final game of a six-game series on Sunday night at 1 p.m. against Portland (25-25) who are 3.5 GB of first place. The Somerset Patriots, and Binghamton are both 2.5 games back. Binghamton plays Portland and Reading each six times over the final 19 games of the season.

METS REHAB DUO IN BINGHAMTON: New York Mets INF **INF Mark Vientos** (right-hand fracture) will play in his second game of the series on this rehab assignment and New York Mets **RHP Justin Hagenman** (rib) has been recalled from Single-A St. Lucie for a rehab start with Binghamton. Vientos, suffered his injury when hit by a pitch from Kansas City Royals pitcher Michael Wacha on July 9, 2026. He is hitting .211 with 11 HR and 35 RBI across 73 games. Vientos hit 25 home runs in 2021 (22 Binghamton, 3 Syracuse) which led all Mets minor leaguers. Hagenman pitched in nine games with the Mets last season and held a 4.56 ERA across 23.2 IP with 23 SO to 2 BB. Also in 2025 the right-hander started in 13 games and made 21 appearances with Triple-A Syracuse with a 5.58 ERA across 69.1 IP. Hagenman was placed on the 60-day injured last with a Rib Fracture on March 14.

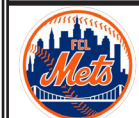

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.
 -Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.
 -Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.
 -He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.
 -Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.
 -Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



25 MARIANO DUNCAN

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.
 -Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.
 -The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



32 MATT CARASITI

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.
 -Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.
 -Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.
 -Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.
 -Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.
 -Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.
 -Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.
 -Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.
 -Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.
 -Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.
 -She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).
 -Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.
 -Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.
 -Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.
 -Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.
 -Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

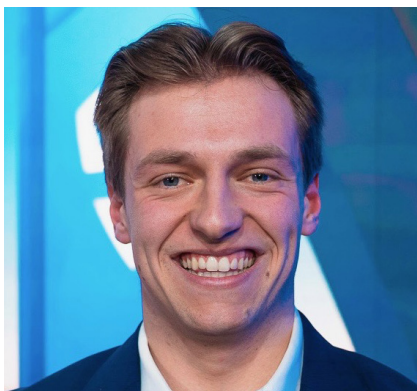


MATT LEVINE *Director of Broadcasting & Media Relations*
