TODAY'S GAME: The Space Cowboys claimed the series last night with an 8-7 triumph, their sixth-straight series win over the Isotopes dating back to Sept. 2022 ... Game one starters are scheduled for a rematch: Albuquerque's Peyton Battenfield and Sugar Land's Blair Henley.

KB: In his fourth rehab game, Kris Bryant went 1-for-5 with an RBI double and two strikeouts, batting second in left field in the second game of his rehab assignment ... In three rehab games, he is 1-for-9 with an RBI and two walks ... Has registered three batted balls in play over 100-MPH (high: 108.9 MPH, lineout to left).

JONESY: Thursday night, Nolan Jones went 1-for-4 with an RBI single and two strikeouts, batting second in left field in the second game of his rehab assignment ... In three rehab games, he is 1-for-9 with an RBI and two walks ... Has registered three batted balls in play over 100-MPH (high: 109.2 MPH, single).

TAKE YOUR BASE: Albuquerque drew seven walks last night, one shy of the season-high set four times.

DOUBLE-DIGIT HITS: The Isotopes have tallied double-digit hits in five of their last six games.

THREE-BAGGERS: Coco Montes collected the Isotopes MiLB-leading 23rd three-bagger on the year Thursday. Tallied a triple in 16 of 44 games.

SERIES: Albuquerque lost its sixth series of the year last night and fifth-straight set at home. It's the longest series losing streak at home in team history. Previous high was three.

ONE-RUN GAMES: Albuquerque fell to 4-6 in one run games and 3-4 at Isotopes Park in 2024 with the 8-7 loss last night (last: 10-9 win, May 2 vs. Round Rock).

TOPES STARTER: Last night Tyler Danish became the fourth Isotope starter to allow at least six runs in an outing against Sugar Land this year (also: Peyton Battenfield, nine, May 14; Karl Kauffmann, eight, April 10; Thomas Ponticelli, seven, April 13).

VS. SUGAR LAND: The Space Cowboys have won 23 of their last 30 games in the Duke City, producing double-digits in runs on 15 occasions during the stretch.

BIG INNING: Albuquerque relented five runs in the second last night, the 15th time the club has allowed five-plus runs in a frame.

LOB: Isotopes left 10 on-base last night, the 10th time leaving double-digit runners on (last: May 14 vs. Sugar Land, 12).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes collected a single last night to extend his hitting streak to six. During that stretch, he is slashing .538/.567/.962 with three doubles, a triple, two homers and 10 RBI.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard recorded two hits yesterday for his 18th multi-hit contest of the year, including belting his 10th dinger of 2024. Has three homers in his last six contests. He also drew two walks in a game for the seventh time this season. Has a hit in 10 of his last 12 games (15x46) with three doubles, a triple, four homers, eight RBI and 11 walks. ... Sits on the Top-10 Pacific Coast leaderboard in 11 categories.

HIS NAME IS DREW: Drew Romo tallied three hits last night for his 16th multi-hit game of the season, third-straight and fifth three-hit contest (last: May 12 at El Paso).

HITTING STREAK: Drew Romo has a seven-game hitting streak (14x30), tied for the second-longest active streak in the Pacific Coast League (longest: Matthew Batten, 11). Since April 20, he is slashing .450/.459/.725 with eight doubles, one triple, four homers and 20 RBI.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk registered two hits and an RBI last night. Has a hit in his last nine starts. During the stretch, he is 14-for-39 with three doubles, a triple, two homers and four RBI.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia has struck out in seven-straight games, totalling 14 during the stretch and batting .200 (6x30). However, he has eight RBI in span.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 1st in average (.382), T-6th in hits (50) and T-10th in doubles (11) ... Aaron Schunk is T-5th in doubles (13) ... Coco Montes is 2nd in OBP (.449), 3rd in average (.362) and hits (54), T-3rd in OPS (1.040) and 6th in total bases (88) ... Sam Hilliard is 2nd in runs (36) and OPS (1.041), T-2nd in total bases (96), T-3rd in XBH (3) and walks (30), 4th in slugging (.615), T-4th in homers (10), 6th in OBP (.426), T-6th in triples (3) and hits (50) and 10th in average (.321) ... Julio Carreras is T-6th in triples (3).

TEAM STATS: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in slugging (.493), total bases (774) and hits (446), 2nd in doubles (101) and 3rd in runs (276.)

OPPOSING STARTER: Sugar Land's starter Ryan Gusto allowed nine hits last night, the third-most surrendered by an opposing starter in 2024 (high: 10, twice).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
