YOU CAN BUY, HE CANCEL: **2B Gabriel Cancel** extended his hit streak to 6 games with a 2-5 performance on Sunday with two doubles. The 6-game streak is the longest of the season for Cancel and is the longest active hit streak on the team. Cancel had back-to-back-to-back 3-hit games (5/5-5/7) and leads the team with four such games while ranking third on the team with a .303 batting average.

FEARLESS FOSTER: **LHP Foster Griffin** earned Sunday's win to move to 3-0 on the season and is on a 6.1 inning scoreless streak on the mound. The last run Griffin allowed was a two-run homer on 4/26 against Toledo. He holds a 2.25 ERA with 16.0 innings pitched over 11 games out of the bullpen this season.

STREAKING: The Storm Chaser's are on a four-game winning streak, the longest so far this season. Omaha beat Columbus four consecutive times after dropping a pair of games to start the series.

HEADING TO IOWA: The Omaha Storm Chasers head to Des Moines, Iowa for a six-game series against the Iowa Cubs, a Chicago Cubs' affiliate. This season, Omaha is 1-4 in series opening games, heading into today's matchup at Iowa. Omaha won 24 of the 40 games between the two teams last season including 15 of 22 games played at Principal Park in Des Moines. The Storm Chasers hold an all-time record of 523-485 against their closest Triple-A rival. The Storm Chasers have won six consecutive games over the Cubs, with Omaha's last loss to Iowa coming on 9/17/21 in Omaha.

STEALIN' BASES: **OF Dairon Blanco** has stolen nine bases this year, ranking fourth in the International League and is the only player in the top five yet to be caught stealing. Fellow Omaha **OF Brewer Hicklen's** eight stolen bases with zero caught stealing is the only other player in the top 12 without getting caught through the first month of the season.

THE MIGHTY THOR: **Scott Thorman** is in his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for **Brian Poldberg**, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlanta on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager **Tommy Shields**, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

FOR OMAHA: **RHP Daniel Mengden** makes his sixth start of the season for the Storm Chasers. He made his season debut and Royals organization debut on Friday, April 8 at Indianapolis, allowing one run on four hits in 3.1 innings with three strikeouts and two walks. In his last outing on Wednesday May 4, Mengden went 3.0 innings, allowing five earned runs on six hits and three walks while striking out only one and getting tagged with the loss. This season, Mengden is 1-0 in relief appearances, earning his only win of the season out of the bullpen on 5/1 against Toledo. He made his Major League debut with Oakland at Cincinnati on June 11, 2016, following his first start at Werner Park on June 5, 2016 with Nashville. Mengden spent the 2021 season pitching for the KIA Tigers in the KBO, posting a 3.60 ERA across 120.0 innings in 21 starts with 104 strikeouts and 35 walks. Mengden enters 2022 with 60 career Major League outings (48 career starts)—all with Oakland from 2016-2020—recording a career 4.64 ERA in 302.2 career innings with 224 strikeouts and 102 walks. A 29-year-old from Houston, Texas, Mengden was originally drafted in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros out of Texas A&M University.

FOR IOWA: **RHP Matt Swarmer** is set to make his third start of the season with seven overall appearances while holding a 2-0 record and 1.93 ERA. In his last outing at St. Paul, Swarmer threw 2.0 innings of relief allowing no runs on two hits, facing the minimum six batters. The Pennsylvania native went to college at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania. He was drafted in the 19th round of the 2016 MLB June Amateur Draft by the Chicago Cubs organization. Swarmer has been at every level of the Chicago Cubs farm system, spending most of the 2021 season with Triple-A Iowa Cubs and making five starts with Double-A Tennessee Smokies.
