Syracuse Mets News and Notes

Hitting Machine: Joey Meneses is hitting .309 (21-for-68) in his first 19 games of 2025 with 13 doubles, 12 RBIs, and seven walks. Meneses's 13 doubles lead the International League with the next closest players at eight. The 32-year-old's strong start to the season comes after Meneses had an excellent winter in the Mexican Pacific Winter League, hitting .320 with 58 RBIs, ten home runs, 14 doubles, and an .896 on-base plus slugging percentage.

Starting Strong: Syracuse starting pitchers rank lead the International League with a 2.70 ERA and the Mets starters have held opponents to a .215 batting average against this season which is third best in the International League. Meanwhile, Syracuse's bullpen ranks 17th with a 5.42 ERA and 13th with a .257 batting average against.

Boom or Bust: Only two of Syracuse's first 20 games has been decided by one run. Every other matchup has been decided by two runs or more. The average scoring margin through the first 20 games is 4.5 runs.

Untimely Hitting: Syracuse is hitting .224 with runners in scoring position this season which ranks 16th in the International League. Syracuse is hitting .195 with runners in scoring position and two outs, ranking 17th. The Mets are hitting .200 (4-for-20) with the bases loaded with 11 RBIs, two walks, and eight strikeouts.

Both Sides of the Ball: Gilberto Celestino's 13-game hitting streak ended on Saturday. Still over his last 15 games, Celestino is hitting .327 (17-for-52) with eight RBIs, three home runs, two doubles, and four walks. Celestino also has two of Syracuse's three outfield assists this season.

Finding a Way: Syracuse beat Buffalo, 2-1, on Sunday which marks the second one-run win for the Mets in 2025. Syracuse began the 2025 season with a one-run win over Worcester, and the Mets are 2-0 this season in one-run games. In 2024, Syracuse had the second-best win percentage in the International League, winning 60% of games decided by one run (18-12 record). Only Rochester with 61.8% (21-13) had a better record in one-run games last year.

Power Surge: In 2024, Luke Ritter tied for third in the International League 26 home runs, ranked second with 93 RBIs, 11th with an .849 on-base plus slugging percentage, tied for fifth with 73 walks, ranked fourth with 63 extra-base hits, and eighth with 80 runs. Ritter's 93 RBIs were a career-high and his 26 homers were one shy of his career high that he set in 2023.

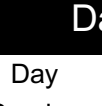
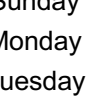
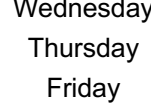
