SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Baysox, 3-2, in the series finale at The Diamond. Richmond took a 2-0 lead in the second inning. **Zach Morgan** hit an RBI single and **Aeverson Arteaga** brought in a run with a groundout. The Baysox tied the score with two runs in the top of the third. Creed Willems brought in the first with a groundout and Silas Ardoin added a sacrifice fly. In the sixth, Frederick Bencosme moved Chesapeake ahead, 3-2, with a sacrifice fly. **Seth Lonsway** started for Richmond and allowed two runs in five innings, striking out four. **Dylan Cumming**, **Nick Garcia** and **Tyler Myrick** each threw a scoreless inning out of the bullpen.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game road series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. The RubberDucks swept a three-game series at The Diamond to open the season from April 4-6. Richmond returns to Akron for a six-game series from July 8-13. The RubberDucks play one more series at The Diamond from August 26-31.

ZEROING IN: The Flying Squirrels held the Baysox scoreless for 21 consecutive innings, from the ninth inning of Thursday's game through the second inning on Sunday. Richmond won, 10-0, on Friday night before a 1-0 shutout on Saturday. Those games marked the eighth time in team history the Flying Squirrels have pitched back-to-back shutouts and the first time since April 2018, also against the Baysox. The Flying Squirrels' streak of 21.1 innings without allowing a run was the fourth-longest in team history. The record is 26.2 innings without surrendering a run from August 28-31, 2016.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 7,347 fans per home game, which ranks second among all 120 MiLB clubs.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 2-4 in last week's home series against Chesapeake after going 2-4 in the previous week's road series at Harrisburg. In the Eastern League, the Richmond offense is second in hits (118), third in batting average (.244), tied for eighth in runs (53), sixth in total bases (166), seventh in doubles (21), 10th in homers (9), tied for ninth in RBIs (45), seventh in walks (52) and first in strikeouts (108 - fewest). The Richmond pitching staff is eighth in ERA (4.11) and seventh in strikeouts (139).

THE RUBBERDUCKS dropped four-of-six last week at Erie, their first series loss of the season. After sweeping Richmond to open the season from April 4-6, they won four-of-six against the Curve in their first homestand of the year from April 8-13. The Akron offense leads the Eastern League in total bases (200), triples (13), RBIs (77), SLG (.414) and sac flies (9). They are also second in homers (14). Akron's roster includes five of Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including 2B Travis Bazzana (No. 1), C Cooper Ingle (No. 7), 1B C.J. Kayfus (No. 8), RHP Austin Peterson (No. 24) and OF Kahili Watson (No. 30). Bazzana is also ranked No. 23 on Baseball America's top-100 prospects list. MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list features four Akron players, including Bazzana (No. 1), Ingle (No. 7), Kayfus (No. 8) and Peterson (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes first professional appearance in his hometown of Akron. Last time out, he allowed four runs over 2.2 innings in a loss on Wednesday at The Diamond against the Baysox. He made his Double-A debut on April 9 at Harrisburg and allowed one run on four hits over five innings, striking out four with no walks. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

WELCOME HOME, JOE: Today's starter **Joe Whitman** returns to his hometown of Akron this week. He attended Hudson High School, about 20 minutes north of Canal Park. In the summer following his senior year, Whitman pitched in a travel ball game at Canal Park, throwing two innings. After two seasons at Purdue, Whitman transferred home to play his final season at Kent State, about 20 minutes northwest of Akron.

BRYCE IS BACK: Northern Virginia native **Bryce Eldridge** returned to the Richmond roster today after missing the start of the season with an injury. The 20-year-old first baseman played at four levels in the Giants organization in his first full professional season last year, including nine games with Richmond in September. For the year in 116 games, Eldridge hit .291 with 23 homers and 92 RBIs. He is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 11 prospect in baseball. Eldridge is also the fifth Virginia-born player to suit up for the Flying Squirrels in franchise history.

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Tommy Mace makes his third start of the season and the seventh of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He was Akron's Opening Day starter on April 4 at The Diamond and allowed one run over five innings. For his career, Mace is 2-1 with a 1.35 ERA (5 ER/33.1 IP) in six starts against Richmond dating back to 2023. Last time out, Mace threw 5.1 innings and allowed a season-high three runs in a loss at Erie on Wednesday. He spent all of 2024 with Akron, going 8-7 with a 3.71 ERA. He finished the year ranked fifth in the Eastern League in ERA, tied for first in games started (27), fourth in innings pitched (145.2), seventh in BAA (.236) and fourth in WHIP (1.22). Mace was selected by the Cleveland Guardians in the second round (69th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of Florida.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey** and **Zach Morgan** have combined to throw out 12 stolen base attempts this season, which leads all 30 Double-A teams and ranks tied for seventh among the 120 MiLB teams. Sugastey leads the Eastern League with seven runners caught stealing, which is also tied for first in Double-A. Morgan is second in the league with five.

ARTY PARTY: After batting .077 (2-for-26) in his first eight games of the season, **Aeverson Arteaga** is batting .400 (10-for-25) in his last seven games since April 13, adding a double, a homer and six RBIs. The stretch dates back to the final game of the road trip to Harrisburg and each game of the last series against the Baysox. His six-game hit streak ended on Sunday, which was tied for the third-longest active hit streak in the league.

PLAY THE HITS: The Flying Squirrels have collected 118 hits through their first 15 games this season, which is the second-most in the Eastern League. The team is batting .244 (118-for-483), which is third-highest in the league. However, the Richmond offense is batting .195 (26-for-133) with runners in scoring position, which is 11th the league.

WHERE DID THESE GUYS COME FROM?: There are players from six different counties on the Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster, including the United States (21 players), Venezuela (2), the Dominican Republic (2), Cuba (1), Panama (1) and Puerto Rico (1). Among the 21 American-born players, 12 different states are represented, including North Carolina (3), Florida (3), Ohio (3), California (2), Michigan (2), Pennsylvania (2), Kentucky (1), Minnesota (1), North Dakota (1), Rhode Island (1), Texas (1) and Virginia. There are 12 players who joined the Giants organization out of the MLB Draft, six were signed as non-drafted free agents, five as international free agents, four who were picked up in trades and one who was claimed in the minor-league phase of the Rule 5 Draft. For 23 players, the Giants were their original affiliated organization and five have played with other major-league organizations.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Victor Bericoto** is fourth in OPS (1.035), tied for fourth in homers (3), tied for fourth in SLG (.596), tied for fourth in total bases (28), tied for fifth in hits (15), tied for fifth in extra-base hits (7), sixth in OBP (.439), tied for seventh in walks (10) and eighth in batting average (.319). **Jairo Pomares** is tied for fourth in homers (3), tied for fifth in extra-base hits (7) and tied for sixth in total bases (27). **Jack Choate** is tied for fourth in strikeouts (21). **Nick Garcia** is tied for fourth in games pitched (6). **Seth Lonsway** is tied for sixth in innings pitched (15.0).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes seven players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bryce Eldridge** (No. 1), **Joe Whitman** (No. 10), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 13), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 16), **Trent Harris** (No. 26), **Aeverson Arteaga** (No. 27) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). There are also seven players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Eldridge, (No. 1), Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27). Eldridge is also ranked No. 11 overall by Baseball America and No. 22 by MLB.com.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1957: The Richmond Virginians beat the Buffalo Bisons, 9-3, at Parker Field. Jim Coates, a native of Farnham, Va., started for the Vees and struck out 11 batters in a six-hit shutout. Three years later in 1960, Coates was an American League All-Star with the Yankees, one of his nine MLB seasons where he also spent time with the Senators, Reds and Angels. **1988:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 4-3, at The Diamond. Jeff Wetherby won the game with a bases-loaded, two-run single in the bottom of the ninth with one out. Tidewater starter John Mitchell held Richmond to one hit through the first eight innings. Trailing, 3-0, entering the ninth, Terry Blocker hit an RBI single and David Justice brought in a run with a sacrifice fly to close the score to 3-2. **1992:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 5-4, in 10 innings at The Diamond. Vinny Castilla hit a two-run homer in the ninth to force extras. He finished the game with three RBIs. Keith Mitchell won the game with a walk-off single. **2004:** The Richmond Braves beat the Charlotte Knights, 5-3, at The Diamond. Mike Hessman broke a 2-2 tie with a two-run homer in the sixth inning, one of his record 433 MiLB home runs. It was his fourth straight game with a home run, which happened the same week Barry Bonds homered in seven consecutive games for the Giants. **2013:** The Richmond Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 10-6, at The Diamond. Trailing, 6-5, in the eighth, Ehire Adrianza and Joe Panik worked walks to give the Flying Squirrels the lead. Javier Herrera was hit by a pitch to bring in a third run and Ricky Orpessa added a two-run single. Edwin Quirarte entered in the ninth and threw a 1-2-3 frame to end the game.
