**YESTERDAY:** Victor Nova led a potent Captains offense with two home runs and five RBI, as Lake County defeated the Fort Wayne TinCaps, 12-3. Nova broke a 2-2 tie with a two-run homer to right-center in the second, added a run in the third with an RBI single and hit another two-run shot to right-center in the seventh. **Brayan Rocchio** also hit a two-run home run in the eighth inning. The Captains also set a season-high with five stolen bases in the game.

**SEASON SERIES:** The Captains are 9-4 in the season series against Fort Wayne and have outscored the TinCaps, 73-46 (+27 run differential). Four different Captains have an OPS greater than 1.000 against Fort Wayne – **Quentin Holmes** (1.211 – 5 games), **Mike Amditis** (1.205 – 4 games), **Will Brennan** (1.028 – 11 games) and **Brayan Rocchio** (1.021 – 11 games). In addition, four Captains have hit over .300 in the series – Holmes (.474), Brennan (.386), Amditis (.333) and **José Tena** (.326).

**THAT WAS WEIRD:** In game one of Saturday's doubleheader against South Bend, the Captains won on a walk-off error when Cubs reliever Samuel Reyes dropped the throw back from catcher Harrison Wenson and **Bryan Lavastida** raced home to score in the bottom of the eighth inning. The Cubs entered that inning pitching a combined perfect game with six perfect frames by starter Ryan Jensen and one by Reyes. Lavastida broke up the perfect game with a leadoff double.

**HOME COOKIN' TASTES BETTER:** The Captains are 18-6 at home, compared to 12-19 on the road. Captains pitchers have experienced the biggest home/road disparity. Lake County has a 3.01 ERA at Classic Park and a 5.04 ERA on the road.

**HOT LAVA:** **Bryan Lavastida** is riding a 10-game hitting streak, during which the Captains' catcher has three three-hit games. Over that stretch, Lavastida has hit .486 (18-for-37) with three homers and three doubles.

**WELCOME BACK:** In 16 games since returning from an oblique injury, **George Valera** has slashed .273/.403/.436 (.839 OPS) with two home runs, a double and a triple. **Quentin Holmes** returned from a groin injury on June 1 and has hit .328/.359/.431 (.790 OPS) since returning with a homer, a double, a triple and six steals.

**HOT, THEN COLD:** **Brayan Rocchio** wrapped up June with hits in nine of 11 games and hit .326/.408/.581 during that span. At the start of July, however, Rocchio has gone 4-for-21 (.190/.292/.333) with eight strikeouts and one walk, but the switch-hitter went deep last night in a 2-for-5 performance. It was Rocchio's first long ball since June 20.

**BRENNAN BASHING:** Captains OF **Will Brennan** is second in the High-A Central League (HAC) in doubles (18), tied for seventh in extra-base hits (21) and seventh in batting average (.297).

**RELIEF ACES:** Three Captains relievers have been the linchpins of the bullpen recently. RHP **Nathan Ocker** has a 1.23 ERA since June 1 with 26 K and 5 BB in 22 IP. LHP **Tim Herrin** has a 0.84 ERA across his last five outings, dating back to June 15, though he has 9 BB in 10.2 innings with 12 K. RHP **Jared Janczak** has a 1.13 ERA since June 17 with 14 K and 4 BB in 8 IP.

**ALUMNI UPDATE:** 2017 Captains RHP **Justin Garza** became the 102<sup>nd</sup> former Captain to reach the major leagues when he debuted for Cleveland on June 27. A record 10 former Captains have made their major league debuts this year – OF **Ka'ai Tom** (2016), RHP **Luis Oviedo** (2018-19), LHP **Sam Hentges** (2016), RHP **Louis Head** (2012-13), RHP **Nick Sandlin** (2018), INF **Ivan Castillo** (2014), **Jean Carlos Mejia** (2018), RHP **Eli Morgan** (2018), INF **Ernie Clement** (2018) and Garza. That breaks the record for the most former Captains to debut in a single year, besting the nine alumni that debuted in 2013 and 2016.

**DEFENSIVE FLEXIBILITY:** The Captains' have shuffled their defenders in 2021. Lake County has used four different first basemen, six different second basemen, six different third basemen and two different shortstops. **Raynel Delgado**, **Brayan Rocchio** and **José Tena** have each played three different infield positions. **Victor Nova** and **Daniel Schneemann** have played two different infield positions and left field.

**YOUNGSTERS:** The Captains have five of the 10 youngest players in the High-A Central League – 1B **Joe Naranjo** (20), INF **Aaron Bracho** (20), INF **José Tena** (20), INF **Brayan Rocchio** (20) and OF **George Valera** (20). Naranjo, Bracho and Tena are the three youngest players in the league. Naranjo, who turned 20 on May 11, is the youngest player in all of High-A. Bracho (born 4/21/00) is the second youngest in all of High-A. The Captains have eight players who are age 21 or younger.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Curry picked up his first Captains win, despite allowing a season high in runs (4) and home runs (3) over 5.1 innings in game one of last Thursday's doubleheader against the South Bend Cubs at Classic Park. Curry held the Cubs scoreless over the first three frames, but gave up a run in the third on a Grayson Byrd RBI double that tied the score at 1-1. The Captains' offense bounced back with four runs in the bottom of the fourth, but Curry began the fifth by allowing back-to-back home runs to Bradlee Beesley and Jake Washer, which cut the Captains' lead back to 5-3. Byrd then led off the South Bend sixth with a homer to make it a one-run game. After Curry got the first out of the sixth, **Kevin Kelly** came in to record the final five outs and seal the 5-4 Captains win.

**RED HOT START:** Curry made five starts for Low-A Lynchburg to begin the 2021 season. At the time of his promotion, Curry was leading the Low-A East League (LAE) in ERA (1.07), FIP (1.94), WHIP (0.63), K-BB% (36.2%), batting average against (.135) and BABIP (.220). He was second in K% (40.4%) and LOB% (83.3%).

**DURING 2020:** Spent part of quarantine living and training with 2018-19 Captains outfielder **Will Benson** in Atlanta. Curry and Benson have known each other since they were seven years old. The two were part of a group of Atlanta area professional and college ballplayers who trained and played pick-up games together after the Spring Training shutdown. The group included 2020 American League Rookie of the Year Kyle Lewis and his Mariners outfield teammate Taylor Trammell, as well as Atlanta's No. 14 prospect Trey Harris. The Atlanta training sessions began with a small group playing on a field behind a local church. As more players joined, they started playing full-fledged pick-up games and moved to LakePoint, where each player chipped in \$10 for field usage fees so the group could make use of the complex's eight major league-sized turf fields.

**RAMBLIN' WRECK:** Curry was Georgia Tech's Friday night starter each of his three seasons and became the first Yellow Jacket in the modern era (1973-present) to win three straight Opening Day starts. Since 2002, Curry ranks third at Georgia Tech in strikeouts looking (84) and fourth in total strikeouts (241). The right-hander was a Third-Team All-ACC selection as a junior in 2019.

**SHOWING FLASHES:** Curry recorded four double-digit strikeout performances in his junior season at Georgia Tech (2018). The right-hander struck out 11 at NC State, fanned 12 at home against Miami, struck out 12 again at home against Wake Forest and struck out 10 at home against Duke. His 12-K performance against Wake Forest was arguably the best start of his college career, in which Curry pitched a complete game, nine-inning, two-hit shutout. The following season, Curry had another marquee performance. Facing then-No. 4 Louisville on the road, Curry pitched eight innings and held the Cardinals to one run on one hit with nine strikeouts for the win. Curry retired 16 straight batters at one point.

**TWO WAY:** Curry registered six at-bats as a true freshman at Georgia Tech and went 3-for-6. He even started one game as a designated hitter. Prior to college, Curry was rated as the 27<sup>th</sup> ranked shortstop recruit in the country by **Perfect Game**.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** While at Mays High School in Atlanta, Curry was a 2016 **Perfect Game/Rawlings** Third-Team All-American and a 2016 **Perfect Game** Southeast All-Region First Team selection. Curry was also a 2015 **Perfect Game** underclass First-Team All-American and 2014 underclass high honorable mention All-American. Curry threw five no-hitters during his high school career and holds Mays school records for wins (32) and home runs (25). Mays was also the quarterback on the Mays High School football team for two years.
