Today's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Trenton Denholm** to the mound today, making his first scheduled start since the ned of April (emergency start last week). Lehigh Valley will counter with RHP **Brian Keller**. Columbus is 39-22 (.639) versus right handers this year. Keller has never pitched against the CLippers in his career, having pitched 68G with three different IL East teams since 2019.

vs. the IronPigs

Columbus has won 45 of the last 76G (.592), including playoffs. All-time in Allentown, the Clippers are 33-24 (.579), including playoffs (2-0 in '11 GC Finals). This year marks the second straight season the Clippers have travelled to Allentown and the third time since the expansion of the IL (Lehigh has been to Columbus once, 2024). **Juan Brito** is 5x17 (.294) with 5RBI against Lehigh in his career (5G).

Early Leads

The Clippers are 9-4 on Tuesday this season (0-2 when starting a series on any other day), a daily record bested only by Saturday and Sunday (both at 11-4). Columbus is averaging nearly 5.5 runs per game in the lid lifter, but has gone homerless 11 of 15 times. When winning game one, the Clippers have produced a 4-1-4 series record, while going 2-0-4 when dropping the opener (4-0-8 in last 12).

Back to Scratch

A leadoff bomb from **Petey Halpin** (second HR in 2G) pushed the team total to 100, as the differential meter dropped to +0 (9HR in last 12G, including 7G homerless). The Clippers still carry negative differentials in the hit (-4) and run (-10) columns, making them the only winning team in the IL with fewer hits and runs than their opponents. Sunday's win was the first by 4+ runs since 6/13 at Indianapolis.

Coming Back Strong

Petey Halpin is 10x27 (.370) in 6G since getting optioned, scoring in each game (115 runs since Triple-A debut, 9th most in the IL in that time). Including the week before his last stint in Cleveland (at Indy, 6/9-6/13), Halpin has hit .327 (16x49) over his last 11G with Columbus. He has 38K in 44G this year (5K in last 7G), following a '25 campaign that saw the 7th most in team history (156 in 126G).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.054OPS in the last 17G, batting .393 (24x61) while drawing 11BB in 75PA (15%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has scored 13 runs in those 17G, collecting 11RBI and 7XBH (.574SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.241; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 9th- **Kody Huff**, 10th- **Cooper Ingle**).

Snapping Out of It

Juan Brito saw his hitting streak snapped at 8G Saturday (.345, 10x29, 6/25-7/3; hit .136, 8x59, in 16G prior, 6/4-6/23). He had 6XBH (.690SLG) during the hit streak, including a trio of doubles to tie him with **Ricky Ledee** for the 24th most doubles in franchise history (62). Though he was hitless again on Sunday, he drew 2BB (11BB in last 10G; 153BB in Clipper career, tied for 20th, **Wayne Harer**).

More Ralphy

Ralph Velazquez extended his career best on base streak to 26G Sunday (.381OBP since 6/3), collecting a double (hits in 12 of last 13; .340, 17x50). His streak is the third longest active streak in the IL. Over his last 17G, Velazquez has watched his OBP rise 62 points and his average grow by 48, but his SLG has increased by only 16 points (3XBH in 74AB, but has one in each of last 2G).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on 6/28, a game after establishing new career highs in RBI (48) and runs (now at 49). His career best 20G on base streak was snapped Sunday (.385OBP, 6/2-6/28) after having twice set career long hit streaks (10G from 4/1-4/12, 12G from 5/1-5/16). Also, he has already hit top marks in triples (3) and HR (10) this year (3BB from personal best: 44 in '24).

Tens for Tolentino

Milan Tolentino saw his hitting streak snapped at 10G on Sunday (.382, 13x34, 6/24-7/4), one off his career best of 11G in 2023 with Lake County. Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, he is 15x40 (.375) in his last 13G, collecting 9XBH (.675SLG) and 10RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). In his last 7G, he got his 10th HR (6/28 at Omaha) and 10th SB (7/3; one of 12 IL batters with 10 of each).

This Date in Clipper History

7/7/2021

A 2-run double in the 7th from **Ryan Lavarney** and a game-ending downpour after the 8th secured a 2-0 win vs. Indianapolis. The win was the second straight shutout for Columbus, following a walk-off, 1-0 win the night before (**Trenton Brooks** single). Despite a franchise worst 5.22ERA, the Clippers ranked 3rd in the IL with 10 shutouts on the year (consecutive shutouts at Nashville later in the season).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,453 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 126-105 (.545) in pitch reviews, with batters going 65-70 (.481) and pitchers/catchers going 61-35 (.635). They have run out of challenges in 38G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-3 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-36 when playing past regulation (.604, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 91G to require extra play, 72 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 807, would rank as 5th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 103 through the first 86G (on pace for 178SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (52; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 133 runs while crafting a .933OPS (over 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 68 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 198-131 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,954RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.19 through the first 86G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 173HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 46G this season (28-18, .609), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (23, tied with Omaha). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 97G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-49 (.495, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 434-444 (.494), 404-398 with Columbus (.504).
