LEVELING THE PLAYING FIELD

The Hillsboro Hops Fund was established in 2014 in partnership with the Hillsboro Community Foundation. The goal of the fund is to promote, foster and support education, health, culture and youth sports, including activities for underprivileged youth, in the Greater Hillsboro area.

HOPS IN THE COMMUNITY

YOUTH CLINICS

Throughout the summer, the Hops hosted nine (9) FREE baseball and softball clinics for over 1,000 youth athletes. This includes a Girls Baseball and Softball clinic and seven (7) clinics in partnership with MLB's Play Ball Weekend initiative.

The Hops hosted the 4th Annual Home Run Reading Program with local elementary schools. The program encouraged students to continue reading during Spring Break. Over 1,200 students participated and read over 370,000 minutes.

CAREERS IN BASEBALL PROGRAM

In 2023, the Hops continued the Careers in Baseball program with local high school classes. Students heard from Hops staff members on their career paths and roles before planning a promotional night to pitch to the team.
