#### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Heath Fillmyer to the mound tonight, looking to bounce back from consecutive starts with at least 6ER (had back to back 0ER starts prior). Nashville will counter with RHP Thomas Jankins. The Clippers are 28-32 (.467) against right handers this year. Jankins has never pitched against the Clippers in his career.

Columbus was pulverized in the first series between the two this year (5/25-5/30 in Columbus), going 0-6 (led for only 2.5 innings in the entire series; 5/28: trailed 7-0, led 9-7, lost 13-9) and getting outscored 55-22. The pitching staff served up 17HR (tied for most in a series; at St. Paul, 7/13-7/18), while the lineup produced just 4HR (hit 3HR in first game in Nashville, Tuesday night).

#### **Pitching Problems**

The Clippers are one of four IL teams to have posted consecutive shutouts this year (Charlotte, Durham, Toledo), blanking Indy from 7/6-7/7, but gave up an average of 8.6 in the 14G after (120 total from 7/8-7/24). Over the last 3G, they have allowed a more respectable 3.7 per, including last night's pair (lowest opponent output since the shutouts, first time with zero multi-run innings since shutouts).

#### Hit Parade

While giving up only a couple of scores last night, the staff surrendered at least 10 hits for the 13th time in the last 17G, as opponents are batting .301 in that time (181x602). On the season, the Clippers have allowed at least 10 hits in almost half their games (35, by far the most in the IL) and last night's win was their 10th when the opponent has double digits in the hit column (second straight).

#### Young Heart

The four youngest players to suit up for Columbus this year will bat 2-5 tonight (Andres Gimenez, Nolan Jones and Oscar Gonzalez are all 23, Gabriel Arias is 21). Aside from Gimenez, who has never started below third this season, the other three will be taking on a much larger role (Arias has four starts higher than cleanup, Jones has 12 at cleanup and above, Gonzalez has zero above sixth).

#### **Hammering Gimenez**

Andres Gimenez missed over two weeks due to injury (7/4-7/19), but is hitting .360 (9x25) with a HR and 4RBI in 7G since his return (0x12 in last 3G prior to injury). In addition, he has 4BB and a pair of HBP in the last 7G, good for a .484OBP (only 6K, had 28K to 4BB in last 21G prior to injury). On Sunday, he put down his fifth sac bunt, tied for the IL lead (Clippers are 4-1 when he executes a sac bunt).

### Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored in only six of his last 19G, totaling seven runs (zero runs in 5G from 7/20-7/24, longest drought since 8G from 5/29-6/6), following a streak of 22 runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at lowa, Arias has scored 29 runs in his last 37G, tied for 2nd in the IL in that time (hitting .333, 47x141, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is 7th in the IL in runs (42).

### **Double Drought**

Nolan Jones has not doubled in his last 13G (tied for longest drought of the year, 5/6-5/22; still tied for IL lead with 20 doubles). Since reaching a season high of .241 on 7/4, Jones is hitting just .156 (10x64) in 19G (one double). While his batting average has fallen 23 points in those 19G, his slugging has fallen by just seven (.431 to .424) thanks to 5HR (hit .321 with .617SLG in 24G from 6/8-7/4).

### Gone-zalez

Oscar Gonzalez saw his on base streak snapped at 12G last night (.333OBP, 7/13-727), but Nolan Jones drew a walk in his last PA to extend his to 13G (since 7/13, .327OBP). Gonzalez had an 8G hit streak (7/13-7/22) during his on base streak that was tied for the team high until Gabriel Arias extended his hit streak to 9G last night (.417, 15x36 since 7/18; second streak of at least 8G for Arias, 6/19-6/29).

### Waking Up

Gavin Collins is 7x25 (.280, .379OBP) with 8RBI in his last 8G, but hit .073 (3x41) in 16G before that (6/1-7/2). Tyler Krieger had back to back 2-hit games on 7/8 and 7/14 (7x19 in last five starts) for the first time since his first two of the year (5/7-5/8; batted .115, 9x78, in between). Alex Call is 9x29 (.310) with 3HR and 5RBI in his last seven starts, and has scored nine times.

## This Date in Clipper History 7/29/1979

Bob Kammeyer beat Pawtucket 4-3 to win his 8th straight decision and improve to 13-4 on the season. Kammeyer (16-8, 3.92ERA, 10CG) would win a franchise best 16 games in 1979, but fell short in the IL Pitcher of the Year voting to teammate Rick Anderson (13-3, 21 saves, 1.63ERA). The next season, Kammeyer went 15-7 with a 2.91ERA and 13CG to win the award. His 23CG are an all-time Clippers record.

#### **Huntington (Small) Park**

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (983 to 943).

### Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.29 per game, putting them one off of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.50 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 36, even with the shortened season.

#### Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 14-40 (.259) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

#### Not Close

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (24; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank dead last in wins by at least that many (10). That poor ratio has led to a -84 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them 13th in the IL (Norfolk is in last, -85).

#### Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; current 4G losing streak in extra-innings following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

#### **Trending Downward**

The current staff ERA of 5.54 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.84ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

#### Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (671K, 71 off the pace, Charlotte). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.32K per game.

### Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 150 points higher (.500, 18-18) than when they make a mistake in the field (.389, 14-22). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 95 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .981.

### One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 51% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 21 times (on pace for 37HR).

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. lowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

### International Accolades

**Bobby Bradley** was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

### Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 62-86 (.419), 32-40 with Columbus (.444).

#### On a Roll:

To start July, Fillmyer put 12 consecutive bagels on the board, turning in the longest scoreless innings streak for a Clipper this season. Over those 12.0IP, from the 1st on 7/1 through the 1st on 7/17, opponents batted .098 (4x41; 0x5 with RISP) with 0XBH and 1BB to go against 13K. Unfortunately for him, the Clipper offense was just as limp, with Fillmyer leaving each of the first two starts of his run in a 0-0 tie (hitting .156/.270/.219 with two runs in last 4GS while Fillmyer is pitcher of record).

#### In Relief

Following a start in his Clipper debut, Fillmyer pitched three times out of the bullpen to mixed results. He had a pair of perfect innings (2K, 26 pitches) at lowa on 6/8, then allowed 4ER in 2.0IP at lowa on 6/11 (37 pitches). In his most recent outing as a reliever, he gave up 1ER in 1.0IP vs. Toledo on 6/15 (20 pitches).

### Barnstorming:

Fillmyer made his 2021 season debut on 5/27 with Lancaster in the Atlantic League, picking up the win at Gastonia with a quality start on 102 pitches (6.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 2BB, 9K). Notable Atlantic League Alumni that went on to play for the Clippers include (years in AL; years in Columbus): **Ruben Sierra** ('99; '05), **Curtis Pride** ('99-00; '03), **Kenny Ray** ('02; '09), **RJ Swindle** ('07; '09), **Michel Hernandez** ('07; '11-12), **Scott Kazmir** ('12; '13) and **Jarrett Grube** ('09-10; '15-17).
