TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque ended its season-high eight-game losing streak Sunday behind a Jordan Beck walk-off RBI double in the bottom of the 9th ... The Isotopes and Chihuahuas meet for the second of five series between the clubs in 2024, including three in El Paso, after the Chihuahuas won the first set in Albuquerque, 2-1, to begin the year ... Karl Kauffmann is slated to start for the Isotopes while Jay Groome is expected to take the hill for FI Paso

NOW WALK IT OFF: Sunday was the 121st walk-off win in Isotopes history (first since July 30, 2023, vs. Sacramento, Jimmy Herron RBI single for 17-16 victory), and the 20th to occur month of April. All time, Albuquerque has walked off Sugar Land four times.

NO BROOMS FOR YOU: Sunday marked the fourth time the Isotopes avoided a series sweep by winning the finale since Minor League Baseball changed to a six-game format prior to the 2021 season. They also did so on May 18, 2021 (at El Paso), Sept. 11, 2022 (vs. El Paso), and June 4, 2023 (at Salt Lake).

NOW THAT'S QUALITY: Noah Davis' outing marked the first quality start (and longest outing) for an Isotopes hurler since Tanner Gordon blanked Oklahoma City over 7.0 frames on Sept. 22, 2023.

PUNCHIES: Noah Davis' nine strikeouts Sunday are the most for an Albuquerque starter since Connor Seabold on Sept. 2, 2023, at Sacramento (nine). Davis was two punchouts shy of tying his career-best, reached in 2021 with High-A Spokane.

VS. SUGAR LAND: Albuquerque ended a 10-game home skid to Sugar Land, its longest skid against any opponent at Isotopes Park in team history. The Space Cowboys have still won 19 of their last 25 contests in the Duke City.

LAST WEEK BY THE NUMBERS: Over six games last week, the Isotopes and Space Cowboys combined for 108 runs, 142 hits, 71 walks and 14 errors.

LEAD: Coco Montes' RBI single in the first inning Sunday gave Albuquerque their first lead since April 6 at Oklahoma City (2-1 in the eighth), a span of 55 frames. Additionally, they had not been in front at the conclusion of a full inning of play since April 5 at OKC (1-0 after one), elapsing 71 total frames

BY WAY OF THE K: In the box Sunday, the Isotopes struck out just five times, their fewest since Sept. 13, 2023, vs. ELP ... For the year, the club's 163 punchouts are third-most in Triple-A (most: Omaha, 165)

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard tallied his seventh multi-hit game of the season Sunday, and fifth in his last six starts. Additionally, it was his first three-hit performance since Sept. 9, 2022, also with Albuquerque vs. El Paso. Hilliard also stole two bases in a contest for the first time since Sept. 29, 2019 for Colorado, in the season finale against Milwaukee.

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck singled Sunday and has a hit in eight of his last nine games (10x35) with seven XBH (four doubles, one triple and two homers) ... He has reached base in all 13 games in 2024 and extended his overall on-base streak to 34 games (since Aug. 18, 2023, with Double-A Hartford).

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of the 36 batted balls in play, 16 have been over 100-MPH. Highest EV: 108.6 MPH, 1B (3/29 vs. ELP)

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman went deep for the first time since Sept. 17, 2023, vs. San Francisco, a span of 64 at-bats Reached base in 22 of the 28 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 20 (five hitless games in 2024) ... Of Goodman's 39 batted balls hit into play this year, 16 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.

TONY: Drew Romo is 9-for-17 over his last four games. tallied back-to-back multi-hit games for the first time in 2024.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk has a modest four-game hit streak (5x16) with two doubles and four RBI.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron tallied a season-high three RBI Sunday, most since a career-high five Sept. 17, 2023. at ELP

EXIT VELO: Of the 22 batted balls registered at 100 MPH-plus Sunday, the Isotopes recorded 13. Sam Hilliard had the hardest hit ball: 112.6 MPH single. He, Jordan Beck and Drew Romo also tallied three batted balls over 100-MPH.

XBH: Hunter Goodman connected on the Isotopes Triple-Aleading 11th triple of the year Sunday. They have a three-bagger in seven of 15 games this year ... Also, the club's 36 doubles are tied for third-most in Triple-A (leader: Omaha, 39).

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Hunter Goodman is 3rd in doubles (7) ... Sean Bouchard is 2nd in triples (4) ... Jordan Beck is 6th in slugging (.714) and XBH (10) and 10th in OPS (1.131) ... Greg Jones is T-5th in stolen bases (8).

ERROR 404: The Isotopes 17 miscues for the season are the second-most in Triple-A (also: Norfolk Tides, 18). Have an error in nine of 15 games

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- 2019 D1 Baseball Third Team All-American
- Appeared in 48 games (34 starts) for the Wolverines from 2017-19, compiling a 19-10 record and 2.99 ERA
- His 12 wins in 2019 tied him for the program record in a single season with Rich Stoll (1982-83) and Tommy Henry (2019)
- Came within one out of a nine-inning complete game shutout on May 31, 2019 against Creighton in an NCAA Tournament game
