2010: It was the Lugnuts' first win of the year, an offensive outburst that saw Lansing score four in the seventh and five in the eighth to wipe away a 7-1 Great Lakes lead. Kevin Nolan supplied the crowning blow with a two-run single, delivering the Nuts a sensational 10-8 victory at Dow Diamond.

2018: The Fort Wayne TinCaps beat the Lugnuts at Parkview Field, 9-4, thanks to an eight-run seventh inning off reliever Dany Jimenez, capped by a Carlos Belen grand slam to left field.

Gage Jump joined **Trystan Magnuson** as the only Lugnuts in franchise history to make their pro debut as the Opening Day starter. The 6-foot-7 Canadian southpaw was drafted 56th overall in 2007 from Louisville. Pitching in Fort Wayne on Opening Day, April 3, 2008, Magnuson allowed a two-run homer in the first inning to Angel Mercado, allowed three runs total in 1 2/3 innings and took the L in a 7-1 Nuts loss to the Wizards. He finished the season 0-9 with a 5.40 ERA in 81 2/3 innings, was traded by Toronto to Oakland with Danny Farquhar for Rajai Davis on November 17, 2010, and made nine appearances for the A's in the Major Leagues in 2011. According to his wikipedia page, Magnuson "now works as a mechanical engineer in the automotive industry."

Background: Jump starred at JSerra Catholic H.S., which also produced Royce Lewis and former TinCaps catcher Austin Hedges... he was rated California's No. 1 LHP and No. 5 prospect, the nation's No. 5 LHP, and No. 41 draft prospect... drafted in the 18th round by San Diego, but declined Padres' offer... began his college track at UCLA, making seven appearances as a freshman 2022 before he was shut down due to injury; missed all of 2023 after undergoing Tommy John surgery... transferred to LSU, saying "I just wanted to be in the SEC"... his older brother Hunter, an outfielder, had played SEC ball in 2022 for Kentucky after transferring from Arizona State... spent one season with Bayou Bengals: 6-2, 3.47, 17 G/15 GS, 83 IP, 22 BB, 101 K, .218 avg. ... No. 8 in SEC in ERA and opp. avg. ... named to SEC All-Tournament Team after shutting down Georgia on four hits and one run in seven innings, whiffing seven... 7-IP CG at Missouri, April 19: 3 H, 1 R, 14 K.
