STARTING NINE- NEWS AND NOTES

- Last Time Out: A Peoria rally came up just short on Thursday in a 6-5 Chiefs defeat. The Chiefs scored two in the sixth and two in the seventh to make it a one-run game, but Lake County reliever Xavier Martinez punched out the final five batters he faced to shut down the comeback bid. Josh Kross drove in two runs for the Chiefs.
- Lean on Me: Braden Davis will try to be a stopper for the Chiefs on Friday. Earlier this week, Davis was named the Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Month for July. In five July starts between Single-A Palm Beach and Peoria, Davis logged a 1.14 ERA and punched out 38 batters over 23 2/3 innings. Through four High-A starts, Davis has allowed just six hits, limiting opppnents to a meager .095 batting average. Entering play this evening, the southpaw leads all Cardinals minor leaguers in strikeouts (128) and opp. batting average (.157).
- Don't Kross Him: Josh Kross delivered again in a run-producing spot on Thursday. Kross drove in a pair of runs last night, his 19th multi-RBI game of the season. The switch batter leads all Cardinals minor leaguers in HRs (15). RBIs (76).
- Mr. Peoria: Peoria-born Mason Burns just keeps on humming.
 Burns owns a 2.25 High-A ERA and has not allowed an earned run
 over his last eight appearances, dating back to July 11. The righthander punched out three batters over two scoreless innings on
 Thursday.
- A Rare Feat: Wednesday's 9-7 loss to Lake County came on a walk-off grand slam. Prior to Wednesday, the Chiefs last lost via a walk-off salami on June 11, 2008, when future Cardinals outfielder Tommy Pham bested the Chiefs as a member of the Quad Cities River Bandits.
- Tuesday Blues: With Tuesday's loss, the Chiefs dropped another series opener. For whatever reason, Peoria is just 4-13 on Tuesday this season. Chiefs pitching has particularly struggled in openers. The Chiefs have posted a 5.98 Tuesday ERA in 2025.
- Rough Seas: The Chiefs have dropped their first three games against Lake County this week. This interleague series has caused problems for the Chiefs in recent seasons. The Chiefs are just 4-11 against the Captains dating back to 2023.
- Path Forward: With the Cardinals in a state of turnover, the organization hired a pair of new faces with ties to the Cleveland system. The Cardinals hired Rob Cerfolio from Cleveland to serve as the club's Assistant GM of Player Development and Performance. Cerfolio then tabbed Larry Day as the Cardinals Farm Director. Day, who spent 10 seasons in the Guardians system, managed Lake County in 2017.
- Sandberg Tribute: The final homestand between the Chiefs and the South Bend Cubs has been deemed the Ryne Sandberg Tribute Series. Sandberg, who managed the Chiefs in 2007 and 2008, passed away in July at the age of 65. The Chiefs will paint his No. 23 in the grass near the third base coaching box and will make multiple charitable donations to prostate cancer resarch throughout the week. TOP STORIES OF 2025

- April 6- Infielder Johnfrank Salazar faced eight Quad Cities batters and took the loss for Peoria on April 6. The first baseman topped out at 88 MPH on the bump. It was the first time since September 4, 2017 that a Chiefs position player factored into a decision for the club. Sunday's game also marked the first time since 2015 that Peoria had two position players throw in the same game. Graysen Tarlow also recorded an out on the mound.
- May 11- After beginning the year on the IL, Cardinals No. 13 prospect Chen-Wei Lin made his High-A debut on Mother's Day. The hard-throwing Lin topped out at 101 MPH on the radar gun and recorded eight outs in his season debut.
- May 13- The Chiefs plated eight runs in the top of the eighth inning to score a wild 13-10 win over the Cedar Rapids Kernels. In the process, the offense did something that hadn't been accomplished by a Chiefs team in more than 20 years. All nine batters drove in a run in the victory. No player drove in more than two runs for Peoria. The Chiefs logged 18 hits in the ballgame.
- May 18- In Peoria's 7-1 win over Cedar Rapids, skipper Roberto Espinoza logged his 200th managerial win. Espinoza, who is in his first season with the Chiefs, previously managed the Johnson City Cardinals (2017-19) and the FCL Cardinals (2021-24). The 36-year-old led Johnson City to a league title in 2019.
- May 20- The Chiefs wore their hitting shoes in a rain-shortened 12-5 win over Dayton, mashing a single-game franchise record seven home runs. Joshua Baez and Zach Levenson each connected on a pair of homers. Ian Petrutz, Brayden Jobert and Tre Richardson also chipped in. The previous record was six home runs, a feat most recently accomplished in 2022 at Cedar Rapids.
- ♦ June 8- Peoria pushed its winning streak to five games after sweeping a doubleheader from Quad Cities at Dozer Park. The Chiefs scored 18 runs over just 12 innings of at-bats. The Chiefs swept a pair of doubleheaders from the Bandits, the first time since 2018 that Peoria took two twin bills from the same team in the same series.
- July 2- The Chiefs turned in a historic performance, blasting the South Bend Cubs 21-2. The 21 runs were a Chiefs single-game record at Dozer Park and just three runs off of the franchise record (August 28, 1984 at Quad Cities). Josh Kross launched a grand slam and drove in six runs in the victory. The Chiefs broke the 20-run mark for the first time since September 2, 2004, a 20-7 win over Wisconsin.
- July 3- Relief pitcher Mason Burns joined a very exclusive club when he made his Chiefs debut on July 3. Burns became just the second Peoria-born player to ever suit up for the Chiefs, joining former MLB catcher Joe Girardi (1986, 2003 rehab). A graduate of Normal Community High School, Burns twirled a scoreless inning in his High-A debut.
- July 31- Another deadline deal resulted in a reinforcement for the Chiefs. LHP Mason Molina was part of a three-player deal that sent reliever Phil Maton to the Texas Rangers. The move represented the second time that Molina had been traded in 2025. He was dealt from the Milwaukee Brewers to the Rangers in January.
- August 11- Braden Davis earned another accolade when he was named the Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Month for July. Davis posted a 1.12 ERA and whiffed 38 batters over 23 2/3 innings. This award came just a week after being named the Midwest League Pitcher of the Week on August 3. He has won three weekly Pitcher of the Week Awards in 2025, the most by a Cardinals pitcher since 2024, when Quinn Mathews won four such awards.
