## GAME NOTES

**STARTING ON THE RIGHT FOOT:** With their victories on Friday and Saturday, the Bats snapped a decade long streak of futility to start the season. The 9-8 win over Indianapolis on March 29 was the first Opening Night win for the Bats since April 4, 2014 at Toledo, a 3-1 triumph with Jeff Francis taking home the win on the mound for the Bats. Previously, the Bats had lost their past eight season openers, scoring three or fewer runs in seven of those eight games. Followed up with Saturday's 4-3 win, the Bats were 2-0 for the first time since 2014, clinching a series win to start the 2024 season.

**TROUTWEIN? MORE LIKE TROUT-WIN:** Bats catcher Michael Trautwein's made the most of his first series at the Triple-A level. In addition to throwing out the only runner trying to steal against him and catching 18 innings in less than 24 hours between Friday and Saturday, his first Triple-A hit was a big one. In a 3-3 tie with two outs in the bottom of the ninth on Saturday, Trautwein connected on a walk-off home run to deep right field that left his bat at 106.2 miles per hour, sending his teammates and the crowd at Louisville Slugger Field into a frenzy with a 4-3 win. This week, Trautwein returns to his home state of Georgia and is expected to be playing in front of many family and friends.

**PK CHASING 2K:** Bats Manager Pat Kelly entered the 2024 season as one of three active Minor League managers with at least 1,900 career wins (Buddy Bailey-Myrtle Beach, Rick Sweet-Nashville). With the two wins last weekend, Kelly is now at 1,957 career victories, just 43 away from 2,000. He is looking to become just the seventh Manager in Minor League History to reach the 2,000 win plateau. Kelly's managerial career began in 1986 with Class-A Charleston in the South Atlantic League, and he's been coaching in the Reds organization since 2007.

**MARCHING AHEAD:** Last weekend's series between the Bats and Indians is the first time in modern Louisville franchise history (since 1982) that the team has played a game in the month of March. The Bats were scheduled to begin the 2023 season on March 31 last year, but that game in Nashville was postponed to April 1. April 1 was the earliest start to a season in franchise history. Before that, the earliest in the calendar Louisville began a season was April 3, most recently in 2003.

**PROSPECT RANKINGS:** The Bats currently roster features five of the Cincinnati Reds Top 30 prospects according to MLB.com. They are right-handed starting pitcher Connor Phillips (No. 4), outfielder Blake Dunn (No. 11), right-handed starter Lyon Richardson (No. 14), along with outfielders Rece Hinds (No. 16) and Jacob Hurtubise (No. 24).

**BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Of the 28 players currently on the active roster (excluding MLB rehab players) 16 have previous Major League experience. New Bats catchers P.J. Higgins and Austin Wynns both have extended big league playing time. Wynns appeared in games for the Dodgers, Rockies, and Giants in 2023 before signing with the Reds over the offseason. Infielder Hernan Perez has appeared in 651 Major League games with four clubs dating back to 2012 and fellow infielder Erik Gonzalez has spent parts of seven seasons in the big leagues. Mike Ford debuted for the Yankees in 2019 and has since played for five big league teams. Carson Spiers, Casey Legumina, and Alan Busenitz are some of the many Bats that previously played for the Reds. Southpaw Tyler Gilbert joins the Bats in his Reds organizational debut after throwing a no-hitter in his first Major League start for Arizona on August 14, 2021.

**2023 IN REVIEW:** The Bats finished the 2023 season with a 75-73 (.507) record, 9.0 games behind the International League West Division winner St. Paul Saints and 14.5 games behind the International League and Triple-A champion Norfolk Tides. The 2023 season marked the first winning season for the club since 2011, snapping the franchise record losing streak of 10 straight losing seasons (2012-2022, did not play in 2020). It also marked the most wins in a season for the Bats since 2010 (79-64). Sitting as low as nine games under .500 on April 14 (2-11), Louisville was as high as 12 games over .500 on August 6 (59-47). Louisville reached the .500 mark on May 19 (21-21), the first time the club had done so since July 29, 2016 and finally hurdled the line on May 25 (24-23), marking the first time the team was over .500 since July 27, 2016, a span of 2,493 days and 782 games. The Bats finished the home portion of the schedule 40-35, the most wins at home in a season since 2011 (40-32). On the road, the club finished 35-38, a five-win increase over last year and the most road wins since 2016 (38-34). Overall, Louisville's 75 wins marked a 15-game improvement over 2022's 60-90 finish.

**RECORDS WE'RE PROUD OF:** In 2023, the Bats set fire to the franchise record book, setting new season-highs in: Hits – 1,406 / Runs – 902 / HR – 210 / XBH – 544 / BB (hitters) – 732 / At-Bats – 5,047 / HBP – 84 / Fielding errors (fewest) – 76 / Fielding percentage – .985 / OBP .376 / slugging .477 / IBB – 4
