Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Justin Campbell** to the mound today, needing a win in his Triple-A debut to salvage a series split (8-3 in game six after starting series 2-3). The Saints will counter with RHP **Ryan Gallagher**. Columbus is 51-37 (.580) versus right handers this year. Gallagher has faced the Clippers thrice in his career, going 0-3 with a 16.03ERA (10.2IP, 17H, 19R, 19ER, 9BB, 15K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 5-5 against the Saints in Ohio last year (2G cancelled), on the way to a 9-7 series record, and has won 53 of the last 88 overall opposing the Saints (488-393 run differential; 15 of 35 losses by a single run, only 12 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **David Fry** has hit .333 (20x60) with 4HR and 15RBI in 18G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 6HR and 20RBI in 19G).

Aside from That...

If no homers had been hit this week, Columbus would be outscoring St. Paul by a total of 15-7, as the Saints have scored 30 times thanks to 18HR. For their part, the Clippers have scored 28 runs off 16HR. In the season series (17G), the Clippers and Saints are combining for 12 runs and 4HR per game (Columbus: 33HR, accounting for 56 of 104 runs, 54%; St. Paul: 35HR, 58 of 100 runs, 58%).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 21G, the Clippers have plated a total of 164 runs (most in the IL, 7.8 per), with 109 (66%) tallied in the first four innings of the game (35 scored in the 1st), including eight innings of 5+. Grabbing the early lead has been of the utmost importance for Columbus, as the Clippers are the only undefeated team in the IL when leading after the 7th (47-0, 57 straight wins since 8/22/25 vs. Omaha).

Homer Time

The Clippers gained 18 in the homer column over 17G from 7/28-8/19 (45-27; out-homered 36-21 in 19G prior), but they have been out-homered 16-11 in the last 4G. Dating to 7/28, they have hit more homers (56) than any team in pro baseball, while giving up the 4th most (43; leads IL). Huntington Park has been breached 69 times in the last 15G (3.0 per game on the year, 3rd in the IL; St. Paul is 1st: 3.6).

Little Heaters

Daniel Schneemann has four multi-hit games in the last week (10x23, .435 since 8/15). Dating to 4/25/24, he has played 51G in the IL, batting .319/.441/.562 with 45 runs scored (16 runs in last 15G) and 36RBI (5RBI in last 15G). **Kyle Manzardo** has hit safely in each of his last 6G (.320, 8x25, 9RBI since 8/15) and his double last night was the 62nd XBH of his Clipper career (49 singles, .558SLG).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (16, +7), RBI (30, +6; RBI in 16 of 20G) and SLG (1.013, +263). Saturday night saw his 12G his streak snapped (.417, 20x48, 10HR and 19RBI from 8/4-8/20), but he responded with his first career 3HR game last night (17th time in Clipper history). Aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), he is hitting .348/.426/.734 since 6/18 (19HR, 44RBI).

All or Nothing

Over his last 20G, since 7/25, **Kody Huff** is mired in a 10x69 (.145) slump, though he has connected for 6HR (19HR on the season; had 18HR in career prior). He leads the team in runs (71) and RBI (67) and is set to become the fourth 70-70 Clipper since 2019 (**Johnathan Rodriguez**, **Jhonkensy Noel**, **Juan Brito**). Despite the struggles, he enters today on a 13G on base streak (.316OBP since 8/2).

Out of a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** hit .111 (8x72) with a .139SLG in his next 20G (6/27-7/28). On 7/30, he was 2x3 with a HR (snapped 124AB homerless streak) and his 150th career RBI as a Clipper (38th most all-time), and he has hit safely in seven straight (.370, 10x27, 3HR, .852SLG). On Thursday (first game since 8/5), he doubled twice (reached 50 doubles in Clipper career).

Problems on the Back End

Since allowing 7ER in 4.1IP at Lehigh Valley on 7/12, the Clipper bullpen has registered an IL-worst 7.69ERA in 31G (128.2IP, 110ER). Clipper relievers have surrendered 32HR in that time (2nd to the 33 given up by St. Paul). The bullpen has not put together a scoreless outing since back to back games vs. Louisville from 7/4-7/5. Columbus starters have a 5.02ERA since 7/12 (138.0IP, 77ER).

This Date in Clipper History

8/23/2007

Jason Bergmann (7.0IP, 9K), **Jon Albaladejo** (1.0IP, 1K) and **Dan Foli** (1.0IP, 3K) combined to shutout Louisville 6-0. **Bernie Castro** tied a Clippers record with 4SB in the game, despite not recording a hit as he went 0x2 with 2BB. Castro had 11SB over the final 14 games to finish the year as the IL stolen base champion with 34. Castro was the 7th of Columbus' eight league-leading thieves (most in the IL since 1977).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,490 to 1,438).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 175-138 (.559) in pitch reviews, with batters going 91-83 (.523) and pitchers/catchers going 84-55 (.604). They have run out of challenges in 46G and have not challenged in 6G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 843, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 143 through 122G (on pace for 172SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 43CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (52; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 174 runs while crafting a .894OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 115 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +59 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 285-180 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 80 grand slams and 1,987RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.50 through 122G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 208HR (2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 66G this season (39-27, .591), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 12th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 451-463 (.493), 421-417 with Columbus (.502).

Worth the Wait:

Campbell made his professional debut on 4/2 vs. West Michigan, 1,355 days after being taken in the supplemental 1st round of the 2022 draft. His career was delayed by surgeries on his right elbow in both May of 2023 and April of 2024 (also had surgery on right wrist in October of 2024). He proceeded to allow 1ER in his first 6GS (13.1IP, 38.2 pitches per start), while walking just a pair of 48BF (4%; also had 18K, 38%). Campbell was promoted to Triple-A on 7/1, but injured his oblique during warmups and left the game before it started (eventually placed on the DL).

Wilding Out:

In his final start with Lake County, Campbell issued 3BB (11BF) and then surrendered 22BB across 9GS with Akron (152BF, 15%), including a pair of outings with 5BB each. His strikeout rate dipped to 29% in that stretch (48K), but he snagged a career high with 8K on 6/6 at Chesapeake (0BB).

No Homers Club (You're Allowed to Have One):

Among all full season minor league pitchers with at least 200BF this season, Campbell is one of 19 (one of four starters) that has allowed a single longball (only one has 0HR). That shot came on 6/13 at Erie, snapping a streak of 158BF without a homer to start his career (52BF since).

Buckling Down:

Opposing hitters have had 81 chances with runners on base against Campbell this season, batting .111 (8x72) with only 3XBH (all doubles, .153SLG) and 9BB (.210OBP). Campbell has whiffed 37% of those hitters (30K), while inducing 3GIDP. With the bases empty, opponents have fared a little better, slashing .223/.331/.304 with a HR in 112AB (36K in 130BF, 28%).

- 2-run HR to **Ben Ross** (14) in the 1st inning.

- Relieved by **Trevor Stephan** at the top of the 6th, leading 11-2.

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 76 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 50.0IP, ranking 32nd among that group with a 4.52ERA (85.2IP, 43ER) and 43rd with a 1.44WHIP. He ranks 5th with 91K thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24; had second career 0K game on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley).

That's Over:

From 5/9-7/23, the Clippers went 1-12 in Peterson's 13G, as he personally went 0-8 (longest losing streak of career, had 10 losses in previous two seasons combined). He registered a 5.52ERA (58.2IP, 36ER) over the stretch, while the bullpen produced a 6.99ERA (47.2IP, 37ER) and blew three saves. In 4GS since 7/29 vs. Toledo, he is 3-0 and owns a 2.70ERA (20.0IP, 6ER), as the Clippers have been victorious in each game.

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 41 times over his short career (18G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 15-10 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.50ERA (230.0IP, 181H, 68R, 64ER, 51BB, 225K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.43 over 57G (278.1IP, 294H, 158R, 137ER, 70BB, 254K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters were 3x3B with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). That all changed in his 13th start, at Lehigh Valley on 7/9, when he labored through the opening frame on 41 pitches, allowing a trio of runs (3x6, 2BB). In 5G since, including his relief outing on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, Peterson has held the opposition to 3ER in his first inning of work (7x26, 1BB, 6K). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .937OPS off Peterson (8HR in 131AB), while batters 4-9 produce a .662OPS (3HR in 199AB).

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .321 (43x134) with runners on base (.321, 25x78 with RISP) this year, while going just 47x196 (.240) with the bases empty. He did not uncork a wild pitch this season until his 410th offering with men on base, 7/9 at Lehigh Valley (had another wild pitch in next outing, 7/18 vs. Indy; 3WP in 1,199 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).

From the 'Pen:

Peterson made his third career relief appearance (all with Columbus) on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, picking up a suspended game in the 4th inning against the Indians. Pitching on his regular day of rest, he threw 72 pitches over 4.0IP, while allowing 4ER (15.0IP, 11ER in relief career).
