Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound tonight, looking to take a 4-0 series lead (last: 6/11-6/14/24 vs. Iowa; 0-5 in last 5G after starting 3-0). The Mud Hens will counter with LHP **Lael Lockhart**. Columbus is 11-19 (.367) versus left handers this year. Lockhart has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career, going 0-2 with a 3.80ERA (21.1IP, 21H, 12R, 9ER, 9BB, 22K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus has pulled ahead in the season series vs. Toledo (11-4) after going 10-11 opposing the Mud Hens last year (have not won a season series since going 11-10 in 2022). The Clippers have scored first in 12 of 15 against Toledo this year (10-2), compared to 37 times (20-17) in their other 89G. Individually, **Daniel Schneemann** has hit .344 with 6HR and 19RBI against Toledo in his career (24G).

Brushing Off the Hits

The Clippers were out-hit 12-11 yesterday, but Columbus prevailed for the 13th time when watching the opposition collect more (tied for most in the IL) and the 19th time when surrendering at least 10 hits (most in the IL, +5 on 2nd). Columbus is sitting with a negative differential in hits (-35, t-13th), homers (-14, 15th) and runs (-23, 14th), but the Clippers own the 8th best winning percentage (.529).

Crushing It

Each of the first 3G of the series have seen the Clippers go deep, with 7HR in total (7HR in first 9G coming out of the All-Star Break). Yesterday's bomb from **Cooper Ingle** (16, +5 on career high) broke a tie with **Kody Huff** (15, +8 on career high) for the team lead. Clipper catchers have 21HR (2nd in the IL), following a 2025 season with 8HR (tied for fewest; 203HR from 2014-24, most in the IL).

Ingle is Back

In 15G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 26x63 (.413), drawing 8BB (.472OBP) with 11XBH (4HR, .714SLG). He is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's **BJ Murray**, hitting .300/.400/.500 this season and he is currently riding a 7G hit streak (.484, 15x31 with 3HR and 9RBI since 7/23). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.334OPS (13HR) in 36G (.666OPS and 3HR in 29G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

In 33G since 6/18, **Angel Genao** ranks 2nd in the IL in OBP (.467), while placing 3rd in walks (24), 5th in batting (.366, 45x123) and 10th in OPS (.995). He owns a 16% walk rate in that time (145PA; 8% in first 35G with Columbus) and his 13K yield a 9% rate (21% in first 35G). Saturday's multi-K game was his first since 5/31 (40G between; 40PA with 0K from 7/8-7/22, 50PA with 0K from 6/23-7/3).

Long Time, No Schneemann

Daniel Schneemann returned to the Clipper lineup on Tuesday for the first time in over two years, recording 4BB in his first 2G. In his last 34G with the Clippers, since 4/25/24, he has slashed .336/.459/.622 with 7HR and 28RBI. Schneemann is an RBI from hitting 100 in his Clipper career, while tonight's double-play partner, **Juan Brito**, is 2RBI from 150 (**George Valera** collected his 150th yesterday).

Walks Waning

Though the Clippers maintain a comfortable lead in the IL in walks (533, +31 on 2nd), they have drawn just 53BB in 12G since the All-Star Break (t-8th). **Kahlil Watson** has only 10BB in his last 31G with Columbus (30BB in first 31G, ranked 2nd in the IL through 5/9). **Bo Naylor** has just 4BB in his last 16G (24BB in first 28G with Columbus) and **Cooper Ingle** has 2BB in his last 8G (8BB in 8G prior).

Looking to Rebound

Ralphie Velazquez launched another homer yesterday (second of the week), boosting his OPS at Huntington Park to .914 (.579OPS in 25G on the road; 24x71 with 4HR in last 20G at home). His season slugging mark is back over .400, following a 48 point drop during last week's roadtrip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G, went from .422 to .374). After hitting .287 (25x87) in June, Velazquez is at .197 (14x71) in July.

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 15th HR of the season on Tuesday (all in last 258AB; had 15HR in previous 856AB, 6/28/23-4/5/26). Having already established career highs in runs, triples, RBI, walks, and steals, Huff is just seven hits and four doubles from personal bests. He is 7x25 in his last 8G (3HR) and his .903OPS is 7th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; **Cooper Ingle** leads: 1.024).

This Date in Clipper History

7/31/2004

Chien-Ming Wang picked up his first career win as a Clipper, striking out eight in 5.1IP during a 10-2 beating of Pawtucket. Wang would win in each of his next four starts to end the season, finishing the year at 5-1. He then ran his Clipper winning streak to seven straight decisions, winning his first two starts of the 2005 season before being promoted to New York and making his ML debut on 4/30/05 versus Toronto.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,466 to 1,408).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 150-121 (.554) in pitch reviews, with batters going 77-77 (.500) and pitchers/catchers going 73-44 (.624). They have run out of challenges in 42G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 802, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 120 through 104G (on pace for 172SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 33CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 4th most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (47; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 154 runs while crafting a .902OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 89 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 244-151 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,967RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.37 through the first 104G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 198HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.982), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 58G this season (34-24, .586), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, two off the lead) while playing in the 4th most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 30). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 441-455 (.492), 411-409 with Columbus (.501).

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Rocky Start:

When he did make his Triple-A debut, 6/20 vs. Scranton/WB, Gomez was touched for a 2-run homer in the 1st inning, but settled down to retire 10 of the next 12BF (7K). He has not given up a run in the 1st inning since. While with the AZL Guardians, he gave up 5ER over the course of 4.0IP in the 1st inning and 2ER in 6.1IP thereafter.

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to 0XBH from lefties (5x17, .295). His strikeout rate in Triple-A is fairly even (18K against 55BF from the left and 14K vs. 55BF from the right), but right handers are still teeing off when they do connect (10x48, 4HR).

Racking Up Strikeouts:

Since his Triple-A debut on 6/20, Gomez has averaged 11.2K/9IP, good for the 2nd best rate in the IL (32K, 25.2IP), trailing only **Logan Allen** (11.5K/9IP; **Trenton Denholm** is 5th, 9.4K/9IP). In terms sheer numbers, his 32K rank 7th in the IL (Allen is 1st, 41K, and Denholm is 4th, 35K). As a team, the Clippers have the 2nd most strikeouts in the league since 6/20 (293K in 32G), trailing Durham by 14K (the Bulls have pitched only 30G).

Party Time:

Gomez has dominated on Fridays and Saturdays with Columbus, registering a 1.35ERA over 3GS (13.1IP, 2ER). After allowing 2ER in his first 1.0IP for the weekend, he has not allowed a run since, while posting 17K against 4BB. On all other days, his ERA sits at 10.22 (12.1IP, 14ER) and he has 15K to 7BB.

House of Horror:

Splitting his starts evenly between Huntington Park and the rest of the IL, Gomez has allowed over four times more runs at home (13ER, has 3ER on the road) in fewer innings (11.2IP at home, 14.0IP on the road). Opposing hitters have doubled their slugging percentage in Columbus (.673, 5HR; .333SLG, 2HR on the road), while hitting over 200 points better (.347, 17x49; .146, 7x48AB).
