Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound tonight, looking for his first win of the season (has not reached 5.0IP through first 5GS). Omaha will counter with RHP **Mitch Spence**. Columbus is 36-20 (.643) versus right handers this year. Spence has pitched against Columbus twice in his career, going 0-0 with a 1.80ERA (10.0IP, 5H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 14K).

vs. the Storm Chasers

Columbus has lost 49 of the last 79 regular season games against Omaha, dating to 5/5/22. Of those 79G, the Clippers are 10-46 (.179) when they allow at least four runs to Omaha (3-3 in last 6G), while going 20-3 (.870) when they hold the Storm Chasers to three or fewer. Individually, **Kody Huff** has played 19G against Omaha in his career, hitting .288 (19x66) with 4HR and 10RBI.

Close-ing the Gap

Each of the last 10G have had a margin of three or fewer (longest stretch of the season; four IL teams have had longer runs). Columbus is now 30-22 (.577, 3rd) in such games, having lost three of the last four. Regardless of the margin, the Clippers are 21-13 over the last 34G, going +3 in the run column (172-169). On the year, Columbus is -12 (14th; all other IL teams with more than 40 wins average +60).

Hitting a Wall

Giving up 10 hits in last night's loss, the Clippers fell to 13-14 (.481, best in the IL; Gwinnett is 2nd at .409) when giving up double digits in the hit column. On the season, the Clippers hold a -10 hit differential (12th), posting an IL-best 11-25 (.305) record when being outthit (3-1 when hits are even, as last night, is also 1st). When getting outthomered, Columbus is an IL-best 10-14 (.416; +3 differential is 10th).

To the Top

Angel Genao is getting his first taste of the leadoff spot with Columbus tonight, having spent his first seven and a half weeks batting anywhere from 6-8. Beginning the season in Akron, Genao started every game as the leadoff hitter (.839OPS, including a .446OBP with 22BB in 23G). Genao's walk rate has dipped to 9% in Triple-A (18% in Double-A), but he does own 7BB in his last 45PA (16%).

Brito Slump

Juan Brito is hitting .159/.284/.222 in his last 17G, with nearly half his hits coming on 6/13 at Indy (4x5). Last night's homer was his first from the left side this season (20 in career as a Clipper; 9HR from right side, including 4HR this year) and first since homering in back to back at bats on 5/8 at Iowa (14OAB between). Brito now has an .803OPS in 28G on the road this season (.606 in 27G at home).

Fourth and One

Ralph Velazquez is returning to the cleanup spot tonight after a day off (all 27G have been batting fourth). His bomb on 6/7 vs. Omaha is the only homer from the #4 Clipper in the last 46G (fewest in the IL, 171AB; the 15RBI collected also rank 20th). While the .357SLG produced in that time ranks 19th in the IL, Columbus cleanup hitters have still managed the 3rd best exit velocity (91.4mph).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff built on a career high with a 17G on base streak last night (.375OBP since 6/2), after having twice established career best hitting streaks (10G from 4/1-4/12 and 12G from 5/1-5/16). In addition, Huff has already hit top marks in triples (3) and HR (10), while being set to make new personal records with his next run and RBI (at 45 and 47, respectively). He is one steal from a high (7SB in 2024).

Frias Feeling It

Dayan Frias is hitting .304 (7x23) in his last 7G, after having gone 2x27 (.074) in his previous 15G (5/6-6/16). Tonight will be his 100th career game as a Clipper and his 18th in the outfield this year (3G prior to 2026). Joining Frias at the bottom of the order is an actual outfielder, **Joe Lampe**, who has hit .368/.350/.632 with 5RBI in his first 7G with Columbus (.224/.314/.289 in last 21G with Akron).

Rounding Into Form

Over the last 29G, the Clippers lead the International League in fielding percentage (.985) while turning in the fewest errors (15; ranked 15th in fielding, .976, with 8th most errors, 39, in first 48G). Columbus is 26-15 (.634, 5th in the IL) when playing error-free, including 12-6 (.667) during the hot streak. Last season, the Clippers set a franchise record for defense (.985), including .986 in the second half.

This Date in Clipper History

6/26/1983
 The Clippers and Mud Hens combined to hit 10HR in a 16-13 shootout at Ned Skeldon Stadium, a game in which the Clippers would win. The 1983 Clippers set the team record with 182HR on the year, with three players, **Brian Dayett** (35), **Matt Winters** (29) and **Steve Balboni** (27) hitting at least 27HR. The 2019 Clippers demolished that record, pounding 213HR (four players with at least 24HR).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,447 to 1,396).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 111-95 (.539) in pitch reviews, with batters going 58-63 (.479) and pitchers/catchers going 53-32 (.624). They have run out of challenges in 35G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 4-3 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 54-36 when playing past regulation (.600, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 90G to require extra play, 71 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 819, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 97 through the first 77G (on pace for 188SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 25CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 119 runs while crafting a .931OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 55 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +64 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 188-122 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,946RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.30 through the first 77G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 172HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 9th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 41G this season (26-15, .634), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

Milan Tolentino bunted the winning run into scoring position in an extra-inning win at Indianapolis on 6/14. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 88-23 (.793) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 5-2 mark this season (.714, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 2nd most last at bat wins this year (12, Syracuse at 13) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (20; Scranton/WB has played 21). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 94G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 46-48 (.489, 15th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 428-441 (.493), 398-395 with Columbus (.502).
