NEWS AND NOTES		
<p>FISH FRY: The Sounds earned their fifth series win of the season with the 8-3 win over the Stripers on Saturday night. Nashville has won three straight series and have not lost a series since dropping four of seven on the road in Charlotte April 21-26. With Saturday night's win, the Sounds improved to 71-47 all-time against Gwinnett including a 43-16 record at First Horizon Park.</p> <p>SEA ANEMONE: Nashville improved to 22-6 at First Horizon Park this season and are 10-1 in over the last two home series. The 22 wins are the most of any minor league team at home this season. The Sounds own a +47 run differential in home games this season (139 runs scored / 92 runs allowed). The 92 runs allowed at home this year is the best mark in the International League and 17 runs fewer than next closest team, the Buffalo Bisons while the 139 runs scored rank ninth in the IL, 110 runs less than Charlotte, who leads the IL in run production at home this year. Nashville's +45 overall run differential on the season is the second-best mark in the IL behind the Charlotte Knights (+62).</p> <p>ZAM-AURA: Freddy Zamora clubbed his second homer of the season on a two-run shot to left field Saturday night against the Stripers and has connected on both home runs over his last four games played. It was his second career home run at First Horizon Park in 98 games played as a Nashville Sound. He hit his first after playing 82 career games at First Horizon Park on</p>	<p>September 11, 2025, vs. Gwinnett and needed to wait just 16 games until getting his second at home. Zamora finished Saturday night with his fourth multi-hit game of the year and set a new Triple-A single-game career-high with a 4-RBI game. It was his third career 4+ RBI game and first since setting his single-game career-high with 5 RBI on August 13, 2023, with Double-A Biloxi when he went 3-for-4 with his first and only career grand slam.</p> <p>PRATT-A-TAT: Cooper Pratt extended his on-base streak to 20 consecutive games on Saturday night, going 2-for-3 with two walks and a strikeout. The 20 consecutive games leads the team and is tied for the fifth-longest active on-base streak in the International League (T-9th in AAA). Since beginning his streak on May 7, the Brewers no. 4-rated prospect is hitting .286 (22-for-77) with eight XBH, 17 RBI, and has 16 runs scored. He's riding a six-game hitting streak and has at least one hit in 14 of his last 20, including eight multi-hit games. His 17 RBI since May 7 are second-most in the Brewers farm system behind Jesús Made (23) and he ranks tied for third in the system in hits behind Luis Lara (27) and Brady Ebel (26).</p> <p>CHARMIN: Thomas Pannone tossed his 56th career quality start and first in 616 days since he went 6.1 IP with one earned run on six hits in his final start of the 2024 season on the road in Buffalo on September 20, 2024. It was the 23rd career Triple-A QS in his 91st start.</p>	<p>His 6.0 IP on Saturday night were his most in any of his eight appearances this year, topping the 4.0 IP he had previously gone three times. He was efficient getting through six innings in 68 pitches, one more than he had thrown as his season-high across 4.0 IP on May 19 in Durham.</p> <p>YO QUERO RBI: Brewers no. 7-rated prospect Jeferson Quero tallied his 10th multi-RBI game of the season and now owns the team lead in RBI (34), surpassing Eddys Leonard (33). The 34 RBI are the third-most in the Brewers farm system behind Jesús Made (40) and Andrew Fischer (36). Saturday night was the second multi-RBI game of the series for Quero who also drove in two runs on Wednesday night.</p> <p>WAGS-IS-BACK: Jacob Waguespack extended his consecutive appearances to eight without allowing an earned run after stranding two runners in a scoreless eighth inning. His eight straight games without an earned run are tied for the third-longest active streak on the team and is tied for the 11th-longest active streak in the International League. During his streak, Waguespack has posted 11.0 consecutive innings on six hits and added 19 strikeouts. The Sounds currently have five different players riding streaks of 7+ games without an earned run allowed: Brian Fitzpatrick (14 G), Craig Yoho (11 G), Waguespack, Drew Rom (7 G), and Rob Zastryzny (7 G). No other IL team has more than two (DUR & BUF).</p>
