TODAY'S GAME: Welcome to LoanMart Field! The Quakes continue a six-game series as they host the Lake Elsinore Storm (Padres) in game four of a six-game series. Tonight is Chaquetas Beach Towel Giveaway to the first 1,500 fans in attendance, thanks to Verizon 5G Home Internet. Tickets are available at rcquakes.com.

VS THE STORM: Today's game is the seventh of 24 head-to-head games, with 15 of those taking place here at LoanMart Field. The Quakes are 6-0 against the Storm this year after three straight wins to open this series. Last season, the Quakes went just 10-20 against the Storm, 7-8 here at home.

LAST GAME: The Quakes matched their longest winning streak of the year at eight straight, as they took a 3-2 decision over the Lake Elsinore Storm on Thursday night at LoanMart Field. A balk in the bottom of the ninth by Storm reliever Xavier Ruiz (1-2) provided an improbable ending, as the Quakes remained undefeated (6-0) against the Storm. The Quakes broke a 1-1 tie in the eighth, as Eduardo Quintero singled home Eduardo Guerrero to give the Quakes a 2-1 advantage. Nicolas Cruz couldn't hold the lead in the top of the ninth as the Storm got even on an RBI groundout off the bat of pinch-hitter Victor Figueroa. Despite the blown save, Cruz (2-2) earned the win thanks to the ninth-inning heroics for Rancho. The Quakes end the half having won eight straight, while the Storm have dropped six straight.

THE END AND THE BEGINNING: This six-game set against the Storm is unusual, as it marks the end of the 66-game first half (Thursday's game) and the beginning of the 66-game second half (tonight). The Quakes finished the half with their best first-half mark (41-25) since the entire Cal League moved to the Low-A level in 2021.

SAN JOSE CLINCHES UP NORTH: The San Jose Giants clinched a playoff berth for the sixth straight year, after scoring four times in the ninth inning of Wednesday night's 5-2 win at Modesto over the two-time defending Champion Modesto Nuts. San Jose has won ten Cal League titles, with their last coming back in 2021.

ROSTER MOVES: On Thursday, Rancho activated INF Oswaldo Osorio from the IL and transferred INF Roger Lasso to the ACL. Osorio hasn't appeared for the Quakes since the opening road trip in Stockton back in April.

FIRST HALF SOUTH DIVISION CHAMPS: After stumbling a bit over a two-week stretch with an eight-game losing streak while both Visalia and Lake Elsinore were in the middle of seven-game win streaks, respectively, the Quakes put all doubt behind them by wrapping up the First Half South Division with last Friday's win over the 66ers in San Bernardino. The Quakes will now return to the playoffs for the first time since 2023, when they made it to the Championship Series, where they were swept by Modesto. The Quakes will have qualified for the playoffs in nine of the 14 seasons (2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2023 and 2025) of affiliation with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Rancho has won three Championships in franchise history (1994, 2015 and 2018) with the last two coming as a Dodgers' affiliate. This will mark the second time in five seasons they'll make it to the playoffs under Manager John Shoemaker.

AIDAN FOELLER: Right-hander Aidan Foeller makes his 13th start and 14th appearance, his second against Lake Elsinore. In his lone outing against the Storm on April 5th, he scattered six hits and one walk, while fanning eight over 4.1 scoreless innings in a no-decision. In his last outing overall, he allowed two runs (one earned) on five hits over 4.1 innings in a no-decision at Inland Empire on June 14th. Foeller was an 11th-round selection in last year's draft, out of Southern Illinois.

KLEIBER OLMEDO: 20-year-old right-hander Kleiber Olmedo makes his 10th appearance and eighth start of the year for the Storm and his first against the Quakes. In his last outing overall, he allowed two runs on three hits over four innings in a loss against Visalia on June 13th. Olmedo signed with San Diego in April of 2023 out of Venezuela.
