Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Steven Perez** to the mound tonight, making his first start of the year (with **Kody Huff** and **Milan Tolentino**, only Clippers active for every game). The Saints will counter with RHP **German Marquez**. Columbus is 57-41 (.582) versus right handers this year. Marquez has faced Columbus once in his career, 8/22 in Huntington Park (ND, 3.0IP, 5H, 5R, 5ER, 4BB, 0K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus is 3-3 against the Saints in Ohio this year, producing an 8-10 series record, and has won 54 of the last 89 overall opposing the Saints (496-398 run differential; 15 of 35 losses by a single run, only 12 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Kody Huff** has hit .307 (27x88) with 5HR and 18RBI in 26G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 6HR and 20RBI in 20G).

Buckle Up

Games between Columbus and St. Paul are seeing averages of 12.1 runs on 4.1 homers, as the Clippers are using the longball to score 53% of their runs (34HR, accounting for 59 of 112) and St. Paul owes 60% to the bomb (39HR, 63 of 105 runs). Assuming 6G of 9.0IP, if the pitching staff allows more than 25ER, it will establish a franchise high (5.32ERA in 2023; 189HR allowed currently ranks as 4th most).

Still Kicking

The Clippers enter tonight with an elimination number of one (St. Paul is at three), needing not just a series sweep (last: 8/2-8/7/22), but Rochester must go 0-6, Indy must go 1-5 at Gwinnett, Worcester must go 3-3 vs. Durham, and Scranton/WB (4), Syracuse (4), Charlotte (2), Nashville (1) and Toledo (1) must lose some games. Such a scenario (40-33) would result in a tie-breaking win against Worcester.

Start with a Bang

Over the last 40G, the Clippers have plated 271 runs (most in the IL, 6.8 per), with 170 (63%) tallied in the first four innings of the game. Opponents have only 86 in the first four innings of the last 40G, but are outscoring the Clippers 132-101 thereafter (Columbus has 79 straight wins when leading after the 8th; last loss: 8/7/25). On the year, Columbus now ranks 3rd in the IL in runs (807, 5.7, leads IL).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 33 points on his average over his last 28G (.214, 22x103) and 73 points from his slugging, with only 8XBH (6XBH in last 7G), but his OBP has dipped only 13 points in that time (30BB in 133PA) and he still leads the IL in OPS by 36 points (.956). He ranks 3rd in the IL in walks (82; 18%, leads IL) and with one more team walk, the Clippers will set a club record (had 741BB in 1983).

Kentucky Blues

Kyle Manzardo was only 4x23 (.174) last week, collecting most of his hits on Friday (three hitless games; had three hitless games in 26 prior). Since 8/30, Manzardo has advanced only one base on 13 of his last 14 hits (solo HR on 9/3 vs. Iowa), as his Columbus single total has crept up to 96 (100XBH, slugging has dipped from .562 to .539). His 31RBI since his option on 8/3 rank 3rd in the IL.

Twenty Town

Kody Huff crushed his 22nd homer on Sunday (.354, 23x65, 3HR, .600SLG since 8/23), four more than the prior four years combined. **Cooper Ingle** poked his 20th on Friday, as Columbus has four players with at least 20 and one more with 19 (**Kahlil Watson** hit 19th last Sunday), marking the second time in history (2019) the Clippers have five players with at least 19HR (never had five with at least 20HR).

Capitalizing

George Valera has played sparingly since 7/28, appearing in only 18 of 40G, but he has slashed .377/.469/.797 with 7HR and 17RBI when he does take the field (hit .148/.250/.182 with 0HR and 7RBI in 26G prior, 6/10-7/26). The hot streak includes hits in 16 of 18G and, dating to a game prior, he has reached base in 19 straight (.459OBP). In his Clipper career, he has hammered 50HR (t-16th all time).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino is a pair of steals short of 20 (3SB, 0CS in last 24G), as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history (reached 20 with 3SB in last 4G of last year). He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is tied for the IL lead with 42HR (t-25th with 38SB). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 19HR (career high, had 11HR through 5/29) and 22SB.

This Date in Clipper History

9/15/1979

In Game Seven of the Governors' Cup Finals, **Roger Holt's** RBI single in the bottom of the 12th secured Columbus' first IL title as the Clippers came away with a 4-3 win. It was the last Finals in IL history to reach seven games, as the best-of-five format would be adopted for the 1981 season (in 1980, Columbus won the Cup 4-1 over Toledo, thus becoming the last team in IL history to win four games in the Finals).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,496 to 1,450).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 196-152 (.562) in pitch reviews, with batters going 98-90 (.516) and pitchers/catchers going 98-63 (.609). They have run out of challenges in 49G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 841, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 167 through 141G (on pace for 174SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 52CS so far, the Clippers have the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (2024; on pace for 54CS).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 192 runs while crafting a .879OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 131 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +61 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 319-209 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,005RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.37 through 141G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 197HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 78G this season (44-34, .571), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 11th most last at bat wins this year (15, six off the lead) while playing in the 14th most games decided in the last at bat (29, Norfolk has 42). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 103G decided in the last at bat (3rd most in the IL), going 49-54 (.476, 17th best winning percentage; 6th most wins, 3rd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 461-472 (.494), 431-426 with Columbus (.503).
