# HIGH-A INFORMATION

On February 12, 2021, Major League Baseball announced its new plan for affiliated baseball, with 120 Minor League clubs officially agreeing to join the new Professional Development League (PDL).

In total, the new player development system includes 179 teams across 17 leagues in 43 states and four provinces. Including the ACL and FCL, there are 209 teams across 19 leagues in 44 states and four provinces. That includes the 150 teams in the PDL and ACL/FCL along with the four partner leagues: the American Association, Atlantic League, Frontier League and Pioneer League. After the MLB Draft in July, that number will increase to 215 teams as the MLB Draft League will transition from amateur to professional players, a new twist implemented for the 2022 season.



The long-time High-A structure of the California, Carolina and Florida State Leagues was replaced by High-A East, High-A Central and High-A West for one year in 2021 before reverting to more historical Minor League names in 2022. The new South Atlantic League consists of 12 teams -- three from the former Short-Season A New York-Penn League (Aberdeen, Brooklyn and Hudson Valley), two from the old Carolina League (Wilmington and Winston-Salem), six from the old Single-A South Atlantic League (Asheville, Greensboro, Greenville, Hickory, Jersey Shore and Rome) and one from the old Single-A Midwest League (Bowling Green). The new Midwest League (High-A Central) is comprised of 12 former Midwest League clubs, while the new Northwest League (High-A West) is a six-team circuit of former Northwest League teams.

These changes were made to help reduce travel and allow Major League teams to have their affiliates, in most cases, within 200 miles of the parent club (or play at their Spring Training facilities).

## DID YOU KNOW?

The 2013 and 2014 Aberdeen IronBirds seasons were the subject of a 2021 book written by Greg Larson, the former home clubhouse attendant at Ripken Stadium. "Clubbie: A Minor League Baseball Memoir" chronicles the struggles of the many minor league players Larson came in contact with in his time in Aberdeen -- from adjusting to playing professional baseball, to the simpler struggle of finding housing. Larson tries to bring attention to the hot-button issues of minor league pay and living conditions through telling the stories of the players in his book.

The IronBirds were one of three former New York-Penn League franchises added to the new High-A East during the re-organization of the minor leagues in 2020. They joined their McNamara Division rival Brooklyn Cyclones and the Renegades in the new league.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Maimonides Park, the home of the Brooklyn Cyclones is built on the western end of the Coney Island boardwalk, on the site of what was once Steeplechase Park. Steeplechase Park was created in 1897 and operated until 1964, and was the first of the three large amusement parks built on Coney Island, and it's 67-year run made it the longest-lasting. It quickly gained popularity as a family-friendly destination with exhibitionist and risqué undertones. Steeplechase Park was destroyed by a fire in 1907, but was quickly rebuilt and remained profitable for years. The park closed in 1964 as it became unprofitable due to high crime, suburban flight, and the area's trend toward residential development. Developer Fred Trump purchased the land for residential use, but it never came to pass. Throughout the 80s and 90s there was debate about what to do with the land, and eventually Maimonides Park was built in 2001. The lone remaining portion of Steeplechase Park is the Parachute Jump, which still stands visible down the right field line at the park.

## DID YOU KNOW?

The New York Yankees have a long history of being affiliated with a Minor League club in Greensboro, N.C. From 1958 through 1967, the Greensboro Yankees competed in the Class B (58-62) and later Class A (63-67) Carolina League. After a hiatus, the team returned to Greensboro from 1980 through 1984 under the moniker of the Greensboro Hornets competing in the Class A South Atlantic League. The Bronx Bombers once again returned for their most-recent engagement from 1990 through 2002, when the Hornets (re-named the Greensboro Bats in 1994) were the Yankees Low-A club in the Sally League.

Notable players to pass through Greensboro under the Yankees affiliation include Hall of Famers Derek Jeter (92-93) and Mariano Rivera (91, 93), and All-Stars Tom Tresh (59), Jim Bouton (60), Mel Stottlemyre (62), Roy White (62-63), Fritz Peterson (65), Rex Hudler (80), Otis Nixon (80), Don Mattingly (80), Greg Gagne (80-81), Mike Pagliarulo (82), Roberto Kelly (83), Sterling Hitchcock (90), Russ Springer (90), Carl Everett (91), Andy Pettitte (92), Jorge Posada (92), Mike Lowell (96), Nick Johnson (97), and Robinson Cano (02). In 1993, Jeter infamously made 56 errors while playing shortstop for the Hornets at War Memorial Stadium, an historical venue built in 1926 and still in use today by North Carolina A&T University.

## DID YOU KNOW?

The field at Frawley Stadium is named Judy Johnson Field, in honor of Baseball Hall of Fame third baseman Judy Johnson. Elected in 1975, Johnson played 17 seasons for the Atlantic City Bacharach Giants, Hilldale Daisies, Homestead Grays, Pittsburgh Crawfords and New York Cubans in the Negro Major Leagues and in Cuba. Following his retirement as a ballplayer, Johnson served as a scout for several MLB teams and was hired as an assistant coach for the 1954 Philadelphia Athletics, becoming one of the first African-American coaches in the American or National Leagues.

# SAL RULES & UMPIRES

## HIGH-A EXPERIMENTAL PLAYING RULES

On March 14, 2022, Major League Baseball announced a variety of experimental playing rules that were approved by the Competition Committee and the Playing Rules Committee for use during the 2022 Minor League season. Many experimental rules were first tested on a limited basis in 2021. The use of the most promising rules has been expanded to additional levels of play, providing more players and fans with exposure to the rules and allowing the Competition Committee to better evaluate the impact of each on game play. Here is a summary of the experimental rules that will be tested in High-A East during the 2023 Minor League season:

- **PITCH TIMER:** On-field timers will be used at all full-season affiliates to enforce regulations designed to create a crisp pace of play, with batters required to be ready to hit and pitchers required to deliver the pitch within allotted periods of time. With runners on base, pitchers will have additional allotted time for each pitch but will risk automatic baserunner advancement if a third pick-off attempt or step-off within the same plate appearance is made without recording an out. These rules were used in tandem in the Low-A West and the Arizona Fall League in 2021 and led to a significant improvement in pace of play and a reduction in average game time of more than 20 minutes.
- **LARGER BASES:** The size of first, second and third base will be increased from 15 inches square to 18 inches square at all full-season affiliates to reduce player injuries. Bigger bases were used in 2021 at the Triple-A level and in the Arizona Fall League, and were associated with a decrease in the severity of base-related injuries. In addition, the reduction in distance between bases led to a modest increase in the rate of successful stolen base attempts. Larger bases will be adopted at all levels of the Minor Leagues and Major League Baseball in 2023.
- **DEFENSIVE POSITIONING:** In Double-A, High-A and Low-A, the defensive team must have a minimum of four players on the infield, with at least two infielders completely on either side of second base. These restrictions on defensive positioning are intended to allow infielders to better showcase their athleticism, to increase batting average on balls in play, and to restore a more traditional set of aesthetics and outcomes on batted balls. Defensive positioning regulations will be adopted at all levels of the Minor Leagues and Major League Baseball in 2023.
