## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints were in a 2-2 game going into the eighth inning, but allowed five runs in the bottom of the inning to drop to Indianapolis 7-2. The Saints also drop the series in Indy, losing their fourth straight game, their longest skid of the season. Simeon Woods Richardson allowed two runs over 5.0 innings, striking out six. Tony Kemp hit his first home run of the season in the second inning to give the Saints a 1-0 lead in the second. Indy responded in the bottom half to tie the game. DaShawn Keirsej Jr. Put St. Paul back in front in the fourth with a double, which would be the last lead the Saints would hold. Hobie Harris took the loss, allowing four earned runs in the eighth. The series loss is the first on the road for the Saints this year.

**ROUGH WEEK IN INDY:** The offensive woes have continued in Indianapolis, where the Saints have hit .197 this week, the second-lowest average in the International League. It's also the sixth-lowest batting average for any series in franchise history. The Saints have 25 hits in this series, with 11 coming in the first game. The Saints also have the second-lowest exit velocity in the IL this week, with an average of 84.6 miles per hour. The 44 strikeouts in the series are also the second-most in the IL.

**ST. PAUL SPEEDSTERS:** In their first 21 steal attempts this year, the Saints did not get thrown out, until DaShawn Keirsej Jr. was caught attempting to take third base on Friday. The Saints perfect 21-for-21 start ties the best for any Triple-A team since 2005 (as far as minor league stats go back). Sacramento was successful on their first 21 attempts this year, matching the Saints. The only minor league teams to beat that mark are the 23 consecutive steals to open the year by the 2014 Wilmington Blue Rocks and the 25 stolen bases by the 2007 Elizabethton Twins, holding the minor league record since 2005.

**OFFENSIVE STRUGGLES:** The Saints offense has continued to struggle in the early goings of 2024, slashing .212/.313/.362, all last International League. The 76 runs the Saints have scored are the third-fewest in the IL. The 16 double plays the team has hit into are tied for the most in the league. The Saints are joined by Louisville and Memphis as the only IL teams to record 10 runs in only one game this season.

**ONE IS THE LONELIEST RUN:** The 1-0 defeat for the Saints on Wednesday was just the eighth game in franchise history to be decided by a 1-0 final. The Saints are now 3-5 in 1-0 games. Wednesday's contest was just the second in franchise history to be scoreless after eight innings, joining July 18, 2023 at Omaha. The Saints were also walked off 1-0 in that game.

**REHAB ROUNDTABLE:** The Minnesota Twins sent outfielder Max Kepler to St. Paul for a rehab assignment on Thursday for a right knee contusion sustained on April 7. This will be Kepler's second career rehab stint with St. Paul, with the other coming in June of 2021. Josh Staumont's rehab assignment ended on Friday and was optioned to St. Paul.

**PRATO PACES THE BASES:** Once again, Anthony Prato has displayed his ability to reach base, leading the team with 17 walks, the second-most in the International League. Prato's .475 on-base percentage is the eighth-best in the IL. He has reached base in his first 14 games that he has played in this year, a streak that is tied for the fourth-longest streak in the IL. Prato had a .452 OBP in 72 games with the Saints last year and has a career .457 OBP in Triple-A.

**GO, DIEGO, GO:** Diego A. Castillo recorded four hits in the Saints victory on Sunday, the 29<sup>th</sup> four-hit game in franchise history and the 10<sup>th</sup> of Castillo's career. He followed that with a three-hit game to open the series in Indianapolis. Castillo is snapped his seven-game hit streak on Friday, going 12-for-29 (.414) with a triple, two home runs with one walk and three strikeouts in that span.

**WE JUST WANT TO GO HOME:** Two Saints baserunners were cut down at home plate on Friday in their 6-0 loss to Iowa. It's the second time in franchise history that the Saints had two runners cut down at home, with the other coming May 28, 2023 against Omaha. It marks just the sixth time in the International League since 2021 where multiple runners have been thrown out at home on outfield assists.

**RACKING UP K'S:** The Saints struck out 15 Iowa Cubs on April 13, doing so for the third time in the series. They struck out 15 batters in consecutive games on April 9 and 10, the second time in franchise history the club has recorded 15 strikeouts in back-to-back games, matching May 22-23, 2021 against Indianapolis. It's also the fourth time this season and the 17<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history that the Saints struck out 15 batters. The Saints are now 10-7 in games which they strike out 15 hitters. Saints' pitchers are tied for sixth in Triple-A with 186 strikeouts. Their 122 swinging strikeouts are the sixth-most in Triple-A.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Twins dropped to the Tigers 5-4 on Friday night. The game was tied 4-4 going into the ninth, then Wenceel Pérez singled off Caleb Thielbar to give Detroit the lead. Trevor Larnach gave the Twins an early lead with a two-run homer in the first inning. Joe Ryan allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, striking out six.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 4/9 v IOWA...made second start of the season, allowed eight runs, tying career-high on ten hits, three of which were home runs, tying a career-high and struck out seven...six of eight runs were allowed in the first two innings...all three home runs were allowed in the second inning, first to Luis Vazquez to lead off the inning, followed by back-to-back homers by Patrick Wisdom and Matt Mervis later in the inning...bequeathed one runner to Michael Boyle, which scored on a home run...took first loss of the season in 9-7 Saints' defeat

**WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP:** Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

**SOMETHINGS BREWING:** One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

**GIVE BACK:** Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
