TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST GAME'S RESULT - Four St. Paul Saints pitchers combined on an eight-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over the Omaha Storm Chasers on Saturday night at Werner Park. Ariel Jurado (4.0 IP), Juan Minaya (2.0 IP), Evan Sisk (2.0 IP), and Michael Feliz (1.0 IP) combined on the shutout. Jermaine Palacios slugged two home runs and the Saints hit four home runs overall.

CENTRAL PLANNING: The month of August will be easy on the travel for the St. Paul Saints. They will not leave the central time zone. Their road schedule takes them to their two closest opponents, Omaha and Iowa, and they have a two week homestand against Columbus and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

LONG NIGHTMARE IS OVER: For the first time this season, the St. Paul Saints threw a shutout on Saturday night, August 6 @ Omaha. It's their first shutout since September 30, 2021 at Toledo, a span of 105 games. With the Saints shutout, there are now only three teams that have not thrown a shutout in full-season Minor League Baseball: Chattanooga Lookouts, Columbia Fireflies, and Visalia Rawhide.

HE'S OUR PAL: For the second time this season, Jermaine Palacios had a multi-homer game. He becomes the third Saints player this season with a multiple, multi-homer games joining Michael Helman, who has three, and Alex Kirilloff, who has two. Last season Damek Tomscha and Jimmy Kerrigan each had two, two-homer games while David Bañuelos has a multi-homer game last season and this season.

MUSCLING UP: The St. Paul Saints are putting together another impressive home run streak. With their four home runs on Saturday night, the Saints have homered in six straight games. Not only that, but they have six consecutive multi-homer games, hammering 18 long balls during that span. It surpasses their franchise record of five straight multi-homer games from July 17-22, 2021 and June 2-7, 2022.

WE WANT SOME MO: Roy Morales collected five RBI on Friday, August 5 @ Omaha. The five RBI set a career high and it was the seventh time this season the Saints have had a player collect five RBI (Jermaine Palacios twice, Tim Beckham, Calbe Hamilton, Alex Kirilloff, and Spencer Steer). The seven games with a player collecting at least five RBI is tied for the most in the International League with the Omaha Storm Chasers.

HAMMING IT UP: Caleb Hamilton is having a career year, but more specifically he has been red hot in his last 11 games. He is riding a career high 11-game hitting streak (13-42, .310), but more impressively he had an extra base hit in the first nine games (five doubles and four home runs). It was tied for the longest extra base hit streak in Minor League Baseball this season within one level of play (Niko Kavadas had seven straight in his final seven games with Single-A Salem and then in his first four games at High-A Greenville). He also collected an RBI in a career high seven straight from July 7-August 5.

GIVING THE STORM CHASERS HEL(MAN): Michael Helman is extremely comfortable in his home state. He collected five hits in five at bats on Tuesday, August 2 and in his first at bat on August 3 @ Omaha he homered. The six consecutive at bats with a hit set a new franchise record. Jose Miranda and Tomas Telis each collected a hit in five straight at bats in 2021. For the series, Helman is 11-26 (.423) with two doubles, a triple, four home runs, seven RBI, and eight runs scored.

THE NINTH WAVE: The ninth inning has been a big inning for the Saints this season. They have hit 15 ninth inning home runs, good for fourth in Minor League Baseball. Their .880 OPS in the ninth is also fourth best.

LOCKED IN WHEN LOADED: Jermaine Palacios crushed a walk-off grand slam on July 31 vs. Iowa. It was the seventh grand slam hit by the Saints this season and the seventh of Palacios' career. The seven grand slams are tied with Columbus for the most in the International League and are tied for the fourth most in Minor League Baseball only behind Albuquerque (11), Eugene, and Reno (8), and tied with Lake County and Hickory (7). The Saints are fourth in full-season Minor League Baseball with a .371 average and second best OPS at 1.161 with the bases loaded.

RUN LIKE THE WIND: Since the month of July started, the Saints have been widely successful at stealing bases. They have swiped 25 bags in 26 opportunities, a 96.2% success rate. It is the best percentage in all of Minor League Baseball in that time.

RISPY (WITH 2 OUTS) BUSINESS: The St. Paul Saints have struggled with runners in scoring position and two outs. With RISP/2 outs this season, opponents are hitting .267 against the Saints, tied for 8th worst in all of Minor League Baseball behind El Paso (.296), Tacoma (.296), Las Vegas (.281), Greenville (.276), Memphis (.273), Bowie (.272), Albuquerque (.270), and tied with Sacramento.

FIRST INNING FLOP: The St. Paul Saints have allowed at least one run in the first inning in 44 of 102 games (43.4%). They have allowed 89 runs in the first, most in the International League and tied for fourth most in all of Minor League Baseball behind Albuquerque (112) and Stockton (107), and Binghamton (90). Their 25 home runs allowed are tied for third most in Minor League Baseball.

EXTRA EXTRA READ ALL ABOUT IT: The St. Paul Saints have played 102 games this season and have an extra base hit in all, but one game. They have an extra base hit in 94 consecutive games, the second longest streak in all of Minor League Baseball. The only team with a longer streak is El Paso's who has an extra base hit in all 104 games they have played. The lone game they didn't collect an extra base hit was the game they were no-hit on April 13 vs. Indianapolis. They have just one extra base hit in only 10 games.

TWINS UPDATE - The Minnesota Twins took it to the Toronto Blue Jays 7-3 on Saturday night at Target Field. Luis Arraez went 3-5 with two doubles and an RBI while Jorge Polanco went 2-5 with a double and two RBI. Jose Miranda and Nick Gordon also collected two hits. Dylan Bundy allowed two runs over 4.0 innings while the bullpen allowed one run in 5.0 innings.

START PRIOR: 7/15 vs. CWS...pitched 3.0 innings allowing two runs on five hits while walking two and striking out one...did not receive a decision in a 6-2 White Sox victory.

A PITCHER YOU ROOT FOR: When Smeltzer was just nine years old, he was diagnosed with pelvic rhabdomyosarcoma (bladder cancer), as a tumor had formed against his bladder that was connected to his prostate. He underwent surgery and chemotherapy at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, PA, and sent the cancer into full remission in 2012.

PHILLIE FAN(ATIC): During his time with cancer, Devin took a photo with the Phillies Cole Hamels. He also received encouragement and an autograph from Chase Utley when he was 10 on a trip to Citizens Bank Park. Fast forward to 2018 when Hamels was in spring training with the Dodgers and who else was on that team? That's right, Chase Utley. The two reunited 13 years later at Spring Training in Arizona.

CATCH CANCER LOOKING: The lefty, who's worn glasses and a goatee for the majority of his professional career, continues to offer support to others fighting cancer through his Catch Cancer Looking apparel with his likeness. All proceeds benefit Katie's Crusaders, an organization focused on helping cover expenses for pediatric cancer survivors.

#NEVERFORGET: -Smeltzer writes the names of fellow cancer patients under the brim of his cap of both survivors and those that didn't make it. He started this at the age of 10 and did that as recently as 2018. Since then he carries a hat that has a bunch of names on it and puts it on his top shelf with all his other hats in his locker.

THE-OUT-OF-TOWNER: Believe it or not, Smeltzer had never stepped foot in New York City, that is until he pitched in Game 2 of the American League Division Series at Yankee Stadium against the New York Yankees. The New York crowd didn't phase Smeltzer as he went 3.1 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts in a Twins 8-2 defeat.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB: Devin made his Major League debut with the Minnesota Twins on May 28, 2019 vs. Milwaukee. All he did was go 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits, no walks, and seven strikeouts. He became fourth Twins starter in history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1 on August 6, 2013), Anthony Swarzak (7.0 on May 23, 2009) and Eric Milton (6.0 on April 5, 1998). His seven strikeouts were one shy of the franchise record in a debut (Boof Bonser set by Boof Bonser on May 21, 2006 at Milwaukee).

FLY LIKE AN EAGLE: Following his high school career at Bishop Eustace (NJ) Preparatory School in 2014, Smeltzer was drafted in the 33rd round by the Chicago Cubs. Smeltzer elected not to sign with the Cubs and instead went to school at Florida Gulf Coast University. After one season, however, Smeltzer transferred to San Jacinto (TX) JC so that he would be eligible for the draft after two years instead of three. The moved paid off when the Lose Angeles Dodgers selected him in the 5th round of the 2016 draft.

CAREER NOTES

- Pitched in one game for the Minnesota Twins in 2021 before being optioned back to the alternate training site on April 25. He was recalled from the Saints on May 6, but never pitched in a game for the Twins. Was placed on 10-day Injured List on May 12 with left elbow inflammation; missed remainder of season
- Made the Twins Opening Day roster in 2020 for the first time in his career
- Earned the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week and Southern League Pitcher of the Week April 14, 2019 after making two starts, going 2-0, 0.00 ERA (14.0 IP) with five hits allowed, two walks and 17 strikeouts
- Earned first major league win August 4, 2019 vs. Kansas City, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and four strikeouts in a 3-0 Twins victory
- Became just the fifth Twins pitcher to record seven-or-more strikeouts in a debut on May 28, 2019, joining Bonser (8, in 20016), Yohan Pino (7 in 2014), Darrell Jackson (7 in 1978) and Bert Blyleven (7 in 1970)
- Had five overall stints with the Twins in 2019, going 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA (49.0 IP, 21 ER), 12 walks and 38 strikeouts in 11 games (6 starts)
- Traded from the Los Angeles Dodgers, along with 2B Logan Forsyth and OF Luke Raley in exchange for 2B Brian Dozier on July 31, 2018
- Started 2017 with Low-A Great Lakes (Los Angeles Dodgers), where he pitched in 10 games (all starts), and allowed 22 earned runs in 52.1 innings pitched (3.78 ERA). He was promoted to High-A Rancho Cucamonga, where he pitched in 16 games (15 starts), amassing a 5-4 record with a 4.40 ERA (90.0 IP, 44 ER), 102 strikeouts and just 18 walks
- Made professional debut with Rookie AZL Dodgers in 2016, pitching 11 games out of the bullpen and yielding 10 runs (9 earned) in 10.2 innings pitched
