### Today's Game

The Fightin Phils are home and continue a six-game series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. It is the eighth-of-12 matchups between the teams this season and second-of-six at FirstEnergy Stadium. The teams split their series in Bowie from July 8-13 and Chesapeake leads the season-series 4-3.

### Game 119 Recap

The Fightin Phils dropped their third-straight game on Tuesday night, a 5-2 loss to the Chesapeake Baysox to open this week's six-game series. Both Estibenzon Jimenez and Blake Money did not allow a run through the game's first four innings. In the bottom of the fifth, Nick Dunn doubled and Aidan Miller walked and stole second to put runners on second and third. Felix Reyes then delivered a two-run single to put Reading on top 2-0. In the top of the sixth, Brandon Butterworth singled off Jimenez and Reed Trimble hit a two-run home run to tie the game at two. Jimenez lasted six innings, allowing two runs on five hits, with no walks and four strikeouts in a no-decision. Chesapeake tacked on two more in the top of the eighth thanks to a two-out double from Trimble that scored Austin Overn. The Baysox then tacked on two more in the top of the ninth with two unearned runs off Andrew Baker, scoring on a two-run double from Brandon Butterworth to extend the lead to 5-2. Felix Reyes had two hits and two RBI in the win.

### The 50 Club

Aidan Miller stole his 50th base of the season on Tuesday night against Chesapeake. Miller is the first Fightin Phil since Jose Leiva in 1987 to steal 50 bases in a season. Entering play tonight, Miller ranks tied for seventh for most stolen bases in a single season in R-Phils history, trailing sixth place David Mann, who had 53 in 1957 for sixth place. Miller paces both the Eastern League and all Phillies Minor League players in stolen bases. The last time a Phillies Minor League stole 50+ bases in a season was Emaarion Boyd (56) in 2023. The last time a player in the Eastern League had over 50 swiped bags in a season was Portland's David Hamilton (70) in 2022.

### It's Miller Time

For the second time in three weeks, Phillies No. 2 prospect Aidan Miller was named Eastern League Player of the Week on Monday. It was also the third-straight week a Fightin Phil received league honors, as Griff McGarry was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week last Monday. Over six games at Altoona last week, Miller posted a .522 average (12-23), along with a 1.621 OPS. He added five runs, five doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and two stolen bases. He had hits in all six games and had three hits on Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday. He also had two home runs on Thursday night, marking the first multi-homer game of Miller's pro career; and according to Miller, it's the first time he hit two home runs in a game in his life. Over 21 August games, the 2023 first round pick is slashing .365/.466/.659 (1.125 OPS), with 22 runs, 13 doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI and 13 stolen bases. For the month of August, Miller is 3rd in the Eastern League in average (.365), T-3rd RBI (16), 2nd OBP (.466), 2nd SLG (.659), 1st OPS (1.125), 2nd hits (31), T-1st 2B (13), 1st XBH (17), 2nd TB (56), 1st runs (22) and T-2nd SB (13). On the season, Miller is fifth in the Eastern League in OBP (.371), 9th OPS (.792), 8th 2B (24), T-2nd BB (63), T-8th XBH (38), 10th TB (161), 3rd runs (65) and 1st SB (50).

### King Felix

Felix Reyes turned in another stellar week at Altoona. Over six games, Reyes .400 (10-25), with a .943 OPS. He added four runs, three doubles and two RBI. Over 23 August games, Felix Reyes is slashing .392/.415/.588 (1.003 OPS), with 20 runs, 13 doubles, two homers and 22 RBI. His Eastern League ranks in August are: 1st AVG (.392), 1st RBI (22), 8th OBP (.415), 4th SLG (.588), 5th OPS (.1.003), 1st hits (38), T-1st 2B (13), 2nd XBH (15), 1st TB (57) and 2nd runs (20). Reyes turned in his second-straight three-hit game last Friday night. It was the 13th game this year that Reyes had 3+ hits. Reyes now qualifies to be ranked amongst the Eastern League leaders and holds the following ranks on the season: 1st AVG (.336), 6th OBP (.368), 1st SLG (.566), 1st OPS (.934), 7th hits (102), 3rd 2B (28), T-3rd XBH (43) and 4th total bases (172). Reyes' .336 average would be the third highest single-season batting average in R-Phils history. He leads the league in average by 30 points with 17 games to go. The last Fightin Phil to win an Eastern League batting title was Tagg Bozied in 2010. A R-Phil has won a batting title just four times, dating back to 1967.

### Ricketts Rolling

With a base hit on Tuesday night, Caleb Ricketts extended his hitting streak to 14 games (since Aug. 3). It is the longest hitting streak by a Fightin Phil this season, surpassing Keaton Anthony's 12-game hit streak from May 22-June 4. Over his 14-game hit streak, Ricketts is slashing .339/.391/.542 (.933 OPS), with 10 runs, six doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI. Ricketts' hit streak is Reading's longest since Carlos De La Cruz had 15 from 5/23-6/9, of the 2023 season.

### This Day in Baseballtown History

**August 27, 2012:** At Reading, the Phils beat Binghamton, 4-1, behind a strong performance by Trevor May and another homer run by Darin Ruf. May fans 9 while surrendering just one run on two hits over 8.0 innings for his 10th win.

### Coming from the Bay

Chesapeake enters tonight with a 51-68 overall record and 20-32 mark in the second half, which is last in the Southwest Division. The Baysox finished off a two-week homestand against Richmond last week, splitting the series with the Flying Squirrels. After this week, Chesapeake returns home and takes on Harrisburg in its final homestand of the season. The Baysox roster features nine of the Baltimore Orioles' top-30 prospects: Enrique Bradfield Jr. (4), Michael Forret (11), Juaron Watts-Brown (13), Nestor German (14), Braxton Bragg (15), Levi Wells (22), Patrick Reilly (23), Aron Estrada (25) and Austin Overn (30).

### On the Mound for Chesapeake

Righty Zach Fruit makes his 10th appearances/ninth start for Chesapeake tonight. He is 0-4, with an 8.04 ERA (28 ER, 31. IP) for the Baysox. Last Wednesday against Richmond, Fruit did not allow a run over 4.1 innings, with four strikeouts. Fruit began the season with Chesapeake and was placed on the IL on Apr. 23. After rehabbing with Aberdeen (A+), Fruit was activated on July 18. Fruit spent all of 2024 with Aberdeen, going 3-4, with a 3.03 ERA over 25 games and 21 starts. The Orioles took the 25-year old in the ninth round of the 2023 draft out of Troy. He pitched for Eastern Michigan from 2021-22 and Troy in 2023.
