YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Fightin Phils, 4-2. Reading took a 3-0 lead in the third with a solo homer by Paul McIntosh and a two-run shot by Jose Rodriguez. In the fourth, Alex Binelas opened the lead to 4-0 with a sacrifice fly. The Flying Squirrels scored their only runs of the game with back-to-back solo homers by Carter Howell and Victor Bericoto in the sixth inning. John Michael Bertrand retired the final nine batters he faced in his six-inning start. Dylan Hecht struck out two in a scoreless seventh. Tyler Myrick threw two scoreless innings.

WALK IT OFF: On Friday, Jairo Pomares hit the first walk-off homer for the Flying Squirrels since a grand slam by Will Wilson against the Altoona Curve on April 17, 2022. It was also the third pinch-hit walk-off homer in franchise history. The others were both pinch-hit grand slams, the first by Ryder Jones to beat the Curve on Sept. 3, 2016 and the other was by Jacob Heyward in the 10th inning to tope Erie on August 19, 2019. Overall, the homer by Pomares was the 11th walk-off home run in Flying Squirrels free blief between franchise history

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play finale of a six-game series against the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies. This is the only series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels are 15-5 against the Fightin Phils since the start of the 2023 season, including a 10-4 record at The Diamond. In 2023, the Flying Squirrels swept Reading in three games to open the season and won five-of-six in a series at FirstEnergy Stadium. Last year, they went 5-1 in a six-game series in their only series against Reading, with the Fightin Phils avoiding a sweep with a win in the fifth game. The Flying Squirrels are looking for their second series split of 2025.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,621 fans per home game, which ranks fifth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won their first series of the season last week, taking three-of-five against Altoona on the road. In that series, both teams were held to two-or-less runs in four-of-five games. Of Richmond's 49 losses this season, 26 of them have been by two runs or less (18 by one, eight by two). Their 18 one-run losses are the most in the EL, two ahead of Reading (16). The Richmond offense is last in the Eastern League in runs scored (234). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.60 ERA.

THE FIGHTIN PHILS: went 2-4 in last week's home series against the Yard Goats and finished the first half 25-42, last in the Northeast Division. Reading's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects list, including SS Aidan Miller (No. 2), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 13), SS Carson DeMartini (No. 16), RHP Daniel Harper (No. 23), OF Hendry Mendez (No. 27) and RHP Griff McGarry (No. 29). There are also five players featured in MLB.com's top-30 Phillies prospects list, including Miller (No. 2), Cabrera (No. 11), DeMartini (No. 15), Mendez (No. 25) and C Caleb Ricketts (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 16, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.89 ERA (27 ER/84.0 IP) in 10 games. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 0.68 ERA (3 ER/40.0 IP) in that stretch. Richmond's 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) in last week's road set at Altoona was their lowest of the season for a series and the best in the Eastern League for the week. The previous low was a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) in their six-game series from April 15-20 against Chesapeake at The Diamond.

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Manuel Mercedes makes his 14th Double-A start and his second against the Fightin Phils. He started the first game of the series on Tuesday and allowed six runs over 5.1 innings in a loss. In his previous two starts on June 11 against Binghamton and June 18 at Altoona, he combined to go 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 ER/12.0 IP). He leads the Richmond starting rotation with three wins this season. Mercedes spent all of last season with High-A Eugene, going 4-9 with a 5.28 ERA. He was tied for second in the Northwest League in games started (25) and ranked fifth in innings pitched (116.0). Mercedes spent the prior two seasons with Low-A San Jose. In 2023, he went 3-6 with a 3.64 ERA in 25 outings (21 starts). He signed with the Giants in their 2019 international class. For more on Mercedes, see page two.

FOR READING: Right-hander Jean Cabrera makes his 15th start of the season and the second of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In the first game of the series on Tuesday, Cabrera allowed two runs over six innings in a win, striking out three. Last year, he went 6-5 with a 3.80 ERA in 20 outings (19 starts), starting the season with High-A Jersey Shore before being promoted to Double-A Reading in July. Cabrera signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2019. He is rated by Baseball America as the No. 13 Phillies prospect and No. 11 by MLB.com.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 40 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 27 runners caught stealing. Morgan, who was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on June 10, is seventh in the Eastern League with 12. Perez threw out his first base-stealing attempt on Wednesday.

GO, DIEGO, GO!: Diego Velasquez is batting .324 (22-for-68) in his last 18 games since June 6 with two doubles, three RBIs, 11 walks and eight runs scored. In that span, he has at least one hit in 14-of-18 games and multiple hits in seven games. He went 0-for-4 on Saturday to span his team-leading 14-game on-base streak that dated back to June 10, which was the longest by a Richmond player this season. His 13-game on-base streak from April 18-May 5 is tied for the second-longest on the team in 2025. In the Eastern League this season, Velasquez is fifth in hits (70), seventh in OBP (.381), tied for seventh in walks (38) and 10th in batting average (.281). Since his Double-A debut on July 24, 2024, Velasquez is ranked third in the Eastern League in batting average (.293), second in OBP (.384), second in hits (116), tied for fifth in walks (54), tied for seventh in total bases (139) and ninth in OPS (.735).

BERI BOMBS: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** has homered twice in his last four games. He hit a solo homer on Wednesday and added another on Saturday. He has six homers with the Flying Squirrels this season, giving him 28 for his Richmond career dating back to 2023, which is the fourth-most in franchise history. He is two homers behind third-place **Jarrett Parker** (30). Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels on June 3.

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever Braxton Roxby closed his third save of the season on Sunday in Richmond's 2-1 win at Altoona. In that outing, he allowed an earned run for the first time since April 29 after throwing 13 consecutive games without surrendering an earned run, spanning 18 innings. In that stretch, the only two runs he surrendered were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27 against the Senators. In his last 15 outings since April 29, Roxby is 3-0 with a 0.43 ERA (1 ER/21.0) with 24 strikeouts and six walks. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 20 IP) this season, Roxby's 1.24 ERA is ranked fifth.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked fifth in hits (70), seventh in OBP (,381), tied for seventh in walks (38) and 10th in batting average (.281). Seth Lonsway is sixth in innings pitched (70.1) and seventh in ERA (3.45). John Michael Bertrand is first in innings pitched (78.0). Jack Choate is tied for eighth in strikeouts (67). Joe Whitman is tied for a till be in strikeouth (65).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 227 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 5), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Sabin Ceballos (No. 21) and Jack Choate (No. 26). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1968: The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 3-1, at Parker Field. Skip Guinn, pitching with Richmond for the first time that season, started for Richmond and struck out seven over four scoreless innings. He had only pitched five innings over the previous five weeks with Atlanta. Conrad Noessel threw the final five innings and allowed one run. Adrian Garrett hit a sacrifice fly and Gil Garrido hit an RBI single to open a 2-0 Richmond lead in the seventh. Mike De La Hoz hit a solo homer in the eighth to open a 3-0 lead. Toledo scored its only run in the ninth after three straight singles, with Bill Fulk driving in the run. 1970: The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 13-0, at Parker Field. Julio Navarro, who was 36 years old and in his 16th professional season dating back to 1955, threw a four-hit shutout. Three of the hits came in the ninth inning. Ralph Garr opened the scoring with a two-run homer in the second. In the fourth, Bob Turzilli hit an RBI single, Vic LaRose worked a bases-loaded walk and Darrell Evans hit a two-run single to extend the lead to 6-0. A six-run fifth opened a 12-0 lead. Hal Breeden started the scoring in the inning with his 15th homer of the season and capped it with an RBI double. Shaun Fitzmaurice, who had just rejoined the team after a two-week stint with the Mariners at Camp Lejeune, closed the scoring with a solo homer in the sixth inning, 1986: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 8-3, at The Diamond. Fred Tiburcio hit RBI doubles in the third and fifth innings, surrounding a sacrifice fly by Paul Runge in the fourth, opening a 3-0 Richmond lead. In the bottom of the sixth inning, Kelly Heath hit an RBI double and Tiburcio hit his third double of the game, this one scoring two, to extend the lead to 6-0. The next batter, Gerald Perry, was hit by a fastball from reliever Don Gordon. Perry charged the mound and landed a left hook on Gordon as the benches emptied onto the field. Perry was ejected.
