SUGAR LAND SPACE COWBOYS (26-14) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (12-28)

Wednesday, May 15, 2024 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • RGCU Field at Isotopes Park • Albuquerque, NM Game #41, Home Game #23

RHP Misael Tamarez (3-2, 6.75) vs. RHP Karl Kauffmann (1-5, 11.32)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque dropped game one last night, 16-7, and have lost six of seven to Sugar Land on the year ... Karl Kauffmann is scheduled to take the hill for the Isotopes while Misael Tamarez is expected to start for the Space Cowboys.

THREE-BAGGERS: Willie MacIver, Aaron Schunk and Grant Lavigne all tripled for the Isotopes last night, marking the 26th time the club has recorded at least a trio of three-baggers in a game, and second this season (also: March 31 vs. El Paso).

MILB LEADERS: The Isotopes have an MiLB-leading 22 three-baggers on the year. They've tallied a triple in 15 of 40 games, including their last three.

VS. SUGAR LAND: The Space Cowboys have won 20 of their last 26 games at Isotopes Park dating back to June 30, 2022, outscoring Albuquerque 276-192.

DINGERS: The Isotopes allowed at least six home runs in a contest for the 15th time in team history and first since Aug. 16, 2023 vs. El Paso (six). Ten of the occurrences have taken place at home.

SERIES OPENERS: In a stretch that dates back to the final set of 2023, Albuquerque dropped their ninth consecutive series opener, extending a franchise-worst streak.

AT HOME: Albuquerque has trailed in all 22 home contests in 2024, while only having an advantage in 10 of them.

OPENING FRAME: Albuquerque surrendered multiple runs in the first inning for the 10th time in 2024. Overall, the club has relented 42 tallies in the opening stanza during the campaign, most in all of affiliated professional baseball. Colorado and Houston are tied for second (40).

ERRORS: Albuquerque committed two more errors last night, increasing their total to 44, most among all 30 Triple-A clubs (second-most: Scranton Wilkes Barre, 38). It was the 13th contest with multiple miscues.

MULTI-DINGERS: Last night, Pedro Leon and Shay Whitcomb became the sixth and seventh opposing players with a multi-home run contest against Albuquerque this year and first since Sam Huff on May 3 vs. Round Rock (Space Cowboys, three times, Joey Lopefido, April 12.

DUO WITH DINGERS: The last time a duo each had multiple long balls in a game versus Isotope pitching was Aug. 16, 2023 vs. El Paso (Brandon Dixon - three; Ray-Patrick Didder - two).

KB: Kris Bryant began his fourth rehab assignment with Albuquerque last night, dating back to the 2022 season. He was 0-for-2 with a walk, leaving the contest after five innings.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia went 2-for-5 last night with two RBI, both coming on infield singles. He is 9-for-26 with a triple, four homers and 13 runs batted in over his last six games.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard went 2-for-3 with a double, solo homer, and two walks. It was his 17th multi-hit game of the season, tied with Coco Montes for the club lead. Hilliard has three consecutive performances with multiple knocks for the third time in 2024 (also: April 6-10, April 23-25).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes kept a tie with Hilliard atop the team multi-hit effort log by going 2-for-4 with a double yesterday. He is batting .389 in 18 home games this season, compared to a .271 average in 16 contests on the road.

TONY: Drew Romo has produced a slash line of .421/.430/.642 with 10 doubles, a triple, three homers and 16 RBI over his last 23 games, with 13 multi-hit performances during the stretch.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk recorded his first triple of the year last night and has a modest six-game hitting streak. Is 10-for-28 (.357) during the span with three doubles, a triple, two RBI and two homers

BIG WILLIE STYLE: Willie MacIver tallied a triple and drew two walks last night and is 8-for-14 with a homer, triple and four RBI during his last four games with three mult-hit contests; Has also walked in three of his last four contests (four total).

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron registered a single Saturday and has a hit in 23 of 25 games played in 2024, including nine of his last 10 ... Since June 25, 2023, has reached base in 68 of his last 75 games.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 1st in average (.361) and T-8th in doubles (11) and hits (43) ... Aaron Schunk is T-3rd in doubles (13) ... Coco Montes is 3rd in OBP (.434), 5th in average (.336) and 7th and hits (44) ... Sam Hilliard is T-1st in total bases (89), 2nd in OPS (1.047), 3rd in XBH (22), 4th in slugging (.627), T-4th in runs (33), T-5th in hits (46) and homers (9), T-6th in triples (3), 7th in OBP (.420) and 10th in average (.324) ... Julio Carreras is T-6th in triples (3).

GET IN FRONT: In seven home games against Sugar Land this season, the Isotopes have held a lead at the end of just six innings (63 total frames), all coming in their 9-8 victory April 14.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- His 12 wins in 2019 tied him for the program record in a single season with Rich Stoll (1982-83) and Tommy Henry (2019)
- Came within one out of a nine-inning complete game shutout on May 31, 2019 against Creighton in an NCAA Tournament game

Surrendered a two-out run in third after leadoff double came around to score on RBI single (Eguy Rosario) ... Had 1-2-3 fourth after doubleplay ...
