TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints were able to grind out double-digit hits for the second-straight game, but could not contain the Indianapolis offense in a 10-6 loss on Tuesday. Diego A. Castillo and DaShawn Keirse Jr. hit back-to-back triples to start the game and take a 1-0 lead. Both sides traded runs all the way through the seventh. Castillo finished the game with a three-hit effort, doing so for the second-straight game. Will Holland clubbed his second homer of the season in the sixth inning to make cut the deficit to 7-6 but Indianapolis responded with three runs to make it 10-6 and would hang on for that final score.

ST. PAUL SPEEDSTERS: In their first 17 steal attempts this year, the Saints have yet to be thrown out. Their 17 steals are *the most in the minor leagues* without a caught stealing this season. The Saints perfect start is the best for any International League team since the Nashville Sounds started the 2022 season with 17 successful stolen bases. No IL team has successfully stolen on their first 18 attempts since 2005 (as far as minor league stats go back). Sacramento was successful on their first 21 attempts this year, which is the best mark for any Triple-A team since 2005.

PRATO PACES THE BASES: Once again, Anthony Prato has displayed his ability to reach base, leading the team with 13 walks, tied for the sixth-most in the International League. Prato's .490 on-base percentage is tied for the third-best in the IL. He has reached base in all 12 games that he has played in this year, a streak that is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the IL and the fifth-longest all season. Prato had a .452 OBP in 72 games with the Saints last year and has a career .457 OBP in Triple-A.

GO, DIEGO, GO: Diego A. Castillo recorded four hits in the Saints victory on Sunday, the 29th four-hit game in franchise history and the 10th of Castillo's career. He followed that with a three-hit game to open the series in Indianapolis. Castillo is now on a five-game hit streak, going 10-for-22 (.455) with a triple, two home runs and zero walks or strikeouts in that span.

JENSEN JAMS THEM UP: Ryan Jensen has been one of the best relievers in the International League in the early stages of 2024. His six strikeouts on Saturday match the single-game high in the IL for any relief pitcher. His 13 strikeouts ranks tied for fifth among all IL relievers. He's one of 13 pitchers in the league to have thrown at least 6.1 innings and not allow an earned run yet. His two wins are tied for the second-most in the league.

WE JUST WANT TO GO HOME: Two Saints baserunners were cut down at home plate on Friday in their 6-0 loss to Iowa. It's the second time in franchise history that the Saints had two runners cut down at home, with the other coming May 28, 2023 against Omaha. It marks just the sixth time in the International League since 2021 where multiple runners have been thrown out at home on outfield assists.

RACKING UP K's: The Saints struck out 15 Iowa Cubs on Saturday, doing so for the third time in the series. They struck out 15 batters in consecutive games on April 9 and 10, the second time in franchise history the club has recorded 15 strikeouts in back-to-back games, matching May 22-23, 2021 against Indianapolis. It's also the fourth time this season and the 17th time in franchise history that the Saints struck out 15 batters. The Saints are now 10-7 in games which they strike out 15 hitters. Saints' pitchers are tied for fourth in the International League and fifth in Triple-A with 160 strikeouts. Their 102 swinging strikeouts are the sixth-most in Triple-A.

BULLPEN DOMINANCE: In the final 6.1 innings of the game on Thursday, the Saints bullpen retired 19 of the last 20 batters they faced. The lone baserunner was a Ali Sánchez home run in the seventh. The one batter that reached is the fewest for any game in franchise history in which the bullpen pitched at least 6.1 innings. It also was the third-longest appearance by the 'pen in which they did not walk a batter.

*The bullpen struck out a league-high 43 batters last week, five more than any other IL team and their 3.07 strikeouts per walk were also the fifth-most in Triple-A over the series. The 30.1 innings the bullpen pitched were tied for the sixth-most in Triple-A.

THREE HOMERS HELPS, USUALLY: Tuesday marked just the seventh time in franchise history that the Saints homered three times in a game and did not come out with a win. Prior to Tuesday, the Saints were 58-6 in games where they homer three times in one game. It was also only the second time that the Saints have ever lost a game when they hit three home runs in one inning. The other instance came on April 6, 2023 in a 12-11 loss to the Iowa Cubs.

REHAB ROUNDTABLE: The Minnesota Twins reinstated LHP Caleb Thielbar from his rehab assignment on Sunday after two outings. He allowed one run in 3.0 innings (solo home run), struck out five and walked one. RHP Josh Staumont remains in St. Paul for his rehab assignment. Staumont was placed on the 15-Day Injured List on March 28, retroactive to March 25, for a left calf strain.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins fell 11-3 to Baltimore on Tuesday. The O's jumped out to a 7-0 lead after three innings, hitting a pair of homers off Chris Paddack. Paddack allowed nine runs over 5.1 innings, taking the loss. Jair Camargo made his Major League debut, pinch-hitting for Byron Buxton in the ninth. He drew a walk and scored.

LAST APPEARANCE: 4/11 v IOWA...made third start of the season, allowed one run on three hits, walking a season-high four and striking four out...allowed a single to Pete Crow-Armstrong who stole second and scored on a David Peralta single...allowed back-to-back walks to end the outing, bequeathing two runners to Jordan Balazovic, who did not allow them to score...did not factor into decision in 5-2 Saints loss

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 4/5 @ NASH...made second start of the season, allowing one run on four hits in 2.2 innings, walking two and striking two out...allowed three of four hits in the first inning, allowing lone run to score...four hits were allowed to the first six batters that he faced...did not factor into the decision in a 6-5 Saints victory.

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!: On July 24, 2022, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.
