**TODAY'S GAME:** The Curve continue a six-game set with the Somerset Patriots for the fourth and fifth of nine matchups this season.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Po-Yu Chen tossed 6.0 innings of 1-run ball, but Altoona dropped a 7-4 decision to Somerset on Thursday afternoon.

**PO-YU PONIES UP:** Right-hander Po-Yu Chen has turned in his two best starts of the season to begin the month of May. Chen has allowed just 2 earned runs in 11.1 IP in the month (1.59 ERA) with 7 strikeouts including a 6.0 inning outing against Somerset on May 9. Chen's 1.59 ERA is 7th in the Eastern League during the calendar month.

**NO RUNS FOR YOU!** The Curve earned their first shutout win of the season on Wednesday, May 8 against Somerset when Braxton Ashcraft and Dominic Perachi combined on a 3-hit shutout of the Patriots. Ashcraft earned his first win since May 20, 2021 with 5.0 innings and Perachi earned his first professional save with 4.0 scoreless frames. The pair combined for 9 K's in the win.

**THE STREAK TO FORGET:** The Curve dropped 15 straight games from April 20-May 4, the longest losing streak in franchise history. It is the longest losing streak by an Eastern League team since Richmond lost 15 straight in 2015, the longest in the circuit since 2005. Altoona finally put an end to the misery with a 6-2 win at Harrisburg in which Anthony Solometo and Bubba Chandler combined for 6.0 scoreless innings while Tsung-Che Cheng and Aaron Shackelford each picked up 3 hits.

**BUBBA SAVES THE DAY:** With Altoona holding a 4-2 lead in the middle innings, the Curve opted to hold Bubba Chandler for the final 3 innings of the game on May 5 at Harrisburg, his day to piggy-back starter Anthony Solometo. Chandler delivered his first career save allowing just two baserunners in his innings on the mound with three strikeouts and a fastball that hit 98.9 in the eighth.

**AND NOW SOME MOVES:** Altoona's roster underwent significant changes ahead of their series with Somerset beginning on Tuesday, May 7. C Dylan Shockley, INF Mike Jarvis, RHP Isaac Mattson and OF Matt Fraizer were all transferred to Triple-A, while OF Dustin Peterson, C Eli Wilson and OF Sammy Siani each joined the club from Indy and Greensboro, respectively.

**SOME HISTORY:** Altoona's 7-23 start is the worst record for the club through 30 games in franchise history, surpassing the 2009 Curve who started the season 10-20. The 5 wins in the month of April were the fewest for the team in a calendar month in which they played at least 15 games.

**STREAKING:** Another franchise record has fallen as OF Joe Perez now owns the longest on-base streak in Altoona's franchise history. After reaching base safely in all 25 games for Altoona in 2023, Perez reached in 10 straight games to begin his 2024 tenure with the Curve. Perez's 35-game stretch saw him bat .317/.447/.525/.972 OPS with 4 2B, 7 HR, 21 RBI, 26 BB and 2-3 SB and bested Ronny Paulino (July 12-Sept. 5, 2004) and Steve Pearce (June 15-July 22, 2007).

**POWER OUTAGE:** Altoona's 16 home runs hit through 30 games ranks T-26th among 30 Double-A teams. Somerset is T-2nd among Double-A teams with 32 homers.

**THE MAJOR LEAGUE CURVE:** Altoona's group features several staff and players with previous major league experience. On the coaching staff Manager Robby Hammock played 182 games in the major leagues with the Arizona Diamondbacks, highlighted by catching Randy Johnson's Perfect Game. Pitching Coach Fernando Nieve made 99 major league appearances with the Astros and NY Mets in his playing career, Catching and Game Planning Coordinator Taylor Davis played 22 games with the Cubs and Pirates before joining the coaching ranks this off-season and Bench Coach Gary Green played 106 games in the majors with the Padres, Rangers and Reds. Among the players, RHP Isaac Mattson made five appearances for Baltimore in 2021 and INF Seth Beer played 43 games with Arizona across the 2021 and 2022 seasons.

**THE PATRIOTS ARE THE YANKEES?:** Raul Dominguez is back for his second season leading Somerset. The Yankees Double-A affiliate features some of the top prospects in the MLB.com top 30 Yankees prospects including No. 2 OF Spencer Jones, No. 4 RHP Chase Hampton, No. 10 LHP Brock Selvidge, No. 12 C Ben Rice, No. 20 C Agustin Ramirez, No. 21 RHP Zach Messinger, No. 22 RHP Trystan Vrieling, No. 24 RHP Jack Neely, No. 25 INF Tyler Hardman, No. 27 RHP Danny Watson, and No. 29 INF Ben Cowles.

**THE FIRST TO 'SET:** Brock Selvidge takes the ball in game one for Somerset today. Selvidge is ranked by MLB Pipeline as the No. 10 prospect in the Yankees system and he's recorded a 1.73 ERA in 5 starts for the Patriots this year. Selvidge's best outing this year came on April 27 when he struck out 11 Reading Fightin Phils in 7.0 innings. Selvidge, a 21-year-old from Carrollton, TX attended high school in Chandler, AZ, and was picked in the 3rd round by the Yankees in 2021.

Zach Messinger starts in game two for the Patriots. Messinger was NY's 13th round pick in 2021 out of Virginia. Messinger tossed 5.2 no-hit innings in his last outing against New Hampshire. Messinger was a Media Studies major at UVA and his father Dennis played college hoops at Olney Central College and his mom, Lisa, played volleyball at the University of Evansville.

**CURVE CUTS:** Roy Reuben "Bubba" Chandler... Was committed to play both football and baseball at Clemson University prior to signing with the Pirates... Was rated by Baseball America as the 20th-best player (21st by MLB Pipeline) in the 2021 draft... Was a Collegiate Baseball first-team All-American selection as a multi-position athlete in 2021... Was named a Georgia 4-A all-state first-team selection in baseball during his senior season... Was the 2021 Region 8-AAAA Player-of-the-Year in baseball... Played quarterback for three seasons at North Oconee, where he passed for 1,842 yards and 18 touchdowns while also rushing 79 times for 548 yards and six touchdowns as a senior...
