July 12: Baysox 7, RubberDucks 4: Jose Devers and Christian Knapczyk each picked up two hits as Akron held a 3-1 lead after the first, but Chesapeake tied the game in the second and scored four in the seventh to win and split the series.

Today's starter: Josh Hartle gets the nod for the RubberDucks out of the All-Star break. The left-hander is making his 17th start of the season for the RubberDucks. He is coming off a no-decision last week against Chesapeake after tossing five innings allowing two runs while striking out five. Hartle is facing Binghamton for the second time this season. He faced the Rumble Ponies on April 16 striking out seven over 5.1 scoreless innings in an Akron win. He enters Friday night ranking fifth in the Guardians organization in ERA and innings pitched while ranking sixth in average against and WHIP.

Roster shake up: Between the end of Saturday's game (July 11) and today, 14 moves affecting the Akron RubberDucks roster took place. The RubberDucks enter Binghamton with six players looking to make their Double-A debuts. With the promotion of **Alfonsin Rosario** from Akron to Columbus, **Jacob Cozart** now leads the offense with eight home runs and 37 RBI.

2025 Draft Class: Dean Curley, Nolan Schubart and Aaron Walton join **Luke Hill** (made his Akron debut on June 2) as members of the Guardians 2025 MLB Draft Class to reach Double-A this season. All three were red hot with High-A Lake County before coming to Akron. Curley, who leads all of MiLB with 82 walks this season, is riding a 14 game on-base streak. He is batting .356 with three homers, four doubles and 18 RBI during the streak. Walton enters Akron on a 13 game on-base streak. This is the third time this season Walton has reached base in 13 games. He is batting .354 with three doubles, two homers and seven RBI during the current stretch. Schubart enters Akron riding a 43-game on base streak, which is tied for the sixth longest in MiLB this season and is tied for second longest active. He is batting .299 with 10 doubles, 14 homers and 45 RBI during the streak.

Mr. Thompson says hello: Bennett Thompson made a quick impression in Akron by launching a grand slam for his first Double-A hit on July 1. This kick started a great week for the new Akron catcher and first baseman as he hit .294 with four runs scored, two home runs and seven RBI against Erie. Thompson is batting .300 on the season between Akron and Lake County, which leads the Guardians organization. His .462 OBP between the two levels is second best in full season MiLB (Mike Sirota of the Dodgers organization leads with a .475 OBP).

RubberDucks and Rumble Ponies: Akron is facing Binghamton for the second of two series this season and the only visit to Mirabito Stadium. The RubberDucks went 5-1 against the Rumble Ponies back at 7 17 Credit Union Park in April. All time Akron is 227-184 against Binghamton. Top prospects in the series includes:

Sizzling Cesarini: Ryan Cesarini has been promoted to Akron from High-A Lake County. The outfielder was batting .260 with six doubles, seven home runs and 21 RBI in 34 games for the Captains this season. He reached base in 12 of the first 13 games he played in this season. After missing over a month due to an oblique strain, Cesarini has picked up a hit in four of the six games played since coming off the Injured List.

New arms: Izaak Martinez and Cam Walty are both joining Akron for what would be their Double-A debuts. Both relievers have spent most of the season with High-A Lake County but have each pitched in a game with Triple-A Columbus. Walty is 3-1 with a 6.34 ERA and 37 strikeouts over 38.1 innings pitched in 20 games this season. Martinez is 2-3 with a 1.55 ERA, six saves and 50 strikeouts over 40.2 innings in 25 games this season. Martinez had a 1.59 ERA with Lake County (best among High-A relievers) and six saves (third in the Midwest League).

Dependable Devers: Jose Devers has been one of Akron's best hitters over the last two months. After batting .183 in April, the RubberDucks infielder is batting .308 with six doubles, three triples, two home runs and 25 RBI since May 1. He's scored 35 runs in 57 games over the last three months and raised his season average to .278.

Walk this way: After leading the Eastern League and ranking fourth in all of Double-A in walks in 2025, the RubberDucks batters are once again showing impressive patience in 2026. Akron's 386 walks rank second in Eastern League and ninth in Double-A this season.

Healthy Jachec: Matt Jachec is looking sharp on the mound. In 11 appearances off the IL, Jachec is 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA, a save and 26 strikeouts over 15.1 innings pitched. He has allowed just two runs (one earned) since the start of June. The right-hander has not allowed a run over his last six games (two hits allowed over 9.1 innings).

2026 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his sixth season with the Guardians organization. The 2025 season will be DiCenzo's third as RubberDucks manager, and fifth as a manager in Cleveland's organization. He's led the RubberDucks to a 157-118 record in two seasons as Akron's manager including an Eastern League playoff appearance in 2024.

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#48 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his seventh season with the Guardians organization and third with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#43 Hitting Coach Cole Nieto enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Nieto joins the RubberDucks after serving as the hitting coach for the Lynchburg Hillcats in 2024 and their Carolina League championship season in 2025.

A graduate of St. Ignatius High School in Cleveland, Nieto played four years at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea. While at Baldwin Wallace, he hit .341 with 17 home runs and 109 RBI in 137 career games.

#55 Pitching Coach Angus Adams enters his first season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Adams served as a performance coach for Tread Athletics and was a pitching coach at Elmira College.

#54 Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his fourth season in the Guardians organization and third season with the RubberDucks. He will be a pitching coach in 2025 after spending 2024 as Akron's assistant pitching coach. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of [Akron](#), Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#33 Bench Coach Yan Rivera enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Rivera spent 2025 as the bench coach for Lake County and 2024 as the manager for the ACL Guardians.

Rivera is the son of former Cleveland minor league manager and Toronto Blue Jays coach Luis Rivera.

#47 Development Coach Gustavo Nava enters his second season with the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Nava served as the Development coach for Lynchburg in their 2025 Carolina League championship season.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his ninth season in the Guardians organization and third season with the RubberDucks. Diaz was the Eastern League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2024. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Laura Gutiérrez-Sogel enters her third season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to the RubberDucks, Gutiérrez-Sogel spent the 2025 season as the Assistant Athletic Trainer in Lake County.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Jack Baldwin enters his third season with the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Baldwin served as the Strength and Conditioning coach for Lynchburg in 2025.

Mental Performance Coach Andie McGregor enters her third season with the Guardians. She previously worked as a Mental Performance Coach at IMG Academy, supporting middle school, high school and post-grad student athletes in the baseball program. Also served as a Mental Performance intern with the New York Mets, working with the FCL Mets during the 2021 season. Has a Master of Science in Educational Psychology – Sport Psychology at Florida State University and a Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science at Georgia College & State University.

Baseball Technology Fellow Ryan Chambliss enters his first season in Akron. He spent the 2025 season with the Guardians ACL affiliate.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, then team owner **Ken Babby** and general manager **Jim Pfander** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
