YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 13-4, at Canal Park. Akron took a 1-0 lead in the third with an RBI single by Jaison Chourio. In the fifth, the 'Ducks scored a run with a bases-loaded walk and a groundout for a 3-0 lead. The Flying Squirrels tied the score, 3-3, in the sixth with a run scoring on passed ball and a two-run homer by **Sabin Ceballos**. Akron scored five in the sixth, four in the seventh and one in the eighth to open a 13-3 lead. **Zander Darby** drove in a run in the ninth.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians, in the third and fourth of a six-game series. This is the final road series of the 2026 regular season for Richmond. The Flying Squirrels won five-of-six at CarMax Park from May 5-10 against the RubberDucks. They split a six-game set in Akron from May 26-31 before Richmond won five-of-six at CarMax Park from June 23-28.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 73-53 record is the best in team history through 126 games, ahead of a 71-55 record in 2014. Richmond has won eight series, split 10 and lost four so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 46-46 in their last 92 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 73 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 37 of them. In 26 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 12 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has five wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .283 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is fifth in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels have won 31 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL and a franchise record. They are 11-1 in extra innings.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. For the year, Richmond is second among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.267), first in sacrifice flies (53), fourth in hits (1125), fifth in doubles (220) and tied for fifth in triples (30). The team has combined for 120 homers this year, surpassing 12 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. On Aug. 18 at Chesapeake, the Flying Squirrels set new single-season record for stolen bases, passing 168 in 2014. On August 26, the Flying Squirrels recorded their 50th sacrifice fly of the season off the bat of **Lisbel Diaz**, passing 49 in 2012 for a new team record. With an RBI single by **Zane Zielinski** in the seventh inning on August 29, the Flying Squirrels set the single-season RBIs record (previously 604, 2023). Diaz hit a three-run homer in the first inning on August 30 to pass the single-season team runs record (previously 538, 2023). The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, total bases, OBP, SLG and OPS. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .306 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 13 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown 10 shutouts this season, which is first in the Eastern League, second in Double-A and tied for sixth in MiLB.

THE RUBBERDUCKS went 3-3 in last week's series at Somerset. Akron leads the EL in triples (33). Akron's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including RHP Braylon Doughty (No. 3), OF Jaison Chourio (No. 5), SS Dean Curley (No. 9), OF Aaron Walton (No. 12), OF Jace LaViolette (No. 13) and OF Nolan Schubart (No. 23). Nine Akron players are featured in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Doughty (No. 3), Chourio (No. 6), Curley (No. 8), Walton (No. 9), LaViolette (No. 14), INF Luke Hill (No. 17), Schubart (No. 24), LHP Rafe Schlesinger (No. 28) and LHP Caden Favors (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Niko Mazza** makes his Double-A debut. He was promoted from High-A Eugene on Tuesday, where he went 6-5 with a 4.15 ERA in 24 outings, including 17 starts. At the time of his promotion, he ranked tied for eighth in the Northwest League in strikeouts (110). Mazza was selected by the Giants in the eighth round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of the University of Southern Mississippi. He spent his entire pro-debut campaign with Low-A San Jose in 2025, going 4-3 with a 2.22 ERA in 21 starts. He led the California League and the Giants organization in ERA for the season. *For more on Mazza, see page two.*

Left-hander **Charlie McDaniel** makes his 15th Double-A start and his third against the RubberDucks in Game 2. He last pitched last Friday against the Sea Dogs and allowed five runs over four innings in a loss. McDaniel went 3-1 with a 3.99 ERA in nine starts with High-A Eugene before being promoted to Double-A on June 2. He was the Northwest League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 1-0 with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP) in four starts. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the season between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.68 ERA in 23 outings (12 starts). McDaniel signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent out of Presbyterian College in 2024 after being named First-Team All-Big South in his senior season. *For more on McDaniel, see page two.*

FOR AKRON: Left-hander Franklin Gómez makes his third Double-A start. He last pitched last Friday at Somerset and allowed one run over four innings. In his Double-A debut on August 21 against Harrisburg, he allowed five runs over 2.2 innings. Gómez originally signed with the New York Mets in 2022 and was traded to the Cleveland Guardians on January 15 for international bonus pool money. He began the year with High-A Lake County and went 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA in 12 starts before being placed on the injured list on June 27. He was activated and assigned to Akron on August 21.

Left-hander Caden Favors makes his 24th start of the season and his fourth against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start on Saturday at Somerset, he threw six innings and allowed three runs with eight strikeouts in a no-decision. For the year, he is ranked first in the EL in BAA (.231), third in WHIP (1.26) and tied for third in strikeouts (127). Since July 26, Favors is 4-0 with a 2.36 ERA (9 ER/34.1 IP) in six starts. In three starts against Richmond Favors is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (12 ER/16.0 IP). For the month of April, he led the minors in BAA (.112). Favors was selected by the Guardians in the sixth round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of Wichita State. Last year, he made 25 starts for High-A Lake County, going 8-9 with a 4.08 ERA.

CROES CONTROL: Dayson Croes is batting .378 (28-for-74) with 25 singles, two doubles, a homer, seven RBIs and four walks over his last 17 games since August 13, raising his season batting average at Double-A from .237 to .279. He went 3-for-3 in the first game of last week's series on Tuesday with two walks and a sacrifice. He combined for three hits and two walks in his first five plate appearances last Wednesday, reaching base in eight consecutive plate appearances. On Tuesday, he had four hits. Croes has picked up multiple hits six times in his last 11 games since August 21, including three three-hit games and a four-hit game.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 333 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, Dave Machemer won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Sabin Ceballos** is sixth in walks (66). **Maui Ahuna** is tied for seventh in stolen bases (30). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for third in triples (4), tied for eighth in hits (109) and 10th in total bases (180). **Jonah Cox** is tied for first in triples (5). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (15) and tied for third in wins (9). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and fifth in ERA (4.23).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Jacob Bresnahan (No. 6), Dakota Jordan (No. 9), Gavin Kilen (No. 10), Trevor Cohen (No. 12) and RHP Miguel Mendez (No. 20). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features seven Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 6), Jordan (No. 7), Bresnahan (No. 9), Cohen (No. 14), Mendez (No. 16), Jancel Villarroel (No. 18) and Lisbel Diaz (No. 29).

MISC NOTES: Tyler Vogel is the first Eastern League reliever to reach 15 saves in a season since Portland's Luis Guerrero (18) in 2023. He now has the fifth-most saves in a season in franchise history, with Heath Hembree's 17 saves in 2011 next on the list. Vogel is also seventh in franchise history in career saves with 21, trailing Josh Osich (2013-2016) and Tyler Myrick (2023-2025) for a tie for fifth with 22. His nine wins this season are the second-most as a reliever in team history, trailing Edwin Quirarte (11, 2014). // **Lisbel Diaz** hit his second Double-A homer on Sunday and his 26th overall this season between Low-A San Jose, High-A Eugene and Richmond, which is tied with Bo Davidson, who also homered on Sunday, for the most in the Giants organization this year. // **Ryan Vanderhei** is 3-0 with a 0.98 ERA (3 ER/27.2 IP) in his last 19 outings since June 20, allowing three earned runs and five total runs in that stretch with 30 strikeouts and a .172 BAA. // **Sabin Ceballos** has 66 walks this season, tied for third-most in a season in franchise history, even with Hayden Cantrelle (2023). In his career, Ceballos has worked 113 walks, which is fourth-most in Flying Squirrels franchise history. He is 10 walks behind Diego Velasquez (123, 2024-26) for a tie for third on the all-time franchise list. // **Maui Ahuna** has 30 stolen bases this season, sixth-most in a season in franchise history behind Gary Brown (33, 2012). He also has the highest (min. 25 att.) stolen base percentage (.909, 30-for-33) in a season in team history. // There have been 51 Flying Squirrels alumni who have played in the majors this year (plus Donovan Walton, who had previous MLB experience before playing in Richmond), including 29 with the Giants.

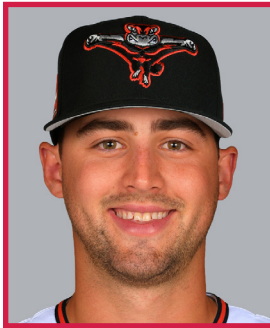
THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1983: The Richmond Braves beat the Charleston Charles, 15-8, to take the second game of the best-of-five Governors' Cup semifinals. Ken Smith had two hits, including a homer, and drove in four. Brad Kominski and Larry Owen homered. Rufino Linares went 3-for-5 with two RBIs. **1989:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 10-4, to take a 2-1 lead in the Governors' Cup Championship Series. Steve Ziem held Syracuse to one hit over five relief innings. David Justice opened the scoring with a three-run homer in the first inning. In the second, Mark Lemke added a three-run double. **2016:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 6-2, at The Diamond. After hitting a pinch-hit, walk-off grand slam the previous night, Ryder Jones belted another grand slam to cap a six-run fifth inning. **2024:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Akron RubberDucks, 4-3, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the 10th, Turner Hill closed the score to 3-2 with an RBI double. Bryce Eldridge tied the score, 3-3, with a popped single to left field, his first Double-A hit. Hill scored the winning run on a wild pitch by Bradley Hanner.
