SUBWAY SERIES OF SHUTOUTS: When the Patriots last hosted the Rumble Ponies from August 8-13, the final four games of their series split ended in shutouts. The last two games were started by Christian Scott, who started a 4-0 one-hit shutout of the Patriots on 8/12, and Blane Abeyta, who started an 8-0 three-hit shutout of the Rumble Ponies on 8/13 in their last meeting. Binghamton leads the Eastern League with 14 shutouts this season (2nd in MiLB), while Somerset ranks second in the league with 12 shutouts (T-4th in MiLB). Of the Patriots' 12 shutouts this season, half (6) have been of the Rumble Ponies.

ONE-UP: Ending the regular season with four straight wins, the Somerset Patriots finished the year with a record of 84-53, exactly one win more than their 2022 record (83-53). Having clinched the top record in all of Double-A, Somerset is one of five MiLB teams with 84+ wins (the other four teams are all Triple-A clubs who have played 142+ games compared to Somerset's 137).

TWO HALVES MAKE A WHOLE: Somerset's win on Saturday in New Hampshire clinched the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season, finishing with 42 wins in each half.

BUILT DIFFERENT: Somerset's +211 run differential this year ended the Double-A regular season 57 runs higher than any other MiLB team above rookie-ball (Norfolk-BAL, Round Rock-TEX).

PATRIOTS PITCHING: The Patriots' pitching staff ended the regular season leading all Double-A clubs with a 3.56 ERA, 1.24 WHIP and .214 BAA--all of which rank top-3 in Minor League Baseball. Their 1,397 strikeouts set a new Somerset Double-A franchise record, led the Eastern League and ranked 6th in MiLB. Somerset's bullpen boasted the lowest ERA in MiLB (3.27).

SOMERSET SLUGGING: Offensively, Somerset ended the regular season leading all Double-A teams with 197 HR and 255 SB (3rd in MiLB), while leading the Eastern League with 749 R and 650 BB, their .346 OBP, .430 SLG and .776 OPS.

CAREER: (18-19, 5.17 ERA, 287.0 IP, 285 K, 138 BB)

PITCH SELECTION: 4-seam Fastball (93+), Changeup (90-92), Cutter (86-90), Slider (80-82)

2023: During the first half, Abeyta set and matched a career-high in IP (6.2, last on 6/14 vs. ALT) twice and he set a new career-high in strikeouts twice (now 11, 6/8 @HFD).

2022: Spent all of 2022 with High-A Hudson Valley, tying for second on the team with 20 GS, ranking third on the team with 104.2 IP and fourth on the team with 88 K. Over his final 12 games of the season (nine starts) dating back to 6/28, he went 5-2 with a 2.93 ERA (58.1 IP, 53 H, 44 K, 30 BB).

2021: Split his professional debut season between Single-A Tampa and the FCL Yankees, combining to go 5-3 with a 5.37 ERA (55.1 IP, 43 H, 71 K, 35 BB, 4 HR) in 17 games (10 starts)... Was named the Low-A Southeast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of 9/5, after tossing six scoreless innings in his start on 9/3 at Bradenton (W, 6.0 IP, H, BB, 9 K). Across three starts from 8/20 - 9/3, Abeyta went 2-0 with a 0.57 ERA (15.2 IP, 4 H, 20 K, 6 BB, 0 HR). Following the season, he played for Surprise in the Arizona Fall League and went 1-1 with a 10.13 ERA (10.2 IP, 12 ER) in eight appearances.

College: Coming out of high school as a catcher, Abeyta transitioned to pitching upon beginning his college career at Modesto Junior College (CA) in 2018. Working as the team's closer during his freshman season, he went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA and five saves over 16 appearances (16.2 IP, 15 H, 22 K, 14 BB). During his second season as a pitcher, he went 5-4 over 17 games (10 GS) with one save and a 4.55 ERA (65.1 IP, 70 H, 60 K, 27 BB). Following two seasons at Modesto, Abeyta transferred to the University of Nevada in 2020, leading the Wolfpack with two saves, closing out both of the team's wins in the COVID-19 shortened season.

Personal Notes: Lettered in both baseball and basketball at Ceres High School (CA). Was named an All-League performer at catcher and was Team MVP, batting .354. Ceres head coach Zeb Brayton noticed his strong arm, had him throw a bullpen, and shared that it would be the ticket to any professional ceiling for Abeyta.

Career Notes: Signed with the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on June 20, 2020, following the COVID-19 shortened college season and MLB Draft.

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. He spent the past two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and was assigned to the same post for 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dominguez becomes the 5th manager in Patriots franchise history and the 3rd since becoming the Yankees Double-A affiliate. He succeeds 2022 Eastern League Manager of the Year Dan Fiorito. Dominguez also previously served as the defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native has managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. Under his guidance in 2022, the Patriots slugged a franchise record 205 HR, which led all Double-A teams and ranked 3rd in MiLB. The team also led the Eastern League in TB (1,984), SLG (.445), and OPS (.779), while finishing 2nd in RBI (655) and OBP (.342). Prior to coming to Somerset, he served as hitting coach for Hudson Valley (2021) and the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (2nd year)

Bossi returns for his 2nd season in Somerset. Under Bossi's leadership in 2022, Patriots infielder Jesus Bastidas was awarded a Minor League Gold Glove for his work at second base. Additionally, with Bossi leading Somerset's base-running program in 2022, Somerset paced all Eastern League teams with 205 stolen bases. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021 and prior to that helped assist rehabbing players at the Yankees minor league complex.
