YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Fightin Phils, 6-2. Reading scored first with a solo homer by Carson DeMartini in the second for a 1-0 lead. In the bottom of the second, **Jose Astudillo** tied the game with an RBI single and **Ty Hanchey** singled in a run for a 2-1 lead. **Jean Carlos Sió** plated a run in the fourth with a sac bunt and **Trevor Cohen** hit a two-run homer to open a 5-1 lead. Reading scored with a sac fly by Aroon Escobar in the top of the fifth and Richmond scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the inning for a 6-2 lead. **Tyler Switalski** allowed two runs over five innings for his first Double-A win. **Marques Johnson** and **Ryan Vanderhei** each threw two scoreless innings to finish the game.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies, in the finale of a six-game series. This is the first and only series between the two teams this year. It is also the second of three consecutive home series for Richmond against Northeast Division opponents and the third of three straight series against that division overall. Richmond is looking for its eighth series win of the season.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 63-42 record the second-best in team history through 105 games, trailing only a 64-41 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split eight and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 36-35 in their last 71 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 63 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 31 of them. In 19 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 11 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has four wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .288 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is sixth in MiLB.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. For the year, Richmond is first among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.270), second in doubles (198), second in sacrifice flies (41) and tied for third in hits (939). The team has combined for 107 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown nine shutouts this season, which is the most in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. At 38-18, the Flying Squirrels have the third-best home record in MiLB this season, trailing only High-A Bowling Green (38-14) and Low-A Hickory (34-16). Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .331 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 12 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history.

THE FIGHTIN PHILS are leading the Northeast Division second-half standings by a one game over Portland. They went 30-39 in the first half and finished fifth in the division. Reading's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Phillies prospects, including 2B Aroon Escobar (No. 4), RHP Gage Wood (No. 5), SS Carson DeMartini (No. 15), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 23) and RHP Saul Teran (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Phillies prospects list features six Reading players, including Wood (No. 1), Escobar (No. 4), RHP Wen-Hui Pan (No. 12), SS Bryan Rincon (No. 14), LHP Mavin Graves (No. 24) and OF Raylin Heredia (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Jack Choate** makes his first start of the season. He has thrown 23 relief appearances this year. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 35 IP), Choate ranks eighth in ERA (3.11). He began the year picking up a winning decision in each of his first five appearances. In his first 18 outings of the season from April 4-June 27, he went 6-1 with a 1.84 ERA (6 ER/29.1 IP) before allowing five runs in one outing on July 1. In his four appearances since, he has posted a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP). If you remove his July 1 outing, Choate is 6-1 with a 1.93 ERA (8 ER/37.1 IP) this season. Choate is in his third season with Richmond and has gone 11-12 with a 3.87 ERA in 60 Double-A appearances, including 32 starts, dating back to 2024. Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. **For more on Choate, see page two.**

FOR READING: Right-hander Reese Dutton makes his third Double-A appearance. He began the season with High-A Jersey Shore and went 4-5 with a 3.39 ERA in 16 outings (14 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Reading on July 25. In his Double-A debut on July 26 at Harrisburg, he threw 3.2 scoreless relief innings and picked up a win. He made his first Double-A start last Sunday against Binghamton and allowed five runs (four earned) over four innings in a loss. Dutton began his collegiate career at Heartland Community College in Normal, Ill., for two seasons and was the NJCAA Division II Pitcher of the Year in 2022. He was named First-Team All-Big South in 2023 at USC Upstate before transferring to Kansas for his senior season in 2024, where he was named Second-Team All-Big 12. Dutton signed as a non-drafted free agent with the Phillies in 2024.

NICE GOIN', COHEN: **Trevor Cohen** went hitless in Thursday's doubleheader to snap a streak of eight consecutive games with multiple hits. Over his last 12 games since July 26, Cohen is batting .389 (21-for-54) with two homers, three doubles, nine RBIs and nine stolen bases, raising his Double-A batting average from .212 to .322. Last week in his return to his home state, he hit .486 (14-for-29) in six game and stole eight bases at Somerset. In the second game of a doubleheader on July 29, he had four steals. On July 31, he went 4-for-5 to tie his career high for hits. Cohen hit his first Double-A homer on August 8, part of a two-hit first inning. He had three hits in this week's series opener on Wednesday and belted his second homer on Saturday night.

KILEN IT: In his first 19 Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .324 (23-for-71) with a homer, seven doubles, a triple and 13 RBIs. For the season, he is tied for third among all MiLB hitters with 34 doubles. He is tied for first among all Giants minor league hitters with 78 RBIs this year. Kilen had three RBIs in Thursday's doubleheader, including his first Double-A homer in the first game. After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in 16 of his 19 games in the Eastern League. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2018) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019).

JACK ATTACK: In his last 40 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .353 (49-for-139) with two homers, eight doubles, a triple, 19 RBIs, 14 walks and 18 runs scored. He has 14 multi-hit performances in that span, including 10 two-hit games and four three-hit games. Last Saturday, he hit the first grand slam of the season for the Flying Squirrels and the second of his professional career. He went 2-for-2 with a walk in the first game of Thursday's doubleheader and had three hits on Friday. Payton has reached base 15 times in his current eight-game on-base streak dating back to July 29, the longest active streak for the Flying Squirrels.

SIZZLING: In his seven August games, **Charlie Szykowny** is batting .320 (8-for-25) with a homer, a double, an RBI, two walks and two stolen bases. He clubbed a solo homer on Wednesday, his 12th of the year and his first since June 30. For the year, he leads the Flying Squirrels in his (93), extra-base hits (36) and total bases (157).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 323 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is sixth in batting average (.295) and seventh in OBP (.384). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for second in triples (4) and 10th in hits (93). **Bo Davidson** is tied for fourth in homers (19) and sixth in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is ninth in batting average (.284), tied for seventh in OPS (.879) and eighth in SLG (.510). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and ninth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (13) and tied for eighth in wins (7). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (3.99) and fourth in BAA (.236).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 8), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 9), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 11) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 23). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 11), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 25), Marte (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1979: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 2-1, at Silver Stadium for their eighth straight win. Bob Beall doubled in Chico Ruiz from first in the eighth to give Richmond the lead. Ed Miller stole his 63rd base of the season, tying Ralph Garr's 1969 single-season franchise record. Rochester won the second game, 4-2, to end the winning streak. Miller stole his 64th base of the season in that game to break the single-season team record. **2012:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 2-1, in 13 innings at The Diamond. Daniel Mayora gave the Flying Squirrels a 1-0 lead with a single in the first. Jonny Tucker tied the score, 1-1, in the top of the seventh with a single. In the bottom of the 13th, Nick Liles hit a one out single, moved to second on a wild pitch, took third on a groundout and scored on a walk-off single by Joel Weeks. Justin Fitzgerald allowed one run on three hits in seven innings in his start.
