YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Senators, 8-4. The Senators took a 2-0 lead in the first with a two-run single by Cortland Lawson. In the third, **Parks Harber** brought in a run with a sacrifice fly. Harrisburg scored two runs in the fifth, sixth and seventh to open an 8-1 lead. In the top of the eighth, **Jean Carlos Sio** hit a three-run homer to close the score to 8-4.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game series against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. This is the second series between these two teams this year and the Flying Squirrels' first trip to Harrisburg. Richmond is searching for its 50th win of the year. In 2025, the Flying Squirrels recorded their 50th win on August 30.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 49-28 start is the best in team history through 77 games, passing a 46-31 start in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split five and lost one so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 22-21 in their last 43 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 49 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 24 of them. In 17 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have nine walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber**, **Dayson Croes** and **Diego Velasquez** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.272), doubles (154) and sacrifice flies (33) and ranks tied for first in triples (21) and second in hits (700). The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS, sacrifice flies and hit by pitches. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown seven shutouts this season, which leads the Eastern League and ranks tied for second in Double-A.

THE SENATORS finished the Eastern League's first half in fourth place in the Southwest Division, 9.5 games behind Richmond. They went 3-2 in last week's road series against the Baysox to open the second half. The Harrisburg roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects list, including LHP Alex Clemmey (No. 7), INF Devin Fitz-Gerald (No. 9), OF Sam Peterson (No. 14), OF Ethan Petry (No. 15) and C Caleb Lomavita (No. 21). MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects includes five Harrisburg players, including Fitz-Gerald (No. 5), Clemmey (No. 12), Petry (No. 13), Peterson (No. 23) and Lomavita (No. 27).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 16th Double-A start and his second against the Senators. In his most recent start on Saturday against Akron, he allowed five runs over three innings in a no-decision. He pitched against Harrisburg on June 10 and picked up his first Double-A win, allowing two runs over a season-high-tying five runs. Farone was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR HARRISBURG: Right-hander Trevor Williams makes a rehab start for the Senators. He has been on for almost a year after suffering a right elbow injury and having surgery. He made a rehab appearance for Low-A Fredericksburg last week and recorded two outs, allowing four runs. Williams was selected by the Miami Marlins in the second round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of Arizona State. He was traded to the Pirates after the 2015 season and made his MLB debut in 2016. He signed with the Cubs in 2021 and was traded that year at the deadline along with Javier Baez for Pete Crow-Armstrong. After spending parts of two seasons with the Mets, he signed with the Nationals ahead of the 2023 season. Williams has spent parts of 10 seasons in the majors, going 53-56 with a 4.46 ERA in 219 outings.

IT'S BO TIME! In his last 26 games since June 2, **Bo Davidson** is batting .294 (30-for-102) with 12 homers, two doubles and 24 RBIs, adding 15 walks. From June 4-7, he homered in four consecutive games, a new Flying Squirrels franchise record. From June 2-June 7, he picked up at least one RBI in six consecutive games, one shy of the franchise record. His 11 homers in June were the most in a calendar month in franchise history, passing eight by Jarrett Parker (May 2013) and Sean Roby (April 2022). His 18 homers are tied for fourth-most in a season in franchise history, even with Jarrett Parker (2013) and Mario Lissos (2014). Davidson has 26 career homers with Richmond since being promoted to Double-A last July, which ranks ninth in franchise history.

SIO LATER: **Jean Carlos Sio** has six homers and 18 RBIs in his last 17 starts since June 10. He began the stretch with his first Double-A homer on June 10 at CarMax Park against Harrisburg, a solo shot. The following game on June 11, he went 2-for-5 with a solo homer and a two-run triple. In the division-clinching win on June 12, he drove a two-run single in the first inning. On June 14, he hit a game-tying, two-run homer in a comeback win. On June 17, Sio drove a two-run, go-ahead homer in the eighth in Bowie. He hit a solo homer on June 19 in Bowie. He hit a three-run homer on Thursday night in Harrisburg. In nine games against the Senators this year, Sio is batting .333 (7-for-21) with four homers and 11 RBIs.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 19 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .418 (28-for-67) with a homer, five doubles, a triple, 10 RBIs, seven walks and 11 runs scored. He has nine multi-hit performances in his last 17 games dating back to June 9, including six two-hit games and three three-hit games. He drove a two-run double last Tuesday night in a 3-0 win, added an RBI single last Wednesday night, had an RBI double in last Thursday's 10th-inning rally and hit a two-run single to help fuel last Saturday's five-run comeback. On Thursday in Harrisburg, he went 3-for-4 with a double. Against the Senators this year, Payton is batting .611 (11-for-21) with a homer, a double, a triple, two walks, three RBIs and four runs scored.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 309 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank fourth among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (6,953).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Bo Davidson** is tied for second in homers (18), fourth in RBIs (50), ninth in total bases (127) and 10th in SLG (.516). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and fourth in stolen bases (27). **Charlie Szykowny** is ninth in extra-base hits (31). **Parks Harber** is tied for fourth in doubles (18). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (11) and tied for fourth in wins (6). **Mitch White** is tied for sixth in saves (5). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and tied for seventh in BAA (.237). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in WHIP (1.11), first in BAA (.216), tied for first in strikeouts (89) tied for sixth in innings pitched (72.1) and eighth in ERA (3.98).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 6), Harber (No. 13) and INF **Maui Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

JUNE WRAP: The Flying Squirrels went 15-10 in June, second-best in the Eastern League. **Jack Payton** ranked first in batting average (.387) and second in OBP (.451). **Bo Davidson** ranked first in homers (11), first in total bases (64), second in RBIs (23), second in SLG (.681), second in OPS (1.072), third in hits (29), tied for third in extra-base hits (13) and tied for third in runs (21). **Parks Harber** ranked tied for first in walks (21). **Charlie Szykowny** ranked tied for sixth in extra-base hits (12). **Tyler Vogel** ranked tied for first in saves (5) and tied for second in wins (3). **Cesar Perdomo** ranked first in strikeouts (37), third in WHIP (0.86), sixth in BAA (.196) and eighth in innings pitched (26.2). **Yunior Marte** ranked fourth in strikeouts (31).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1978: The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 8-5, at Parker Field. Brian Snitker, who played just six Triple-A games in his career, and Terry Harper each hit RBI singles in the second inning. In the fourth, Snitker and Harper both drove in runs again and Larry Whisenant added an RBI triple. Glenn Hubbard brought home a run in the sixth with an infield hit. Bruce Benedict doubled home a run in the seventh. **1983:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 8-7, at Parker Field. In the top of the 11th, Ron Gardenhire gave the Tides a 7-6 lead with a solo homer. In the bottom of the 11th, Steve Swisher tied the score with a pinch-hit sacrifice fly and Brad Komminsk hit a two-out, walk-off single to end the game. **2021:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, 2-1. It was their first full-capacity sellout of the year, drawing 9,560 fans, after early season crowd restrictions. Caleb Kilian started and allowed one run over six innings with nine strikeouts. Jacob Heyward tied the game, 1-1, with a solo homer in the second. Simon Whiteman hit a go-ahead RBI double in the bottom of the seventh.
