RHP NABIL CRISMATT (1-0, 0.79) vs. LHP JOSH ROGERS (1-1, 4.22)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque and Oklahoma City meet for the second of four series between the clubs—all in the first half—and first of two sets in the Duke City ... Oklahoma City took five of six during the first series in early April ... The Isotopes have won four of its last seven contests ... Josh Rogers is scheduled to make his fourth start of the year and second against Oklahoma City while Nabil Crismatt is slated to start for Oklahoma City.

HOMER STREAK: Hunter Goodman saw his streak of four consecutive games with at least one homer come to an end Sunday. It was the 13th time in Isotopes history a player went deep in at least four-straight. Mike Colangelo, Scott Seabol and Dallas McPherson remain the only Albuquerque hitters to homer in five or more ballgames in a row.

RUNS: The Isotopes have been held to three or fewer runs four times in their last 10 games, while simultaneously plating nine or more on five instances during the same timeframe.

SWIPES: El Paso stole three bases Sunday, the fifth occurrence of Albuquerque relenting at least a trifecta of swipes in a contest this year ... The Isotopes have relented 31 swipes on the year, the sixth-most in Triple-A.

SERIES HIGHS: The Isotopes offense set series highs in hits (38), homers (nine) and XBH (22) last week against El Paso.

LOB: Albuquerque left 10 on base Sunday, the third-most in a contest in 2024 (most: 12, twice, April 12 and 14, both vs. Sugar Land).

TOTAL BASES: The Isotopes were held to just eight total bases Sunday, ending a seven-game stretch tallying double-digit bases ... Additionally, it was the third time this season the Isotopes were held to just one extra-base hit

LAST TIME VS. OKC: The Isotopes dropped four games by either one or two runs while losing by eight in the series finale (11-3) in Oklahoma City (April 2-7).

VS. EL PASO: The Isotopes and Chihuahuas split a series for the first time since July 22-27, 2021, at Southwest University Park, a span of 11 series.

THREE-BAGGERS: Julio Carreras swatted his third triple on the year last Tuesday and the Isotopes Triple-A-leading 12th of 2024. The club has a three-bagger in eight of 21 games.

BY WAY OF THE K: The Isotopes' 213 punchouts are third-most in Triple-A (most: Norfolk, 219).

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman has a hit in eight of his last nine games, slashing .306/.342/.889 with one double, one triple, six homers and 13 RBI ... Of his 59 batted balls hit into play this year, 24 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck has gone hitless in three-straight for the first time since Aug. 17-18, 2023 (DH) ... On Triple-A leaderboard in three categories (see below)

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of Beck's 59 batted balls in play, 21 have left the bat over 100-MPH. Highest EV: 108.6 MPH, 1B (3/29 vs. ELP).

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron singled and has hit safely in all 10 games (tied with Romo for team lead) he has appeared in this season, setting a new career-high. He has one knock in his last nine contests. Herron's previous longest streak was nine, reached from Sept. 2-10, 2023 with the Isotopes ... During this stretch, he is slashing .297/.409/.486 with two doubles, one triple, one homer and seven RBI. The 10-game streak is also tied for the fourth-longest active hit streak in Triple-A (longest active: 15 Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo).

TONY: Drew Romo singled twice, giving him a 10-game hitting streak (tied with Herron for team lead). He is slashing .385/.400/.436 with two doubles and four RBI during the stretch. This is Romo's longest hit streak since April 22-May 4, 2022 with Hartford ... The 10-game streak is also tied for the fourth-longest active hit streak in Triple-A (longest: 15 Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo).

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk went 3-for-3 Sunday, his first three-hit game since Sept. 23, 2023 vs. OKC. He is 14-for-36 with five doubles and 10 RBI during a nine-game hitting streak, his longest since June 13-July 6 of last year (13 games).

JONESY: Greg Jones stole two more bases Sunday, increasing his total to 12 for the season. It was his 22nd career game with multiple swipes and fourth in 2024. Jones is one of just three players in Triple-A with at least a dozen thefts, joining Tacoma Rainiers teammates Cade Marlowe (14) and Ryan Bliss (12).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes' seven-game walk streak came to an end Sunday after going 0-for-3 with two RBI ... Has four multi-RBI contests on the year, including in last four games.

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Jordan Beck is T-5th in XBH (13), T-8th in RBI (20), T-10th in runs (17) ... Hunter Goodman is 1st in XBH (15), T-3rd in doubles (8), T-4th in total bases (49) and T-7th in homers (6) ... Greg Jones is T-2nd in stolen bases (12) ... Julio Carreras is T-3rd in triples (3).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
