LAST NIGHT: The Skeeters notched a 7-3 come-from-behind win on Monday night. Jose Siri and Taylor Jones drove in a pair of runs each in the fourth inning to give the Skeeters the lead for good. Nivaldo Rodriguez made his first start of the season and allowed one run through five innings while striking out five to pick up the winning decision.

TAYLOR MADE: Taylor Jones has logged at least two hits in each of his first four games this year and is hitting .625 (10x16) so far this season. Over his last two games, Jones has gone 5x9 with six RBIs over the last two games. Jones has the second-highest batting average and OPS (1.652) in all of Triple A.

HEY SIRI: Jose Siri hit his second homer of the season last night and has driven in at least two runs in four of five games this season. He's tied for second in all of Triple A with 11 RBIs. Siri has at least two hits in all five games this season and has recorded an extra-base hit in four-of-five games.

15 MINUTES OF FAME: The Skeeters have recorded at least 15 hits in four of five games, including 15 hits in Monday night's win. The Skeeters lead all Triple A teams with a .363 batting average (73x201) and their 73 hits lead all of Triple A teams as well.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Skeeters hit three doubles on Monday and their 20 doubles as a team lead Triple A West, with the next closest team at 16 doubles (Reno).

PUTTING OUT THE FIRE: Skeeters relievers have logged a 1.40 ERA (3 ER/19.1 IP). The Skeeters' bullpen ERA is second-lowest in Triple A, trailing just Columbus (0.68 ERA).

MOVING ON UP: The Skeeters are in their first season in affiliated minor league baseball as the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. The Skeeters are one of three independent teams rising to affiliated minor league ranks this offseason, along with the St. Paul Saints (AAA, MIN) and Somerset Patriots (AA, NYY).

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons of existence, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in 2016 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons.

The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their 2013 season.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University.

MAJOR TALENT: The Skeeters roster features eight players with Major League service time: OF Ronnie Dawson, IF Alex De Goti, IF Taylor Jones, RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez, RHP Peter Solomon, C Garrett Stubbs, IF Abraham Toro, RHP Hector Velazquez. All but Velazquez have appeared at the Majors with the Astros.

PROSPECT POWER: The Skeeters have nine players ranked as Astros top-30 prospects (per MLB Pipeline): RHP Tyler Ivey (No. 9), RHP Shawn Dubin (No. 11), RHP Peter Solomon (No. 14), RHP Jojane Torres (No. 20), IF Taylor Jones (No. 21), RHP Brett Conine (No. 23), RHP Austin Hansen (No. 24), RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez, (No. 25), OF Ronnie Dawson (No. 29)

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson, Alex De Goti and Peter Solomon each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two.

WELCOME TO ABQ: The Skeeters are making their first trip to Albuquerque in franchise history. The Skeeters and Isotopes are scheduled to play each other 30 times this season and are both in the East Division of Triple-A West. The Isotopes visit Constellation Field in Sugar Land for the first time from May 27-June 1.

LAST TIME OUT: Dubin made his first Opening Day start and first Triple A appearance on May 6 in Albuquerque. Dubin collected a no-decision after allowing three runs on six hits and striking out five in 4 1/3 innings of work.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: Dubin did not make an appearance at the Major or Minor League level in '20 due to the pandemic-shortened season. He last appeared at the affiliated level in '19, spending the bulk of the season with Fayetteville (A+) after beginning the year with Quad Cities (A) ... Went a combined 7-5 with a 3.58 ERA (44 ER/110.2 IP) and three saves in 25 games (19 GS).

PROSPECT CREDENTIALS: Rated as the Astros No. 11 prospect, per MLB Pipeline, and is rated as the Astros No. 14 prospect, per Baseball America ... Rated as the No. 19 prospect in the Carolina League following the '19 season, per Baseball America

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named the Midwest League Player of the Week on 4/21/19 with Quad Cities (A) after throwing six scoreless innings and allowing one hit while striking out seven in his start that week vs. Cedar Rapids ... Named Carolina League Player of the Week on 9/2/19 with Fayetteville (A+) after striking out 10 over seven scoreless innings in his start that week at Carolina.

PUT 'EM AWAY: Led Fayetteville (A+) with 132 strikeouts in '19 and was fourth of Astros minor leaguers with 152 strikeouts on the season ... Logged three starts with at least 10 strikeouts (all with Fayetteville, A+), including a professional career-high 11 strikeouts on 8/3/19 vs. Myrtle Beach

INNINGS EATER: Was second on Fayetteville (A+) with 98 2/3 IP and tied for seventh of all Astros minor leaguers in '19 with 110 2/3 IP.

COLLEGE DAYS: The Astros selected Dubin in the 13th round of the 2018 MLB Draft out of Georgetown College (Georgetown, KY). Struck out a school-record 128 batters and went 9-1 with a 2.09 ERA in his lone season at Georgetown College after transferring from the University of Buffalo. He became the third player in Georgetown College history to be named a NAIA First-Team All-American.
