OKLAHOMA CITY COMETS (37-26) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (28-34)

Tuesday, June 10, 2025 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • RGCU Field at Isotopes Park • Albuquerque, NM Game #63, Home Game #30

RHP Bobby Miller (2-1, 4.14) vs. LHP Austin Gomber (0-1, 4.50)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Comets meet for the second of three series on the year and lone set in Albuquerque ... The Isotopes have won nine of their last 15 ... Austin Gomber is expected to make a rehab start for the Isotopes while Bobby Miller is slated to take the hill for the Comets.

LAST WEEK: With the loss to El Paso Sunday, the Isotopes dropped their fifth series of the year and fourth on the road. It was the club's first series loss since April 29-May 3 when they lost three of five to Salt Lake (finale rained out).

LOSING SKID: Albuquerque has lost three-straight games for the first time since losing four-straight from May 18-May 22 (tied for a season-high) ... Fourth losing streak of at least three games (others: April 6-9, three games, and April 24-27, four games).

TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Seventeen of Albuquerque's last 30 games have been decided by two runs or fewer. Overall on the season, the Isotopes hold a 14-14 record in such contests.

RISP: The Isotopes went 1-for-8 with runners in scoring position Sunday. For the series, the club went 11-for-56 with runners in scoring position.

VS. OKC: The Isotopes and Comets split the first set of the season in Oklahoma City (May 6-11) after Albuquerque won 6-3 Sunday, scoring two runs on Clayton Kershaw over 4.0 innings ... Last year, over 12 home games against Oklahoma City, the comets outscored the Isotopes 127-75. The Comets won nine of 12

PUNCHOUTS: Albuquerque struck out 13 times Sunday, tying a season-high (four times; last: May 8 at Oklahoma City). All four contests with 13 punchouts have come on the road.

QUALITY: El Paso's Wes Benjamin tossed 6.0 innings of one-run ball Sunday and allowed just three hits with nine punchouts. The 10th quality start by an opposing hurler in 2025 and eighth since May 2... His nine strikeouts are tied for the most by an opponent this season (also: Carson Wisenhunt, March 30 at Sacramento).

FIRST FRAME: The Isotopes allowed two first-inning runs Sunday and have relented 48 on the year, the club's biggest run differential in a frame in 2025 (48-29).

MULT-HOMERS: Trenton Brooks registered two homers Sunday, the sixth multi-homer game for an opponent and Brooks' second-straight ... He's the first opposing player to record multi-homer contests in two-straight games played since Salt Lake's Keston Hiura from June 27-28, 2024.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 1-for-4 Sunday, extending his modest hit streak to five games (7x18 with a double and two homers) ... Is slashing .385/.495/.718 with seven doubles, two triples, five homers and 14 RBI in his last 21 contests, with nine multi-hit games ... Has 12 hit-by-pitch this season, second-most in Triple-A ... Has stolen a base in three-straight, first Isotope to do so since Julio Carreras (July 7-10, 2024).

AMADOR: Adael Amador went 1-for-4 Sunday with an RBI single to extend his modest hit streak to five games (7x21 with two doubles, a homer and four RBI). Has an RBI in three-straight and four of last five contests ... Has at least one hit in 15 of 18 Triple-A contests this year.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk belted his fourth homer with Albuquerque in 2025 Sunday and first dinger or extra-base hit since May 29 vs. Sugar Land (homer and double. Is batting just .111 (3x27) since May 30, seven contests.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia tallied two hits Sunday, including a double, for his second multi-hit contests with Albuquerque in six games played. Has four doubles. Has struck out in five of six games, totaling nine in 25 at-bats.

MILLER TIME: Owen Miller went 1-for-4 Sunday, extending his modest hit streak to five games (7x22 with one double, one homer and four RBI)

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel finished 2-for-4 Friday, tying Ryan Ritter for the team lead in multi-hit games (20). Has posted a .394/.461/.576 slash line with six doubles, two homers and nine RBI in his last 17 contests, raising his batting average from .258 to .305 in the span.

YF: Yanquiel Fernández went 2-for-4 Friday with a double, his 18th multi-hit game of the season. This marks the fourth time Fernández has recorded multiple knocks in at least three-straight contests in 2025 (last: May 24-28).

THE VET: Since beginning the season 4-for-21, Nola is 19-for-40 with five doubles and nine RBI in his last 11 games with Albuquerque. He has driven in eight runs in his past six starts, dating back to May 2 vs. Salt Lake.

IT'S DREW: Drew Romo tallied his second double of 2025 Sunday (also: May 23 at Reno), his lone extra-base kocks of the year

PCL LEADERBOARD: Warming Bernabel is T-6th in doubles (16) ...**Sterlin Thompson** is T-6th in triples (3).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- His 97 starts as a Rockie are the fourth-most by a lefty in franchise history, trailing Jeff Francis (185), Kyle Freeland (200) and Jorge De La Rosa (200).
- Since joining the Rockies in 2021, his 2.58 BB/9 is the sixth-lowest among Major League lefties (min. 500 IP).
- Went 1-0 with a 0.68 ERA (26.2 IP, 2 ER) in four starts in May, 2024, the lowest ERA in any month by a Rockies starter in franchise history (min. four starts).
- Set a Rockies franchise record in 2023 with 29.2 walkless innings from the fourth inning on June 30 to the third inning on July 31, surpassing José Jimenez' 23.2-inning streak, May 7-June 23, 2002.
- Did not allow more than five hits in any of his first eight starts at Coors Field in 2021 and allowed five hits just once (Aug. 7 vs. Miami) ... recorded eight-straight starts allowing five or fewer hits at home, tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history (Ubaldo Jiménez, 2008).
- Acquired by Colorado, along with four Minor League players, from St. Louis in exchange for INF Nolan Arenado on Feb. 1, 2021.

LAST TIME OUT

 Made second rehab start of the year (first on current rehab stint) on June 4 at Portland with Double-A Hartford ... He tossed 4.0 frames and allowed one run on two hits while fanning three and walking none ... Threw 41 pitches, 29 strikes, and induced four groundouts and one flyout over 14 batters faced ... Had 1-2-3 first ... Both hits came in second to score lone run on an RBI double ... Sat down final eight batters faced ... Returning from left shoulder soreness suffered during 2025 Spring Training

AGAINST OKLAHOMA CITY

 Has faced the Comets twice in his career: May 10 and May 21, 2018 ... In first start, allowed six runs over 5.0 frames and allowing a career-high four homers ... In second start, tossed 8.0 innings of one-run ball with nine punchouts

- In his fourth season with the Rockies, set career-highs in starts (30), quality starts (12) and innings pitched (165.0) ... finished with the most innings pitched on the club, tied with Cal Quantrill for the second-most quality starts and tied with Ryan Feltner for the most starts.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.68 ERA (26.2 IP, 2 ER) in four starts in May, the lowest ERA in any month by
 a Rockies starter in franchise history (min. four starts) ... ERA was third-lowest in the Majors
 in May, second-lowest in NL ... walked six with 19 strikeouts; held opponents to .172 average.

- Made 18 starts in the first half, going 7-7 with a 6.40 ERA (90.0 IP, 64 ER) ... in nine second-half starts, went 2-2 and pitched to a 3.86 clip (49.0 IP, 21 ER).
- Began his season with four straight losses through April 19, the eighth time in history a Rockies starter has started 0-4 through their first four starts of a season, first since Roy Oswalt (five straight, June 20-Sept. 14) and Jeff Manship (four straight, Aug. 8-24) in 2013.
- Pitched at least six innings in a career-best seven consecutive starts from June 30 to Aug. 6, going 5-1 with a 2.51 ERA (43.0 IP, 12 ER), six walks and 26 strikeouts ... first Rockies starter with as many or more consecutive 6.0-plus inning starts with four or fewer earned runs allowed since Germán Márquez, July 5-Aug. 17, 2022 (eight straight).
- Went 4-2 and posted a 3.63 ERA (62.0 IP, 25 ER) over 11 starts from June 30-end of season ... was placed on the 60-day IL with lower back inflammation on Sept. 8, ending his season.
- Set a franchise record with 29.2 walkless innings from the fourth inning on June 30 to the third inning on July 31, surpassing José Jimenez's 23.2-inning streak, May 7-June 23, 2002.
- 10.62 H/9 was the third-highest mark in the Majors,
