THE RICE IS RIGHT: Entering Wednesday night, Ben Rice was 0-for-his-last-9, batting .179 over his first nine games of the season. In two games since Wednesday, he is 5-for-9 with 2 HR, 3 RBI and 3 R. In 12 career games vs. Hartford dating back to his Double-A debut last July, Rice is 22-for-53 (.415 AVG) vs. the Yard Goats with 7 HR, 16 RBI and 12 R.

CATCHING AND BASHING: The Somerset Patriots lead all Eastern League teams with 16 home runs. Of their 16 home runs, 11 have been hit by the three catchers on the team: Agustin Ramirez (7), Ben Rice (3) and JC Escarra (1). The 11 home runs by Somerset's three catchers alone are more than or equal to 9/11 other Eastern League teams as a whole.

PATRIOTS' POWER PITCHING: In three games this week vs. Hartford, the Somerset Patriots pitching staff has struck out 36 batters, averaging 12 strikeouts per game. Dating back to Saturday (six games), the Patriots' pitching staff has struck out 59 batters, which ranks second in the Eastern League (BNG, 62).

ESCARRA'S EXCELLENCE: JC Escarra has reached base in all seven games he's played this season, posting a .381/.462/.667 slash line, after hitting his first home run of the season on Thursday night. In what was Escarra's first regular season home run as a member of the Yankees organization, it also signaled his first in affiliated baseball since 9/9/21 (952 days apart), when he was still a member of the Orioles organization playing for Triple-A Norfolk. The Yankees signed Escarra as minor league free agent in January, after he spent the last two years playing a total of 257 games for five different teams in four independent or foreign leagues.

VRIELING AND DEALING: Since making his professional debut for the Somerset Patriots during Opening Weekend, Yankees 2022 third round pick RHP Trystan Vrieling has won each of his first two career starts. Entering today, Vrieling has started his pro career by going 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA and 0.82 WHIP over 11.0 IP with 1 ER, 5 H, 4 BB and 12 K.

AGUST IN APRIL: Agustin Ramirez has hit a home run in 7/11 games played this season, including two separate three-game home run streaks (4/5-7 and 4/11-13). With seven home runs to start the season, Ramirez leads all Double-A batters in home runs and is three shy of the MiLB lead, despite the Triple-A season starting two weeks earlier than the Double-A season. Ramirez also began the season by collecting RBIs in the first seven games he played. In addition to leading the league in homers, he also leads the Eastern League with a .795 SLG, 14 RBI, 10 R, 31 TB and 7 XBH (T-1st), while ranking second with a 1.178 OPS.

HARTFORD HAPPENINGS

The Hartford Yard Goats' roster boasts 11 of the Colorado Rockies' top-30 prospects per MLB Pipeline, including six position players ranked in the top-13. The infield is led by Rockies top prospect Arael Amador, who signed with the organization for \$1.5 million in the 2019 international free agent signing period. The outfield features three of the Rockies' top-10 prospects in Yanquiel Fernandez (No. 3) and Zac Veen (No. 6), as well as the defending Eastern League Player of the Week Benny Montgomery (No. 10). Over five games at home last week against the Bowie Baysox, Montgomery went 8-for-20 with 2 HR, 8 RBI and 6 R, scoring runs in all five games that he played. The pitching staff features three top-30 Rockies prospects, highlighted by LHP Carson Palmquist (No. 15), who leads the Eastern League with 15 strikeouts through his first two starts of the season entering this week's series (2-0, 0.00 ERA, 10.0 IP, 4 H, 6 BB, 15 K).

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2022-23: Vrieling did not pitch following the 2022 MLB Draft and he spent the entire 2023 season on the 60-day Injured List with a stress fracture in his pitching elbow. However, following the 2023 season, Vrieling was sent to the Arizona Fall League to pitch for the Mesa Solar Sox. In his first affiliated pitching experience, Vrieling started five games for Mesa, combining for 10.2 IP with 15 K, 6 BB and a 5.06 ERA.

College: Appeared in 42 games over three seasons at Gonzaga from 2020-2022, going 5-7 with a 4.31 ERA and 178 strikeouts in 137.2 innings. Vrieling worked primarily out of the bullpen his first two seasons, including in 2021 when he made 20 of his 22 appearances in relief and was a WCC All-Conference Honorable Mention. In 2022, he transitioned to the starting rotation, when he went 4-4 in 15 starts.

Personal Notes: Attended Kamiakin High School (WA), where as a senior he posted a 0.56 ERA with 63 strikeouts in 55 innings and was named MCC Pitcher of the Year and First Team pitcher. Two-sport athlete also played basketball in high school.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft, signing on July 25, 2022 for a slot value bonus of \$611,400. Had been ranked by MLB.com as the No. 71 Draft prospect in 2022.

He went 3-for-4 with a homer and 5 RBI in the state's first ever LLVWS win, coming over Germany. During his graduate year at Arkansas, Wegner earned the nickname "Pops" from his teammates.

Career Notes: Selected in the ninth round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Yankees, signing for \$72,500 as a senior-sign.

2024: Returned to High-A Hudson Valley to start the 2024 season, where he played in five games and went 3-for-15 with 5 RBI. On 4/17, he was assigned to Double-A Somerset.

2023: Played a career-high 103 games for High-A Hudson Valley, batting .206 with 9 HR, 53 RBI, and a .590 OPS. He hit a walk-off home run in 12th inning vs. JS on 8/12 to finish the night with four hits and four RBI. Over a series vs. HIC, Vargas hit 2 HR with 9 RBI over 5 games from 7/25-7/30. He hit 2 HR in a 15-2 win over the Greenville Drive on 4/30. By the end of the season, Vargas led all Yankees farmhands with six triples. During the season, he saw action at second base for the first time in his career, playing in nine games at the position.

2022: Entering the 2022 season ranked as MLB Pipeline's No. 17 Yankees prospect, Vargas spent his first full season with Single-A Tampa, hitting .203 in 100 games with a .583 OPS, 33 RBI, and 8 HR. He led the Tarpons in stolen bases (27) and runs (59).

2021: Ranked as the Yankees' No. 13 prospect by MLB Pipeline, Vargas spent all of 2021 season with FCL Yankees, playing in 42 games, hitting .273 with a .755 OPS, 3 HR, and 26 RBI. Vargas led the FCL in runs (37) and ranked fourth in stolen bases (17).

2019: Made professional debut for the Dominican Summer League Yankees on 6/1, where he played eight games and hit .289, ahead of a promotion to the Gulf Coast League on 6/24. Played in 40 games for the GCL Yankees-East, hitting .219 with 1 HR, 16 RBI and 14 BB to only 22 K. Vargas went a perfect 13-for-13 on the base paths in the GCL and he led the league with five triples. Vargas was promoted to Rookie-Advanced Pulaski for the 2019 Appalachian League Playoffs, appearing in one game: Game Three of the league's semifinals vs. the Burlington Royals, which was a 17-inning, five-hour, 19-minute game that the Royals won to send them to the league championship.

The Yankees acquired the extra international pool money they needed for Vargas, the 8th-ranked prospect in the class, by sending Caleb Frare to the White Sox, and both Giovanni Gallegos and Chasen Shreve to the Cardinals. Vargas played for Matanzas in Cuba's 15U national league in 2016, batting .296/.395/.449 with 14 walks and eight strikeouts in 116 plate appearances. In 2017, he jumped to the 18U league as a 15-year-old. Vargas was part of the first signing class which allowed Cuban players to be signed by MLB teams without having to defect.
