May 3: RubberDucks 5, Curve 3: Tommy Mace tossed six scoreless innings to pick up his third straight victory. The RubberDucks offense scored four in the sixth and got an insurance run in the ninth on **Travis Bazzana's** homer.

Today's starting pitcher: Austin Peterson makes his sixth start of the season. The right-hander had his last start on Tuesday shortened to just one inning because of rain. Peterson is facing Altoona for the third time this year. He has allowed three hits while striking out five over six scoreless innings. In his career against Curve, Peterson is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA and 15 strikeouts in three starts. He enters Sunday leading in Eastern League in WHIP (0.62) while ranking second in ERA (0.86) and average against (.155).

Akron's April: The Akron RubberDucks finished the month of April with a 15-8 record. The RubberDucks finished the month tied with Erie for first place in the Eastern League's Southwest Division. Akron hit .237/.345/.392 in April with 35 doubles, 15 triples, 16 homers, 122 RBI, 128 runs scored and 34 stolen bases. As the month concludes, the recently promoted to Triple-A, **CJ Kayfus** was top in the Eastern League in batting average, OBP, OPS and triples. **Alex Mooney** finished April on top of the EL in stolen bases while **Jorge Burgos** ranked top 10 in five different categories. On the mound, Akron pitchers went 15-8 with a 3.47 ERA in 23 games. RubberDucks pitchers struck out 186 batters while walking 97 and recorded five saves in 200.0 innings pitched. **Austin Peterson** wrapped up April top 3 in the EL in four categories. The RubberDucks 15-8 record is the team's best in the first month of the season since the 2021 RubberDucks opened the year 16-7 after one month of play.

Triple the fun: The Akron RubberDucks hit 15 triples through the first 23 games of the season. Those 15 triples were second behind the Inland Empire 66ers (16) for the most by any team in MLB or MiLB. The 15 three-base hits marked the most by an Akron team through the first month of the season since 2005 (previous high was 11 in 2008). 11 of Akron's 15 triples this season have come at Canal Park.

Starting dominance: The RubberDucks starting pitching staff has been outstanding to open the 2025 season. RubberDucks starters have a combined 2.63 ERA with 96 strikeouts against 43 walks over 116.1 innings pitched. One of Akron's five man rotation sport an ERA under 1.00 through five turns in the rotation (**Austin Peterson** 0.86). Akron's 2.63 starter ERA is the second best in Double-A and fifth best in MiLB. Akron starters entered this week having tossed the most innings in the Eastern League and the fifth most innings in Double-A.

RubberDucks travel to the Curve: Akron and Altoona will face off for the second of four meetings between the two clubs and first of two meetings at Peoples Natural Gas Field in 2025. Akron took four of six from Altoona at Canal Park in the first meeting. Akron leads the all-time series between the two franchises 292-246. Top prospects in this series include:

Mooney heating up: Alex Mooney's Double-A career got off to a slow start as the infielder was 1-for-21 to start the season. Then on April 13, Mooney went 3-for-4 with a double, triple and three RBI in Akron's win over Altoona. This kicked off a nine-game hitting streak for Mooney, which is second longest streak compiled by a RubberDucks batter this season and fourth longest streak by an Eastern League hitter in 2025. During the streak that ended during the second game of Akron's April 26 doubleheader, Mooney hit .355 (11-31) with three doubles, one triple, six RBI and five stolen bases.

Carver saves the day: Ross Carver picked up his first career save on Sunday afternoon after 3.1 scoreless innings in Akron's 16-7 win over Richmond. The three inning+ save was accurate as after the Saturday doubleheader, the Akron bullpen entered Sunday with only Carver and Zach Jacobs, who had not thrown the day before. Carver did not allow a run in his first seven games of the season (six with Akron and one with Columbus) over 14.2 innings pitched. The right-hander has gone multiple innings in six of his eight outings.

Men of Steal: Tyresse Turner and Alex Mooney are flying around the bases this season. Mooney tied a franchise record for most steals in a game by stealing five bases on April 30 as part of a nine stolen base game for the RubberDucks. The five steals in a game tied **Connor Kokx**, who on Aug. 6, 2023, stole five bases against Somerset. Akron's nine steals on April 30 are the most by an Akron team in a game since 2005. Mooney is second in the Eastern League with 11 steals while Turner, who had two steals on 4/30, is tied third with nine stolen bases. Akron finished April with 34 stolen bases, which is second most by Akron team in the season's first month to the 2006 Aeros (38 steals). Only Altoona, 46 stolen bases, has more steals in the Eastern League. Akron was caught seven times trying to steal in April.

- Made 13 starts for Akron after his promotion going 7-2 with a 2.88 ERA and 72 strikeouts against just 15 walks over 75.0 innings pitched.
- Akron's starter for game one of the Eastern League Division Series (L, 5.2IP, 1ER, 3K).
- Opened the season with High-A Lake County going 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA and 87 strikeouts over 85 innings pitched (14 starts) before being promoted to Akron on June 24. Midwest League All-Star.

2025 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his fifth season with the Guardians organization. The 2024 season will be DiCenzo's second as RubberDucks manager, and fourth as a manager in the Guardians organization. He guided the RubberDucks to an 80-58 record and an Eastern League playoff appearance in 2024.

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#55 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his sixth season with the Guardians organization and second with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#29 Hitting Coach Ian Forster enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Forster will also be a hitting coach for RubberDucks and returns to Akron after serving as the RubberDucks assistant hitting coach in 2023. He was the Arizona Complex Guardians hitting coach in 2024.

A graduate of North Olmsted High School, Forster played four years at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea.

#12 Pitching Coach Kevin Erminio enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Erminio was the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains for the 2023 and 2024 seasons.

Erminio joined the Guardians organization after a collegiate coaching career that included stops as a pitching coach in Oxford at Miami University and 13 seasons at Kennesaw State.

#54 Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his third season in the Guardians organization and second season with the RubberDucks. He will be a pitching coach in 2025 after spending 2024 as Akron's assistant pitching coach. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of Akron, Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#49 Bench Coach Marc Mumper enters his third season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. He will also serve as the Guardians organization's assistant infield coordinator. Prior to coming to Akron, Mumper spent 2024 as the bench coach for Lake County.

A native of Highlands Ranch, CO, Mumper played 157 games from 2016-19 for Grand Canyon University. He then went on to coach at the college level in several different roles from 2019-22 before joining the Guardians organization.

#41 Development Coach Seth Caddell enters his second season as a coach in the Guardians organization and second season with the RubberDucks. Before joining the RubberDucks coaching staff in 2024, Caddell played in the Guardians organization for three seasons as a catcher.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his eighth season in the Guardians organization and second season with the RubberDucks. He also serves as the Guardians organization's assistant coordinator for Dominican Republic Medical Services. Diaz was the Eastern League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2024. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Karina Gonzalez enters her third season in the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Gonzalez spent the 2023 season at the Guardians complex in Goodyear.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Mo Cuevas enters his 10th season with the Guardians organization and third season in Akron. He was the Eastern League Strength Coach of the Year in 2024. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the Guardians rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022.

Baseball Technology Fellow Kade Enders enters his first season in Akron.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** and general manager **Jim Pfander** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
