YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to Chesapeake Baysox, 4-1. Douglas Hodo III hit a two-run homer in the fourth to open a 2-0 Baysox lead. In the fifth, two runs scored on a force out, including one on an error, to extend the Chesapeake lead to 4-0. The Flying Squirrels broke the shutout in the top of the ninth with a two-out, RBI double by **Aeverson Arteaga.** Richmond relievers **Will Bednar, Cameron Cotter** and **Trent Harris** combined for four scoreless innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 8,421 fans per home game, which leads all 120 MiLB clubs.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 2-4 in last week's road trip to Harrisburg, dropping four-of-five after winning the opener. Their 2-8 start is the worst in team history. In 2015, the team opened with a 3-2 record before losing their next 15 consecutive games to start the year 3-17. The 2015 team finished with a 72-68 record.

THE BAYSOX split last week's series against the SeaWolves at home after taking two-of-three at Altoona the previous weekend to begin the season. Bowie's roster includes five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Orioles prospects, including OF Enrique Bradfield Jr. (No. 6), RHP Patrick Reilly (No. 16), RHP Trace Bright (No. 17), RHP Alex Pham (No. 26) and RHP Zach Fruit (No. 30). Five players are ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects, including Bradfield (No. 3), Reilly (No. 10), C Creed Willems (No. 12), Bright (No. 25) and Pham (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Joe Whitman makes home debut. He made his Double-A debut last Wednesday at Harrisburg and allowed one run on four hits over five innings, striking out four with no walks. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. For more on Whitman, see page two.

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander Alex Pham makes his third start of the season. As Chesapeake's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Altoona, he allowed two runs over four innings, striking out five. In his last start on Thursday against the SeaWolves, he surrendered one run over 5.1 innings with nine strikeouts. Pham has made six appearances against the Flying Squirrels in his career, going 0-1 with a 6.04 ERA (17 ER/25.1 IP). On May 24, 2024 at Prince George's Stadium, he allowed a career-high nine runs over four innings in a no-decision, with the Baysox rallying from down 9-4 before the Flying Squirrels scored eight runs in the final three innings to win, 17-10. Pham was selected by the Orioles in the 19th round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of San Francisco. He is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 26 Orioles prospect and No. 29 by MLB.com.

HOWELL AT THE MOON: Carter Howell was named the 2024 Flying Squirrels Player of the Year in his first Double-A season. He spent all of last year in Richmond. For the season, he led the Eastern League in doubles (30) and triples (7). He also led the Flying Squirrels in batting average (.272), on-base percentage (.347), slugging percentage (.391), OPS (.738), hits (121), walks (47), extra-base hits (40), total bases (174), runs (64) and stolen bases (15). Through his first 10 games of 2025, Howell has reached base 19 times

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto hit two homers on Sunday afternoon at Harrisburg, belting a three-run homer in the first and a solo home run in the seventh. It was the first two-homer game of his Double-A career and the second of his professional career. He also had a two-homer game in 2023 with High-A Eugene. The two homers on Sunday moved Bericoto into ninth place on the Flying Squirrels' career home run list with 24. His next homer will tie him with **Frankie Tostado** for eighth with 25.

PLAY THE HITS: The Flying Squirrels have collected 76 hits through their first nine games this season, which is the third-most in the Eastern League. The team is batting .237 (76-for-321), which is third-highest in the league. However, the Richmond offense is batting .165 (14-for-85) with runners in scoring position, which is last in the league.

PINCH MEI: In the second game of Saturday's doubleheader, **Jairo Pomares** hit a single while pinch-hitting in the top of the seventh inning. It was the Flying Squirrels' first pinch hit since 2023. During the 2024 season, Richmond pinch-hitters went 0-for-36 on the year with three walks and 18 strikeouts. The 36 pinch-hit at-bats ranked third in the minors on the season, trailing only Buffalo (10-for-40) and Las Vegas (13-for-38). No MiLB team in the digitized-stats era, which dates back to 2005, has more pinch-hit at-bats without a hit than last year's Richmond team.

FAMILIAR FACES: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster includes 22 players who have previously played for the Flying Squirrels. There are six players who have made their team debuts, including **Aeverson Arteaga, Sabin Ceballos, Manuel Mercedes, Rodolfo Nolasco, Braxton Roxby** and **Joe Whitman**. Roxby, acquired from the Reds in a trade earlier this year, is the only newcomer with previous Double-A experience.

WHERE DID THESE GUYS COME FROM?: There are players from six different counties on the Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster, including the United States (20 players), Venezuela (3), the Dominican Republic (2), Cuba (1), Panama (1) and Puerto Rico (1). Among the 20 American-born players, 11 different states are represented, including North Carolina (3), Florida (3), Ohio (3), California (2), Michigan (2), Pennsylvania (2), Kentucky (1), Minnesota (1), North Dakota (1), Rhode Island (1) and Texas (1). There are 11 players who joined the Giants organization out of the MLB Draft, six were signed as non-drafted free agents, six as international free agents, four who were picked up in trades and one who was claimed in the minor-league phase of the Rule 5 Draft. For 23 players, the Giants were their original affiliated organization and five have played with other major-league organizations.

BOULEVARD TO THE BAY: Last season, 14 former Flying Squirrels players reached the majors for the first time. That was the most in a season in franchise history. In 2014, 11 alumni made their MLB debuts, including Joe Panik, Adam Duvall, Andrew Susac, Matt Duffy, Jackson Williams, Edwin Escobar, Hunter Strickland, Chris Dominguez, Gary Brown, Brett Bochy and Chris Heston. The Flying Squirrels alumni to debut in the majors last season were Erik Miller (2023 Flying Squirrels), Landen Roupp (2022-23), Kai-Wei Teng (2022-23), Nick Avila (2022), Randy Rodriguez (2022-23), Mason Black (2023), Gerson Garabito (2021), Spencer Bivens (2023), Raymond Burgos (2023), Hayden Birdsong (2023-24), Parker Dunshee (2023), Grant McCray (2024), Sandro Fabian (2021) and Trevor McDonald (2024). Christian Koss (2024) made his debut for the Giants earlier this week as the first new former Flying Squirrel in the majors this year. Dating back to 2022, 23-of-the-last-26 Flying Squirrels alumni who have reached the majors have debuted with the San Francisco Giants, with Garabito (Rangers), Fabian (Rangers) and Dunshee (Braves) being the only exceptions. The 2023 season saw 10 former Flying Squirrels players debut in the big leagues, including a team-record five from that season's Richmond roster.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Victor Bericoto is tied for third in homers (2), tied for seventh in total bases (18) and tied for ninth in walks (7). Carter Howell is ninth in OBP (.435) and tied for fourth in walks (8). Jairo Pomares is tied for third in homers (2). Jack Choate is tied for fourth in strikeouts (14). Seth Lonsway is tied for fourth in innings pitched (10.0).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 10), Diego Velasquez (No. 13), Sabin Ceballos (No. 16), Trent Harris (No. 26), Aeverson Arteaga (No. 27) and Jack Choate (No. 28). There are also six players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1960: The Richmond Virginians beat the Baltimore Orioles, 6-2, in an exhibition at Parker Field. Virginians pitchers Jim Bronstad and Gary Blaylock combined to hold the Orioles to seven hits. Richmond native Granny Hamner opened the scoring for the Vees in the first inning with a two-run homer, part of a three-RBI game. Leroy Thomas added a solo homer in the seventh. Richmond scored five runs over three innings against Baltimore rookie starter Chuck Estrada, who went on to be an All-Star that year and tied for the American League lead with 18 wins. Brooks Robinson, who would make his first All-Star team that year, went 1-for-4. The two teams followed the game with an unscheduled, informal four-inning game, which Richmond won, 2-1. 1976: The Richmond Braves opened the season with a 17-1 win over the Bobby Cox-led Syracuse Chiefs at Parker Field in manager Jack McKeon's first game with the Club. Chico Ruiz had three hits and drove in three. 1988: The Richmond Braves split a doubleheader with the Columbus Clippers on the road. John Smoltz started the second game, a 7-2 win, and worked a complete game, allowing two runs over six innings, with one coming on a solo homer by Jay Buhner. Lonnie Smith and Dave Griffin homered for Richmond in the win. 2001: The Richmond Braves beat the Indianapolis Indians, 4-3, at The Diamond. R-Braves starter Matt McClendon took a perfect game bid into the seventh inning before the Indians opened a 3-1 lead in the seventh. After runs in the seventh and eighth to tie the game, Pedro Swann hit a walk-off single to score Mark DeRosa in the bottom of the ninth. 2022: The Flying Squirrels rallied from an early four-run deficit to beat the Altoona Curve, 8-4, at The Diamond. Sean Roby homered twice, giving him five homers over his last three games played against the Curve in the series. He was named Eastern League Player of the Week following the series.
